WORK BEGON ON REPORT. COULD BE THE BIG FIRE

Mr. Garrow Will Compile Record—Total Loss Placed Now at \$10,500,000.

Seven minor claims were reported to the general adjustment committee yesterday, swelling the total value to \$7,242,271.33, with insurance thereon of \$5,377,066.91.

Secretary Garrow stated that the figures published in some papers purporting to represent the W. R. Brock loss and insurance are not official.

Mr. Garrow estimates the entire insurance loss as about eight and one-half millions. An approximate placing of the total loss on the above basis would be about \$10,500,000.

Mr. Garrow has just begun work on an elaborate report, which deals in a general way with all matters pertaining to the origin, spread, results, etc., of the conflagration.

The only element of figures that will enter into the report will be from a location that is under consideration.
