Among the most important is one from Von Arnim stating that Germany should not discourage the hopes of the Bouspartists, as they were the only party which did not proclaim the necessity for a war of revenge. Bismarck replies that there is no occasion to encourage any action while Thiers faithfully fulfilled Treaty stipulations. Another despatch from Bismarck informs Von Arnim that he is mistaken if he thinks Germany desires Italy and France to quarrel, as in that event Germany would be dragged in to support Italy.
