She had six torpedo tubes and five inches of nickel steel armor over her gun positions. The speed of the Bogatyr was estimated to be over twenty-three knots and

her crew numbered 580 men.]

it is said on good authority that the Japanese forces have captured Kai Chou, driving the Russians back to Tai-Chia in the direction of New Chwang, and preventing the advance of the Russian troops at New Chwang in the direction of Kai Chou. 
