

Declaration of Council.

- 1.—That it is neither right nor politic for the Government to afford legal protection and sanction to any traffic or system that tends to increase crime, to waste the resources of the Province, to corrupt the social habits, and to destroy the health and lives of the people.
- 2.—That the traffic in intoxicating drinks, as common beverages, is inimical to the true interests of individuals, and destructive to the order and welfare of society, and ought, therefore, to be prohibited.
- 3.—That the history and results of all past legislation in regard to the liquor traffic, abundantly prove that it is impossible, satisfactorily, to limit or regulate a system so essentially mischievous in its tendencies.
- 4.—That no consideration of private gain or public revenue can justify the upholding of a system so utterly wrong in principle, suicidal in policy, and disastrous in results, as the traffic in intoxicating liquors.
- 5.—That the legislative prohibition of the liquor traffic is perfectly compatible with rational liberty, and with all the claims of justice and legitimate commerce.
- 6.—That the legislative prohibition of the liquor traffic would be highly conducive to the development of a progressive civilization.
- 7.—That, rising above class, sectarian, or party considerations, all good citizens should combine to procure an enactment prohibiting the sale of intoxicating beverages as affording most efficient aid in removing the appalling evil of intemperance.

CONSTITUTION.

1st.—The designation of this Association shall be:—"The United Canadian Alliance for the Total Suppression of the Liquor Traffic," the object of which shall be to educate and direct public opinion on the evils resulting from the manufacture and sale of intoxicating drinks, and by all legitimate means labor to procure the immediate suppression of that demoralizing traffic.

2nd.—Each subscriber of Twenty-five cents annually shall be a member and shall receive a card of Membership.

3rd.—Each Subscriber of Ten Dollars or more at any one time shall be a Life Member.

4th.—Branch Societies may be formed in any part of the Province, except the City of Montreal,) and affiliated on the payment of five Dollars annually.

5th.—This Association shall be governed by a Council to consist of fifteen Members, with Representative from each Branch Society. The Council to be elected at the Annual Meeting by ballot from Subscribers and Life Members. The Council shall elect a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretaries and Treasurer, who shall be ex-officio members of the Council. But no member of the said Council shall be allowed either to speak or vote on any question in which he is personally interested.

6th.—A Managing Committee elected by the Council shall meet monthly to conduct the ordinary business of the Alliance, and to carry out the Resolutions of the Council—five members to form a quorum.

7th.—The Council shall meet quarterly in Montreal—seven members to form a quorum.

8th.—The Annual Meeting of the Alliance shall be held either in the month of January or February in each year in Montreal.

9th.—The Managing Committee shall frame a Code of By-Laws in harmony with the Constitution; for the government of the Alliance, to be submitted to the Council for approval. Such By-Laws as may be approved or amended by the Council to form part of the Constitution.

10th.—In the carrying out of the Constitution and By-Laws, the action of the Council shall be final and conclusive.

11th.—The recording Secretary shall call special Meetings of the Alliance on the written requisition of not less than twenty five Members of the Alliance, stating the object of the meeting, or by a resolution of the Managing Committee.

12th.—No amendment to this Constitution shall be made, except at an Annual Meeting of the Alliance, written notice of such intention to amend, stating distinctly the proposition to be submitted, to be given to the Secretary at least three months before the said meeting, and notice of the said proposition to amend shall be published at least one month before the Annual Meeting, in such way as the Managing Committee shall determine.

THE FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
UNITED CANADIAN ALLIANCE.

The Managing Committee take pleasure in presenting to the Subscribers, Members, and Friends of the "United Canadian Alliance," their Fifth Annual Report.

At the end of the Report will be found Lists of Subscriptions, Collections, and Branches Organized, with the names of the Officers appointed, together with a "Statement of Receipts and Disbursements for the year 1867," all of which are respectfully submitted.

The Committee deeply regret that in some instances "The Temperance Act of 1864" has been repealed, while they rejoice to find that in several Townships the Law is strictly enforced.

