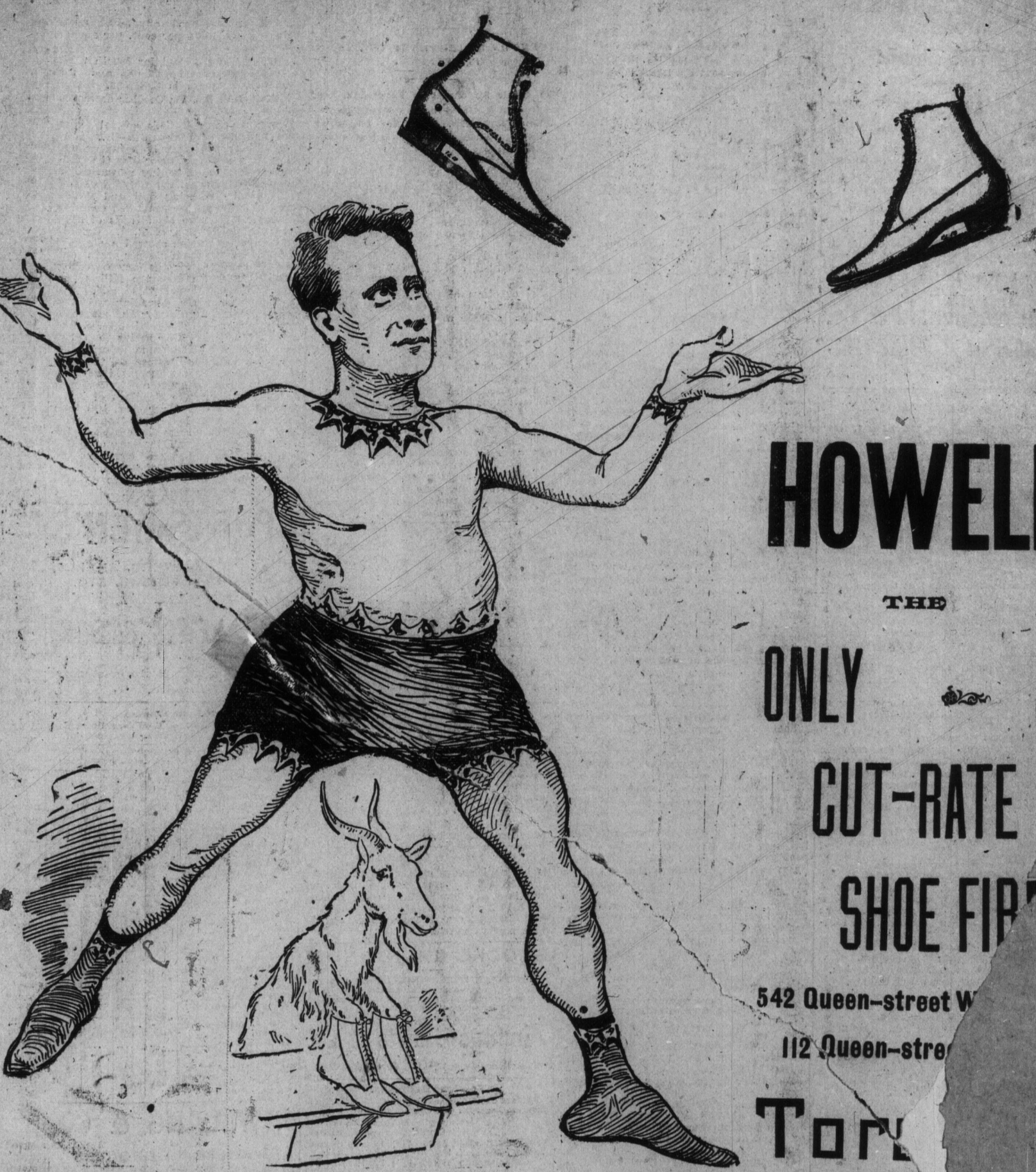

Bank Statement is Favorable. The cash balance of the Bank of Montreal is \$2,994,000, and the deposits are \$1,123,800.
