SANTIAGO GIVING IN. Combined Attack of Land and Sea An Energetic Protest Against Giving Forces Too Strong to Resist.

Siboney, July 11, 7 p.m., via Kingston, Jamaica.—A concerted move has been made by the United States army and navy against. Santiago during the past 24 hours, which the American officers here believe will result in the almost immediate fall of the city. The fleet flying of Aguadores, three miles east of Morro Castle, commenced the bombardment of Santiago on Sunday afternoon and continued it this morning. Notwithstanding that the American ships had to fire at an extreme elevation and although the range was nearly five miles, the aim was so accurate that many of the shells fell into the city and set fire to it in several places. One shell struck St. Michael's church in which was a quantity of powder and ammunition, and blew it to pieces. During the bombardment from the sea the army extended its lines and drew in closer to the city, so that at noon to-day every road and trail leading into the city was guarded and the escape of the Spanisk soldiers seemed impossible. The only way they can get from the city is to ferry across the bay to the western side of the harbor, and even then they could not get into the interior without encountering American troops. During the time the warships were bombarding Santiago this morning the batteries of artillery on the hill facing the city shelled the Spanish entrenchments and received but a light response. The American sharpshooters also sent in a deadly fire azd the Spaniards fell back to their last entrenchments offering but little resistance. The Americans suffered no loss.
