CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

The past week has been an uneventful one in lumber circles. There has been less activity in shipments and fewer inquiries. The outlook for fall trade is not altogether promising, although taken in conjunction with the quantity of lumber for sale the conditions cannot be called unsatisfactory. So much of the season's production has already been contracted for that manufacturers are not seriously concerned as to the disposal of the balance. There is little doubt that the demand will absorb the supply before the cut for next season is ready for the market. It may be said that there is an entire absence of uneasiness in respect to white pine lumber, for the market for that lumber has so expanded within the past year or two that it is more a question of where the supply can be obtained than how the production can be disposed of. As to immediate demand, buyers appear to think that lumber is about as high as it will get and that nothing can be lost by holding off. On the other hand, the fact that prices are ruling firm shows the confidence the manufacturers and wholesalers have in the future of the market. In the Ottawa district pine shorts are firmer. A car shortage is again feared this fall and a few dealers are aiming to forestall the shortage by placing orders for their fall and winter requirements earlier than usual. This would seem to be a wise policy.

Reports from the Georgian Bay are that the drives are making splendid progress and that very few logs are likely to be hung up. There is a great scarcity of men for operations in the woods, which may again curtail the production.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The strong position of spruce in the Eastern States has done much to help out the situation in the Maritime Provinces. It has been possible to dispose of all good lumber to advantage and manufacturers have been largely independent of the British market. It must not be supposed, however, that the European trade has been neglected, as considerable shipments have been made to France and Spain as well as to Great Britain. There is an urgent demand for wide spruce and persons having such stock for sale find no difficulty in obtaining a slight advance

upon recent quotations. Clapboards are very firm at the prices quoted. So far as this class of stock is concerned the market is entirely in the hands of the shipper.

New Brunswick cedar shingles are quoted at from \$3.40 to \$3.50 for extras on Boston rate of freight. An occasional order is accepted at five to ten cents below this figure, but the large manufacturers are holding out for \$3.50 and predict that at an early date the price will be firmly established on that basis. For this reason orders for late delivery are turned down.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

Owing to the congestion of the shingle market, the members of the British Columbia Lumber and Shingle Manufacturers' Association decided to suspend operations. On Saturday last, August 15th, all the shingle mills were closed down and will remain idle until the situation has sufficiently improved to warrant a resumption of work. The closing down of the mills will doubtless be followed by a suspension of operations in several logging camps, and the total number of men thus thrown out of employment will be quite large. It seemed absolutely necessary, however, to curtail the shingle production, which had been greatly increased within the past year by the erection of several new mills. The lumber demand is of average volume and prices steady. Seventy-seven licenses for cutting timber were issued by the British Columbia Government during July.

UNITED STATES.

The month of August so far has turned out about as expected. The volume of business does not compare favorably with the corresponding period of last year, but still there is very little complaint of unsatisfactory trade. The crops have deteriorated slightly within the past month, but promise an average yield. It seems to be the general opinion that prices of white pine are not likely to advance to a higher basis this season. For this reason consumers are showing no anxiety to add to their holdings, but on the other hand are disposed to wait until necessity compels them to purchase. Business conditions generally are favorable. A large consumption of lumber by the Eastern States is expected this fall, as most of the building strikes have been settled. The lower grades of pine are selling somewhat readily, the consumption being large. A Buffalo firm reports the sale of half a million feet of Lake Superior No. 3 boards, 12-inch, for \$20.50 on board the barge. The price of 12-inch box is still \$20. Stock is accumulating rapidly at Buffalo and Tonawanda, but the poorer grades, especially box and barn, are still insufficient to supply the demand. Saginaw Valley dealers are not buying to any extent, as most of them have a sufficient stock to care for the fall trade. The spruce demand is as firm as ever and prices slightly

stronger. By some it is predicted that the fall will witness an advance. Boston and Bangor dealers are making large shipments to the South American market.

The hardwood supply has doubtless been considerably increased of late, but the demand has been sufficient to prevent an accumulation of stock at wholesale centres. The demand for quarter-sawed oak is less urgent. Basswood has become more plentiful as a result of shipments from Michigan and Wisconsin. Birch and elm are scarce and cannot be kept in stock.

Hemlock prices continue to be very stiff. In some districts hemlock lumber is being supplanted by North Carolina pine. Buffalo reports great activity in hemlock on the base price of \$16.

Shingle prices are practically unchanged. There is a disposition to hold shingles for the improvement which is expected in the fall. In the Saginaw Valley cedar shingles are held at \$2.60 and \$3.60 for 18-inch stock and \$2 and \$2.45 for 16-inch.

GREAT BRITAIN.

The holiday season in Great Britain has resulted in a falling off in the lumber demand. The consumption, however, has been equal to the import, and stocks are no heavier than one month ago. The high prices of first quality pine and spruce deals have been maintained. Pine deals are almost invariably sold from the quay, which has prevented any accumulation of stock. Importers who make a specialty of this branch of business state that they have no lack of orders. There is more uncertainty about fourth quality pine, the supply of which is comparatively large. Very little spruce arrives at either London or Liverpool that has not already been contracted for. The receipts of 3 x 9 and 11 inch have been exceptionally small.

