ANOTHER LIBERAL-CONSERVATIVE VICTORY.

TORONTO, Aug. 24.—Despite the desperate efforts of the Opposition to swamp East Durham, that constituency to-day elected Liberal Conservative, by about four hundred majority over Free-son, the Opposition candidate.

Port Hope turned a Liberal majority of 87 in the 1885 election to a Liberal-Conservative majority of 23.

For weeks past the riding literally swarmed with Opposition canvassers who held forth at every school house and corner grocery. No less than ten members of the Opposition were in the field.

Nearly one fourth of the Opposition members of the Commons took part in the contest, only to meet with another crushing defeat.—Sun.

SMALLPOX IN MONTREAL.

MONTREAL, Aug. 21.—Thirty-five new cases of smallpox were reported to-day. Hundreds of people are flocking to the public stations to be vaccinated.

Five thousand more vaccinations are expected from Boston in the morning. Difficultly is being experienced in procuring nurses.

The Sisters of St. Margaret (protestant), and the Catholic Sisters have volunteered. City passenger railway stocks fell 14 per cent. yesterday, and 9 per cent. more to-day.

The neighboring municipalities of St. Jean Baptiste and St. Henri are badly afflicted. The drainage in both is shocking.

RIEL.

"No sympathy should be wasted on Riel, who has been instrumental in stirring up insurrections in the Canadian North West, which have resulted in the death of innocent people."

He Riel really was an American citizen he should have kept away from Canada and not have interested himself in its affairs. And it might have added that if he was in earnest he should not have asked \$35,000, or any sum, as the price of his leaving the country.

CAIRO.

CAIRO, Aug. 22.—The Madir of Dongola has returned. He thinks that the Madir's movement is killed in the Sudan, and that the next outbreak will be at Algeria.

Father Bonomi and Lupton Bey are positive that Oliver Pasha died of fever at Omdurman. They are of opinion that another of the Madir's prisoners, Mardali by name, escaped by way of Abyssinia, and they think it probable that he is identical with the man who was recently arrested at Cochinchina.

CAIRO, Aug. 23.—Information has been received of a great massacre at Berber. The populace are starving and have seized the city treasury.

A FAMILY ALMOST EXTERMINATED.

NEW ORLEANS, La., Aug. 17.—A terrible accident is reported from Little Calumet, Terre Bonne parish. A few days ago, while Emile Lorette was engaged in moulding bullets for his gun preparatory to joining a number of his friends in target shooting, he loaded his rifle with his powder horn for him.

The task was but half completed when a gust of wind suddenly blowing through the open door sent a spark straight at the powder, which ignited and a terrible explosion followed.

ALIVE IN A COFFIN.

DETROIT, Mich., Aug. 21.—Tuesday morning the infant child of Charles Sullivan of this city apparently died, and was put in a coffin for burial.

Fifteen hours after the supposed death, and while the family and friends were gathered about the casket, the baby began to cry, frightening every one from the house.

The father retained his senses and took the child from the coffin, and it has since been in better health than for some time.

ENGLAND'S CROPS.

LONDON, Aug. 24.—The Mark Lane Express, in its review of the grain trade, says forty-two per cent. of returns received represent the average of 1885 to be an average; fifty-six per cent. of beans returns and eighty-one per cent. of peas returns show these crops to be under the average. There will be an average crop of wheat.

Wheat growers are of opinion that the crop of 1884 was better than that of 1885 will be. The trade in foreign wheat is almost nothing. The huge visible supply in America is depressing trade here.

NEW YORK, Aug. 21.—The first of a series of trial races between the centre-board sloop "Puritan" and "Priscilla," to decide which will be the defender of the America cup in the September races with Sir Richard Sutton's cutter "Genesta," was sailed to-day, resulting in a flattering victory for the "Puritan."

No test race was ever sailed under more favorable conditions to the competitors. The course was 20 miles dead to windward measured by log due south from the South Lightship and return. A stiff breeze that compelled the contestants to home topmasts but which blew steady from start to finish, favoring none, made the contest extremely satisfactory, bringing out all the good points in the boats while sailing under perfectly equitable conditions.

NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—The yacht "Puritan" was beaten in the second of the series of races to decide who shall contest with the "Genesta" for the America cup. The New York sloop, "Priscilla" came in first with five minutes lead.

Some people's minds have been very much exercised over the appointment of the Hon. W. M. Kelly, M. L. C., to a position in the secret service branch of the Dominion Customs, and for the reason that Mr. Kelly is at present on duty at Grand Maran, have jumped at the conclusion that he is to be one of the permanent staff of the American consular office at that port.

The papers are estimating the cost of Gen. Grant's funeral. Undertaker Merrick's bill was \$10,655, the four physicians got \$1,800 each, and the temporary tomb cost \$7,000. Besides this must be reckoned for the work of making and putting in decorations, \$110,000; paid for seeing the procession, \$1,068,700; and estimated cost of monument, \$600,000; presenting a grand total of \$2,214,355.

LONDON, Aug. 23.—A terrible collision occurred this evening on the Metropolitan District Underground Railroad at East Court. The signals had broken and five coaches were killed and a stoker and five others were badly injured that they cannot recover. There was a horrible scene when the collision occurred, as the railroad at that point is underground.
