













THISTLE CURLING CLUB MADE MERRY LAST NIGHT IN HONOR OF THEIR VICTORIOUS RINKS

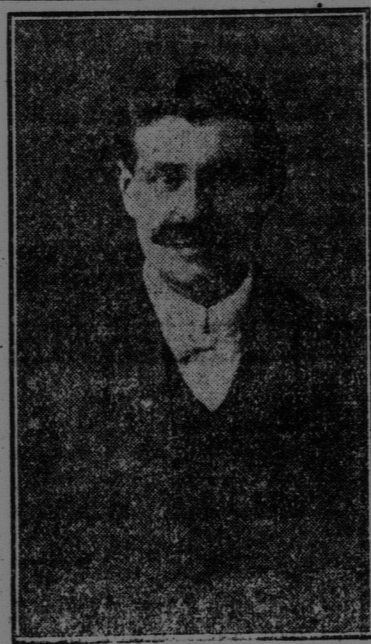
