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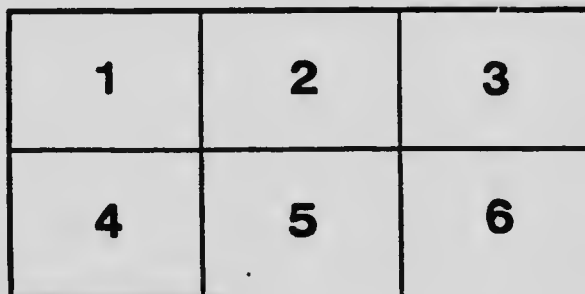
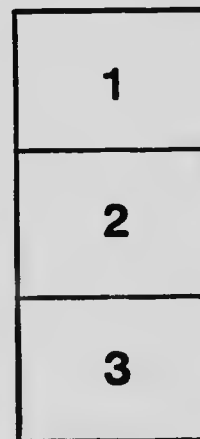

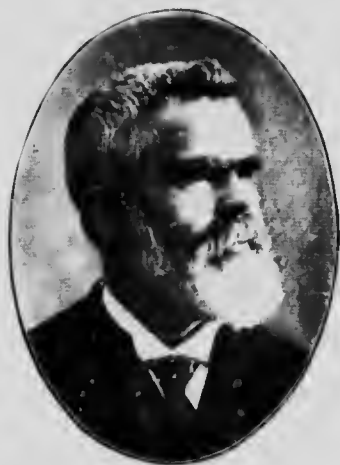

CHALMERS CHURCH.

Rev. H. M. PAULIN, B.A., - Minister

CHALMERS Church! At the sound of this name what varying memories fill the minds, what emotions stir the breasts, of those who have worshipped within its plain, built walls! As an offshoot of Knox, the congregation of Chalmers was organized and its church built in 1852 for the purpose of securing services in the Gaelic language—a tongue dear to the hearts of its Highland-Scotch people.

The healthy growth of the congregation was assured from the first, and it so prospered in all departments of Christian work that a considerable addition to the church building had, later on, during the pastorate of Rev. Dr. W. A. McKay, to be made to accommodate its crowds of eager worshippers.

The first minister in charge was Rev. Duncan McDiarmid whose pastorate extended to 1871. Associated with him in the work as elders at the beginning of his ministry, were Messrs. George Gunn, Hector McKay, Donald McPherson and Robert McDonald. The three latter were met on January 25th 1853 in the basement of Knox Church by a committee from the Presbytery of London consisting of Rev. Messrs. Donald McKenzie, W. S. Ball and D. McDiarmid, who, "after a long examination and conversation with them declared them fit and proper persons to be entrusted with the office of the eldership."

The first Gaelic precentor in the services of praise was George Gunn and the first precentor for the English services was John Gauld.

Rev. John McTavish, D.D. of Woodville, well remembered for the persistency with which he, for a time, held out against the Presbyterian Church Union of 1875, began his ministry to Chalmers congregation early in 1872. He was a strong, sturdy preacher of marked personality and his pastorate was a singularly successful one. At the close of the year 1877, he accepted a call to Inverness, Scotland.

Early in 1878, the late Rev. W. A. McKay, D.D., was called to the pastorate and continued to occupy the position until his death on November 28th, 1905. The outstanding feature of a striking personality, was his fearless advocacy of the cause of temperance. He was known from the Atlantic to the Pacific as the champion of the prohibition of the traffic in intoxicating liquors, and was honored with the presidency of the Dominion Alliance. Richly endowed with rare attainments of mind and heart, an impressive preacher and a persuasive exhorter, he wielded an ever widening power for good.

Rev. Henry Dickie, D.D., now pastor of First Presbyterian Church, Chatham, served the congregation as minister for three and a half years, with marked ability until July 1900. The splendid gifts and graces which he brought to bear upon his ministry, were much appreciated.

