Dickens' Stomach. Mr. Howard Paul was entertained at dinner last week by the Clover club of Philadelphia, and in an after-dinner speech related the following: Englishmen are conspicuous in their hospitality in the matter of dining, but it strikes me forcibly that the Americans are surpassing their brethren 'over the sea' in this respect. I have been in the United States now some six weeks, and it seems to me I have dined out at clubs and other places almost every day since my arrival. Mr. Charles Dickens was entirely alive to the profuse hospitality of the Americans, as this incident will indicate. Some years ago, when he came here to read, he brought with him a strong, vigorous, able-bodied comrade named Dolby. Dolby had been in my employ, and I was by no means struck with his capacity, and I heard to my surprise that Mr. Dickens had engaged him at a large salary. On the return of the great novelist to England I said to him: "I congratulate you, sir, on your great financial and artistic success in the States, but I can't imagine what you would do with Dolby."

VACCINATION.

Some of its Benefits and the Method of Avoiding Them.

L. A. Loveland, M.D., in Medical World. "Several years ago I vaccinated a person whose health had always been excellent and who had never had any kidney disease. The result was that he obtained directly from one of the most reliable propagators of the disease. The operation was carefully performed, and was a success as far as related to its primary object. In about a month after vaccination the patient became dropsical. The crisis was heavily charged with albumen; the urine was dry; appetite and strength diminished; in short the presentation of a typical case of acute albuminuria existed. So obvious was the cause of death that no post mortem examination was made. Authorities mention artificial and syphilitic poison as among the causes producing Bright's disease. I speak of the scarlet fever, measles, smallpox, as sometimes being the cause of albuminuria. If this is so, there is no good reason why vaccination may not occasionally become an etiological factor. In the case we are considering the evidence that it was the cause is quite plain. The process was in which the poison gained an entrance into the system and performed its deadly work it is impossible to determine. Should Bright's disease arise, even in rare instances after vaccination, it would be for suffering humanity."

Dr. Loveland clearly shows that even so simple a matter as vaccination is liable to result in Bright's disease. Indeed medical authorities state that during the preparatory process of the vaccine there is albuminuria, and if this is so, undoubtedly vaccination, which produces a mild form of the disease, will be attended by some manifestation thereof.

The fact of the matter is, and it is getting to be more and more recognized every day, a very little disturbance of the system will produce derangements of the kidneys, which, eventually, result in Bright's disease. Over-anxiety, mental or physical; over-excitement; physical excesses; mental worry; excessive indulgence in certain stimulants and narcotics; frequent changes of life and habits; the taking of a cold; changes of season and climate, all have a tendency to affect the system unfavorably and to produce a diseased condition of the kidneys.

On the contrary, a very small amount of vaccine, if it is of the right kind, has equally powerful effect in the blood when properly administered.

It seems almost like vain repetition to state that pure blood means good health, but it is evident that the belief is popular from the fact that so many so-called remedies are advertised as the best blood purifiers.

Now, in order to purify the blood a remedy must be alternative, and in considerable measure a diuretic; that is to say, it must have the elements in it that will act upon the kidneys as purifiers and will promote the action of the organs which remove the poison from the blood. Unless it has these elements it is absurd to call it a blood purifier.

The tired feeling; the depressed head-ache; the fluttering at the stomach; a sense of faintness; an indigestible, sick feeling of uneasiness and restlessness, all indicate, not disease necessarily of any organ, but a torpid and heavy condition of the blood. It is impossible to purify a stream except at its source. It is impossible to keep the blood rich unless it is purified by the organs which nature has provided for that purpose.

We have shown, as we think every jurist ought to show to his readers, if he is able to do so, that the human system is susceptible to the least cause disturbing the natural operation of the system, and it is by nature to remove the waste and poisonous material of the blood and to wash it out of the system.