The causes of failure are so numerous, that we cannot find space in our Report to enumerate them all, but we think, had our suggestion been acted upon, and Public Prosecutors appointed to enforce the Law, certain victory would have been the result.

It is evident that many of those who stand identified with our movement do not wish to make themselves conspicuous by informing upon those who violate the Law, and it is also certain that some of those who are high in power sympathize with those who traffic in Strong Drink. In fact, such is the Liquor Influence, that from the Judge on the Bench down to the lowest Officer of the Crown, men are more or less interested in the traffic, hence the necessity of Public Prosecutors to carry out the Law. We intend to agitate this matter until the Government take this step.

Prohibition, the grand aim of the Alliance, is becoming more popular. The results here as in England and the United States are beneficial. Wherever drink is suppressed crime diminishes, and the people become elevated, socially, morally, religiously and politically. So true is this, that the Publicans of Birmingham, England, in a

petition presented to the British House of Parliament stated, "That vice and crime are just in proportion to the number of Public Houses, and the facilities afforded for obtaining alcoholic stimulants."

The benefits of Prohibition are illustrated in the following letter from our earnest Agent, Mr. Thomas McMurray :—

" I have just visited the teetotal village of Bridgewater, the property of the Hon. B. Flint, one of the Vice-Presidents of our Society, where I have been confirmed in my views as regards Prohibition. This village has been in existence for about seven years. It contains 400 inhabitants,—not a rowdy amongst the number. No liquor has been sold here since the place was first started. It can boast of a white marble Wesleyan Church. A hotel—the largest and most elegantly furnished to be found between Toronto and Kingston. Here you will find in full operation a saw-mill, grist-mill, oatmeal-mill, pearl-barley-mill, axe factory, hammer factory, edge tool factory, chair factory, foundry, tannery, six gold mines, crushing machine, store, &c., all without the aid of whiskey. And what of the people? Why, they are, in my humble opinion, the most happy, contented, prosperous and pious that I have met with on this side the Atlantic. Let those who have doubts regarding Prohibition visit Bridgewater, I can promise them a kind reception from my warm friend Dr. Higginbotham, or Squire Harrison, happy Bridgewater, would to God that every village, town and city in Canada were like thee, free from the curse of a Legalized Liquor Traffic.

Talk about 'Inebriate Asylums,' here is one; when I last lectured in Belleville, Dr. Rufus Holden, who presided at my meeting stated in his opening address, that a short time since a first class mechanic asked him if he thought he could find employment at Bridgewater, that he had been trying to reform his life, but the temptations were so numerous about Belleville that it was impossible and that unless he was removed from those temptations he was a ruined man.

I shall henceforth designate the Hon. B. Flint, the distinguished Canadian Philanthropist, and one of the warmest friends of the Temperance cause, to be found upon the continent of America."

During the past year "The Licensed Victuallers Association," which in all propriety of language should be designated, the Licensed grog-

sellers Association, have been making strenuous exertions to acquire additional power for accomplishing mischief, misery and ruin, but thanks to an enlightened Legislature, and educated public sentiment, have been signally defeated ; additional efforts will no doubt be put forth to accomplish their purpose ; their movements must be watched and their object again frustrated. There is now a sound public prohibition sentiment, and we have men enough in both Houses of Parliament in all the Provinces, if the people are but faithful and remind them of their duty to put it beyond the power of the " Victuallers" to consolidate the drink traffic.

We have much to encourage us in the prosecution of our work. Since the passage of the Dunkin Temperance Act it has been adopted by sixty-two municipalities in Ontario, and in Quebec by twenty-eight. It has also been adopted by three entire counties in Quebec and by one in Ontario. Some sanguine but faint-hearted friends tell us this is but little fruit from such an amount of efforts as has been put forth, but we differ from such friends ; when we consider what we have to contend against in this work of the Temperance reformation we think great results has been brought about, and such results as should encourage us to go forward and stimulate us to persist willingly in the work we have on hand.

