This was followed by other circulars from the Association to the same effect. A great many replies were eceived and all the organizations appealed to strongly favored the project, in nearly every case by unanimous resolutions. As it is important that these resolutions should be placed before the public in convenient form, the Art Historical Association decided to print the original circular letter with the various replies received up to date. The list is not complete as further resolutions are being adopted and sent to the Association almost daily.

RETAIN THE COURT HOUSE SQUARE.

ART, HISTORICAL AND SCIENTIFIC ASSOCIATION.

Vancouver, B. C., July 20, 1908.

Dear Sir:-

For some time past the Art, Historical and Scientific Association has advocated the crection of a memorial building in honor of the two great discoverers, Captain James Cook and Captain Vancouver, the building to be used as a Museum and Art Gallery. As soon as the new Court House, now in course of erection, is completed, the old Court House building will become vacant. It is felt by a great many citizens that an opportunity is now presented to secure the old Court House square and building for the city, rather than have it sold for business property. Owing to its central position, the building is peculiarly adapted for a museum and picture gallery. It has been suggested that a publicity burean could be housed in the building, while at the same time it could be used for public meetings, and as headquarters for all societies working in the city's interest.

The great importance of securing the old City Hall square, a beautiful piece of park-like verdure, for a breathing space in the very centre c? the city, is also fully realized.

At a recent meeting of the Vancouver City Council, the Provincial Government was unanimously memoralized by resolution "to convey to the Corporation of the City of Vancouver the land and building at the corner of Hastings and Cambie Streets, used as a Court House."

On the 25th of June, the Art, Historical and Scientific Association nuanimously resolved as follows:—"That the Province be respectfully requested to convey to the City of Vancouver for Art, Historical, Scientific, Museum and other public purposes, the old Court House and grounds, situate on Hastings Street, and that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Premier and members of the Legislature; that a copy of the above resolution, along with a resolution passed by the City Council, be printed and circulated among the different associations of the City."

The many arguments of a practical nature which can be advanced in favor of taking such a step in the interests of the city are too obvious to require discussion. The Directors of the Art, Historical and Scientific Association feel that no apology is necessary for bringing this important matter to the attention of your society, and heg to suggest the advisability of your society passing a resolution supporting the project. They will be very glad also to forward your resolution to the proper authorities should you see fit to entrust it to them for that purpose.


