Princess Victoria. There was an occasion in which the young woman of seven years, wearing a simple white gown and large straw hat, was frequently seen engaged. It was watering the garden plants.

The Princess was an early riser, getting up at 7, frequently earlier in the summer, and breakfasting at 8 o'clock. Her breakfast was just such as any well cared for little girl who was not a princess might be expected to enjoy, bread and milk and fruit placed on a small table by her mother's side.

When breakfast was finished the little Princess went for a walk or a drive, while her half sister, Feodora, her almost constant companion, staid with her governess. From 10 to 12 the Duchess instructed 'Dina, after which she was at liberty to wander at will through the rooms or to play with her many costly toys.

Two o'clock was the dinner hour of the Princess, though the luncheon hour of the Duchess. Plain food, nicely cooked, was placed before the little girl, and she did not, in justice, for she was healthy and strong and enjoyed her meals. After dinner she received assistance in her studies till 4 o'clock, when she was taken to her mother to visit a friend or perhaps to walk or drive, or she was permitted to ride a donkey in the garden.

At the dinner hour of the Duchess her little girl supposed, seated next to her mother. Then came a romp with her nurse, Mrs. Brock. By the time the romp was finished the house party would be at their dessert, and then the Princess would be called in to join them.

Nine o'clock was bedtime, and she never prolonged her day beyond that hour. No matter whether she was at home or at the house of a friend, "nine o'clock bedtime" was rigidly enforced. Her little bed was placed beside her mother's larger bed, so that by day and night mother and daughter were never far apart.

Regular study, regular exercises, simple food and plenty of time out of doors, plenty of play and plenty of sleep, distinguished the upbringing of England's future Queen.

True Education. The education of our children is the great problem of this country's citizens, for Canada's future is in the hands of those children; therefore, unless we have a proper ideal of education, we cannot perform our duties as citizens. It is, perhaps, safe to state that not over five per cent. of the parents of Canada have any idea of education.

To many it means one or two years in a public school, a few more at a high school and four years at a university. But all this is but a small part of real education; it may make the boy a true man, but if it does not become the teachers and companions of the boy have furnished what the father has withheld. Education includes much that cannot be got from books. It includes teaching the child to will, to love, to think, to know. He must learn to take care of his body, to develop his spiritual and moral nature, to gain and use knowledge—and he cannot learn these things except by the best of means, a university graduate and still be uneducated.

A Disgusting Smoker. A revenue agent, late of Chicago, where millions of cigarettes are manufactured, was spoken to on the subject of cigarettes. "I used to be a confirmed cigarette-smoker, but now you could not induce me to touch one of them," he said. "Why, how is that?"

"Well, it's because I went into a large manufacturing place in Chicago, and what I saw there sickened me of the habit. How are they made, and what do I get out of it? It is injurious and mean. Cigarettes picked up from the streets, barks of certain kinds, tobacco-stems and refuse, are heated together in one filthy pile, and then saturated with opium, which gives the cigarette that soothing effect desirable to all smokers. I tell you, sir, if all cigarette-smokers could see as I have seen, how one of the greatest firms in Chicago manufacture cigarettes, the trade in the same would soon fall off or cease entirely."

Lothar Fisher Trouble. St. John's, N.B., Sept. 22.—There is intense indignation in St. George's Bay over the action of the British warship in closing down the lobster factories of residents and confiscating the produce. On Saturday the cruiser Pelican landed a body of men, who surrounded the factories, ejected the inmates and took on board all the packages of prepared lobsters that were ready for shipment. The residents are much incensed at this proceeding, a repetition of which is threatened all along the French coast. The excuse given by the marines is that the factories interfere with the fishery of the French fisheries and the serious consequences are feared before many days elapse. The colonial government is powerless to interfere, as the warships have supreme authority in the matter.

Greek-Turkish Settlement. London, Sept. 23.—The Chronicle publishes an extract from a letter written by Mr. Gladstone under date of yesterday. In it Mr. Gladstone says:—"The pain, shame and mischief of the last two years in the eastern policy transcended entirely the powers of any language. I could not speak of the sum is this— "Firstly—A hundred thousand Armenians have been slaughtered, with no security against a repetition, and with greater profit to the assassin. "Secondly—Turkey is stronger than at any time since the Crimean war. "Thirdly—Greece is weaker than at any time since she became a kingdom. "Fourthly—All this is due to the European concert; that is, the mutual hatred and distrust of the powers."
