MEETINGS.

The Regular Meetings of the Society are held quarterly, on the 25th March,

for Lady Day; 24th June, or Midsummer Day; 29th September, or Michaelmas Day; and the 26th December.

Annual Election of Officers and Committees takes place on 5th January.

The Members meet also on 23rd April-St. George's Day.

The Meetings of the Committee of Management are held on the second Monday in every month.

The Meetings of the Sub-Committee of Charity are held weekly.

RELIEF.

Application for Relief should be made on a Printed Form, stating the particulars of the case, &c., signed by any two members of the Society as a recommendation, and handed to the Sub-Committee of Charity.

Members may also bring up any case of distress within their knowledge at any of the above meetings.

The Printed Forms above mentioned may be had on application to any of the officers.

There are six beds, with the necessary bedding, all the property of the Society, in the Finlay Asylum, for the use of persons who may be sent to that Institution by the Society.

SIXTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Committee of Management of St. George's Society of Quebec, FOR THE YEAR 1896.

The Committee of Management have the honor to submit. the following report of their proceedings during the past year, being the sixty-first since the foundation of the Society.

The anniversary of St. George's Day was, as usual, celebrated by Divine Service in the Cathedral, at which we had the pleasure of listening to an eloquent and patriotic sermon preached by the Revd. G. Osborne Troop, of St. Martin's Church, Montreal, and to whom we are indebted for his kindness in accepting the invitation to preach for us on that occasion,

The thanks of the Society are due to Mr. E. A. Bishop, organist, and members of his choir, and other ladies and gentlemen who so kindly contributed to the success of the musical part of the service.

The report of the Sub-Committee of Charity shows the Society has relieved 185 cases of distress during the year at an expenditure of \$459.20. (See report of Sub-Committee of Charity.) The thanks of the Society are again tendered to Mr. Budden for administering the same with his usual, good judgment. As compared with previous years, those figures show a decided increase.

The financial affaires of the Society are in a good, sound condition—thanks to the vigilance of our valued and esteemed Treasurer, Mr. F. Billingsley.

We regret to record the death, during the year, of six members; Mr. A. J. Maxham, a past President and an active member of the Committee of Management; the Society attended his

funeral. Also, Messrs. John Burstall, Henry Fry, Samuel Bennett, W. G. P. Mountain, life members, and George Bacon, an ordinary member.

The Committee are pleased to record an increase in our membership. Twelve new members are enrolled in our Society since last report, and we would recommend to our successors that continued efforts should be made to increase our membership.

The resident membership now stands at 129, of which 56 are life members, as follows:

He was nineteen years Rector of Quebec, and was consecrated Bishop of Montreal 14th Febuary, 1836, and of Quebec in 1850. He was a diligent visitor among his flock, and in the dreadful visitations of cholera in 1832 and 1834 he literally lived night and day among the dying and the dead, while in 1847, when the province was visited with the plague of typhus fever, and the poor immigrants were dying by thousands, at the Quarantine Station, the Bishop took his turn at Grosse Isle regularly with the rest of the clergy; and again when the cholera visited Quebec in 1849 and 1854 he was diligent in visiting the hospitals. During many years and up to the time of his death, Bishop Mountain, besides his life membership, contributed regularly to the Society a donation equal to four annual subscriptions, and at all times took a great interest in its proceedings.