On October 12th, 1900, Rev. H. M. Paulin, B.A., then in charge of St. James' Square Presbyterian Church, Toronto, was ordained and inducted into the pastorate of Chalmers Church. The congregation was very fortunate in securing the services of so able a preacher, his pastorate proving singularly happy, desirable and prosperous. The membership is now about 125. Associated with him as elders are, Messrs. Dr. M. Brownlee, J. G. Archibald, John E. Weir, Alex. McGaw, Thos. Amos, James Fleming, A. J. McKay, Geo. Hart, E. Barker, James Weir, Hugh McDonald, John D. Karn, Wm. Rankin, Session-Treas., and Joseph Richardson Session-Clerk.

WOODSTOCK

WOODSTOCK, the prettiest and healthiest residential city in Canada, has a population of about 10,500, and is situated in the highest altitude of Ontario, half way between Detroit and Niagara Falls on the main lines of both the Grand Trunk and Canadian Pacific Railways; also on the line of the Grand Trunk running from Lake Erie to Lake Huron and Georgian Bay. It is also the terminus of the branch of the Canadian Pacific Railway connecting Woodstock with the Wabash and Michigan Central Railways. It is also the eastern terminus of an electric line of railway running between Woodstock and Ingersoll, a distance of some ten miles.

It is the geographical centre and County seat of Oxford County, the banner County of Ontario, and is surrounded by a most fertile district, devoted to general farming and dairying.

The earliest beginning of this pretty and prosperous city dates back some eighty or eighty-five years, to the time, when several retired British military and naval officers took up their grants of land in the vicinity. Among these were such men of prominence as Rear-Admiral Vansittart, Captain Drew, Thomas Cottle, George Alexander and Colonel Light, whose memory is still preserved in the names of the streets of the city of Woodstock. Among these early pioneers the English sentiment was very strong, and found expression in the names they gave to municipal divisions and natural features: Woodstock, Blenheim, Blomford, Oxford, Eastwood, the river Thames, etc. Even in those early days Woodstock was quite a lively settlement, and presented a very picturesque appearance when, on Sundays or other occasions, these English gentlemen drove into town in their carriages with liveried footmen, giving to the place quite an English outlook.

About the same time, or perhaps a little later, the townships of East and West Zorra and the village of Embro were settled by evicted crofters from Sutherlandshire, Scotland, whose thrift and sturdy independence gave a very pronounced individuality to the whole district.

The first village council of Woodstock was elected in 1851. In 1853 the present town hall was built, and was considered quite an imposing structure. In 1857, Woodstock was incorporated as a town, and in 1901 an act was passed incorporating it into a city.

Woodstock is a city of homes, which are in most cases owned by the occupants, who take pride in keeping their surroundings trim and tidy. The city is noted for its beautiful maple shade trees. Most of the streets are lined on both sides with a row of these shade trees; and Vansittart avenue, a fine street 132 feet wide, has a double row. The effect in summer is extremely beautiful, as well as cool and refreshing. The roads of the city are excellent, and most of the sidewalks are built of cement. The people of Woodstock are particularly proud of

the purity of their water, which is obtained from springs situated on a farm owned by the city about three miles out, and which is brought into the city by the force of gravity. The streets and most of the houses are lighted by electricity, obtained from the Hydro-Electric power at Niagara Falls. Many of the manufacturers use this electricity for power. For domestic purposes natural gas is largely used.

The educational facilities of Woodstock are unexcelled, and the educational buildings are of fine architectural design, well lighted and well ventilated and would be a credit to any city of its size. The Collegiate Institute is housed in a handsome and imposing building and ranks among the largest and best in Ontario. The Baptist College, a preparatory school for McMaster University, is also located here, with its splendid buildings and magnificent campus. The Public schools consist of a Central School and four Ward schools, and are of fine architectural design and manned with an excellent corps of teachers. There is also an excellent Roman Catholic separate school. It would be hard to find in any other small city a more efficiently managed school system.

In the churches the following denominations are represented: The Anglican, with two handsome churches; the Presbyterians with two; the Methodists with three; the Baptists with two; and the Congregational, the Roman Catholic, the British Methodist Episcopal and the Salvation Army, with one each.