Ever since the withdrawal of our respected Secretary, W. R. Pope, Esq., to another field of labor, whose place has not been filled up, no effort has been put forth in this city or suburbs, either by way of meetings or taking up subscriptions. It is recommended that an effort be made to revive the interest in the important work of the Society. It is true, though nothing has been done in this city or neighbourhood, yet the work of the Alliance has been energetically pushed forward by our indefatigable agent Mr. McMurray throughout the country and though little noise has been made, yet our work has been carried on with unabated vigour and much success ; as will be seen from the work done, and also from its having been fully self-sustaining. There is still a small debt due, but it is hoped this will be wiped off in course of the present year.

Mr. John Moffat, of Komoka, one of our first agents, has been unable from ill health to do any work for the Alliance during the past year ; it is matter of thankfulness that our agent, Mr. Thomas McMurray, has been constantly employed during the year; increased interest in the cause

is manifested, and crowded audiences greet this zealous advocate. The friends of Temperance give him a kind reception everywhere, while the opponents unable to meet his array of facts, retort by throwing stones and pelting him with eggs. During the year he has travelled near 5,000 miles, delivered 199 Lectures, registered 2298 members and formed 48 branches. We are glad to add, that his subscription list is considerably in advance of former years. May his life be long spared!

SUGGESTIONS.

If we may be permitted to throw out a suggestion or two, we would say, wherever it is impossible to suppress the traffic, we should increase the price of Tavern and Shop Licenses with the view of lessening their number, remembering the maxim, "the fewer taverns, the less crime." Let us seek also to circulate Temperance literature, and spread broadcast Temperance tracts and statistics.

We would call your attention to a new work just published, "The Temperance Bible Commentary," exhibiting at one view, version, criticism and exposition, with preliminary dissertation. Appendices and Index by Rev. Dawson Burns and Dr. F. R. Lees: price 5s sterling. Procure a copy at once.

In conclusion, while we are grateful for the liberality manifested towards the Alliance in the past, and take this opportunity of sincerely thanking our subscribers for that aid which has enabled us to continue our labours till the present, we earnestly solicit increased help as the necessities of the case demand it. The liquor sellers are now an organized body, and we require funds to carry on successfully our noble enterprise. We have a mighty advantage over our antagonists, as we can employ the platform, the pulpit, and the press to advance the interests of our movement. The liquor sellers cannot do this. Friend let us have the means.



MEETING OF COUNCIL.

July 30, 1868.

The Council of the United Canadian Alliance met in their room, Great St. James Street, when were present, Dr. Carpenter, G. Martin, J. S. Hall, J. Findlay, J. J. Higgins, and J. C. Becket.

Apologies were received from two other members who were not able to attend.

Mr. J. S. Hall, was appointed chairman and called upon Dr. Carpenter to open the meeting with prayer.

The Secretary made a verbal statement of the object of the meeting, informing those present what had been done throughout the interval since last meeting of council, by and with the advice of members of the Managing Committee, which was cordially approved and fully sustained.

The Secretary then presented the report of the Agent for 1867, embracing number of members enrolled, branches formed, and contributions received, which he had embodied in a report of the Managing Committee for the same period.

The Treasurer explained that he did not at this time present any Financial Statement, as he was not quite sure what period of time it should embrace; but recommended that J. S. Hall, G. Martin, and J. Findlay, be a Committee to look into the Finances, and render what assistance they could in the publication of the report, which was approved, and the above named were accordingly appointed, and 1250 of the report ordered to be printed.

The Council deem it due to our Agent, Thomas McMurray, to unite in a cordial vote of thanks, for his unwearied and indefatigable labors in the past, and in commanding him to the fostering and protecting care of his Divine Master, whose work he is so successfully carrying forward. Therefore be it resolved.—“That the report of our highly esteemed Agent Mr. McMurray, is in the highest degree satisfactory to this Council, and desiring to express to that gentleman our decided appreciation of his successful labors, the thanks of this Council are due and hereby tendered, for the ability he has constantly shewn as Agent of the Alliance, and as an expounder and advocate of the great cause of Temperance.”