In addition to its prominence as a residential and educational centre, Woodstock is noted for its manufacture. Among these are the Canada Furniture Company's largest factory and head office, the Kearn-Morris Organ and Piano factories, the Bain Wagon Company, the Warren Organ Company, the Thomas Organ Company, the Woodstock Wagon Works, the James Stewart Stove Works, the Crown Lumber Company, the Oxford Knitting Company, the Harvey Knitting Company, Richard's Pure Soap Company, and many others.

Woodstock has many fine public buildings. The Post Office and the Court House are handsome brown stone structures. The Market Building, the Armouries, and the Y. M. C. A. are of red brick. The Public Library is a fine building of Roman stone and red brick, handsomely designed and well equipped. The General Hospital is an excellently managed institution and the House for its nurses is one of the finest in Ontario. The Provincial Government has established a Hospital for Epileptics, consisting of five large buildings, on a rising ground on the outskirts of the city.

But, above all these advantages Woodstock is the home of a happy, contented and prosperous people, who live together in peace and amity, with little knowledge of extreme poverty or of strikes and other social convulsions that set man against his brother man.

WOODSTOCK COLLEGE

WOODSTOCK College, under the name of the Canadian Literary Institute, began its career in 1857. Dr. R. A. Fyfe, who had been chiefly instrumental in the organization of the Institute, became its first Principal and continued to hold this position until his death in 1878. In 1881 the Theological Department was removed to Toronto, where it became Toronto Baptist College, and the name of the school was in 1883, by amendment of the charter changed to Woodstock College. In 1887 Toronto Baptist College and Woodstock College were by an Act of the Ontario Legislature united under the corporate name of McMaster University and Woodstock College became an academic department of it. The new department of the ladies' department of the College to which was organized as Moulton College, left Woodstock as a school for young men alone.

In the earlier years of the College when attendance at the University was not compulsory, the curriculum covered much of the course in Arts, but, when it became unnecessary to pursue the higher work, its course was limited and at present covers the work necessary for teachers' certificates, and for matriculation into Universities, Schools of Science, etc.

The College was the first school in Canada to champion higher education for women, and was the first to send a lady to try the University examinations. It was also the first to introduce a course in Manual Training, a line of work which has since become so popular.

During the past fifty-seven years thousands of students have received instruction within the walls of the College. As a Christian school of learning it has made an important contribution to Canadian national life.

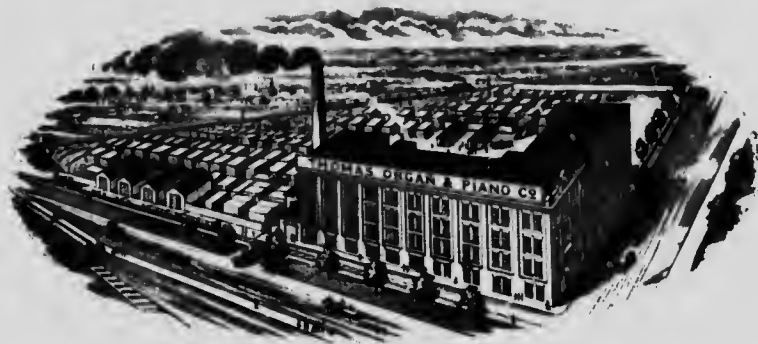

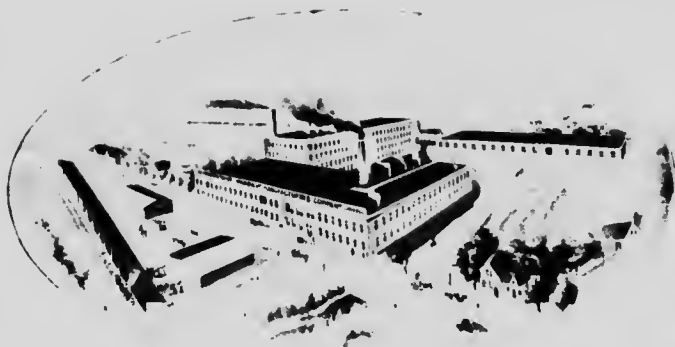