A writer in the Timber News urges prospective buyers to place their orders at current figures. He says: "The immense Quebec output is a vision of the past, and the enormous rise in all prime log stuff is at length reacting much more perceptibly with regard to sawn deals, boards and scantling. It may appear and indeed is an absurdity for consumers here to be quoted £45 per standard for best broad pines, with £35 for all 11 x 3; but in view of the facts already adduced, however, and having respect to the improving quotations of other competing woods, we are strongly of opinion that the buyer will have to be content for the present to remain entirely in the hands of the seller. The small quantities available in all prime stocks is another dominant factor to be remembered. While it must be admitted that a considerable percentage of consumers have been able to divert a portion of their wants to other woods, and to substitute canary whitewood, cottonwood, kauri and sequoia for pine lumber, there still exists a sufficient number of buyers

who are impelled to maintain the use of Canadian pine. In this connection importers have succeeded this season in placing fair quantities of prime logs ranging from 18in. to 19in. average at 35 9d to 45 per foot string measure ex quay. It is to be doubted even if these excessive results represent finality. We learn that one or two of the principal Quebec shippers are even sounding buyers as to their willingness to contract for next year at still higher quotations, which they assert will prevail in 1904."

STOCKS AND PRICES.

For the week ending August 8th Buffalo received by water 4,474,000 ft of lumber and 4,880,000 shingles.

The Gull River Lumber Company, of Cobokong, Ont., have cut about 750,000 feet of lumber this season.

The steamer Persian is loading deals at Marysville, N. B., for the Alexander Gibson Manufacturing Company.

No. 1 white pine lath is selling in Chicago at \$3.50; No. 1 hemlock and Norway mixed at \$3 to \$3.10, and No. 2 at \$2.75.

D. & J. Ritchie & Company, of Newcastle, N. B., are understood to have purchased a quantity of logs which will enable the mill to run longer than anticipated.

The steamer Nzassa arrived at Montreal last week from Savannah, with 1,932,790 feet of pitch pine lumber, consigned to McLean, Kennedy & Company.

W. A. Preston, of Mine Centre, Ont., has just received a contract to get out 100,000 ties for the Canadian Northern Railway. He has two camps in operation.

A raft of 5,000,000 feet of pine logs from Spanish River to Sarnia, in tow of the tug Buscobel, broke away from the tug in a heavy gale about 48 miles off Sturgeon Point on August 11th.

Firsts and seconds white ash sells readily in Chicago at \$36 for one inch, common at \$22 and cull at \$11 to \$12. Holders are asking \$38 for firsts and seconds basswood. Birch is quoted at \$29 for inch first and seconds, with 1½ and 2 inch selling at \$2 additional.

Keenan Bros., of Owen Sound, Ont., last week received a raft of 2,500,000 feet of hemlock logs from St. Joseph's Island. Unfavorable weather was encountered and it is estimated that nearly 300,000 feet were lost during the journey and through the breaking of booms at the island.

The corporation of Victoria, B. C., recently invited tenders for paving blocks. James Leigh & Son, J. A. Sayward, the Taylor Saw Mill Company and the Shawinigan Lake Lumber Company tendered, but prices were the same in each case, namely \$18.75 for fir and \$23.45 for cedar.

This is especially true of the Penobscot mills, the manufacturers in Bangor being unwilling to make prices on account of the scarcity of logs. The situation on the Kennebec is better, but most of the lumber sawed there is going to New York, where better prices are being obtained. Boston could also have a share from this source if the dealers here were willing to pay about \$1 more for lumber. Trade is quiet, but owing to the light

THE OTTAWA VALLEY.

(Correspondence of the CANADA LUMBERMAN.)

The midsummer lassitude has had its effect on the lumber trade in Ottawa and district, and while cutting operations at the mills have been brisk, the movement of lumber at least to the United States has been slow. The past few days have ushered in an improved condition of affairs in some yards, but a substantial all round improvement is looked for with the advent of September days and the return of the American buyer from his vacation. The New York and Eastern States building strikes had a lot to do with the falling off in local lumber business when it should have been at its best.

Labor troubles have certainly played the devil with the export lumber business of this district, but now that the differences between employer and employee in dependent lines of trade, have been straightened out, local shippers look forward to busy doings.

The millmen up the C. P. Railway, at Pembroke, Cache Bay and other points, report a rush in the movement of lumber to Montreal for export. The dock laborers' strike earlier in the season is responsible for this rush, as purchasers who held off their consignments then are now clamoring with one voice to have them rushed through.

Inquiry amongst local and visiting lumbermen and a scrutiny of several bills of lumber, fail to show any change from the quotations running for the past fortnight. Pine shorts are a trifle firmer, showing an advance of a dollar a thousand on medium grades. On pine sidings the mill quotations run from \$16.50 to \$19.00 per M. Other lines, however, warrant no change.

One dealer who returned this week from a trip in the New England States reported that wherever possible Georgia and other southern pine was being substituted for Canadian white pine on account of the stiff prices asked for the latter.

In both lath and shingles hereabouts trade is quite, particularly so with shingles. This depression is probably responsible for the fixed figures in the price list.

It is early yet to make a forecast of figures for the future. Inquiries for deals are being made, however, but no figures are mentioned.

Local lumbermen are taking great interest in the big sale of limits to be held by the Ontario Government in Toronto on December 9th. Discussing it to-day, one prominent holder expressed regret that the Provincial Government had inserted a clause requiring the removal of all timber within ten years. He characterized it as a needless sacrifice of an asset of ever increasing value. It is felt that the sale will be the means of introducing several new companies into the business, this being made possible by the division of townships for sale into small lots.

Speaking on the question of limits a day or so ago, an operator who recently paid \$350,000 for a tract of white pine in the Nipissing country, gave it as his opinion that the present price of pine on the stump would hold, no matter how the price of the manufactured article might fluctuate. Judging from the figures quoted on recent sales of limits, his opinion is held in common by the majority. The standing pine is being cut in some limits faster than is imagined, and at a pace that outdistances natural reproduction. As an instance, in the Kippewa

district the coming season's cut of waney and square timber will be considerably less than that of last season.

The call for the lumber jack is heard in the land. Some of the lumber companies profess no difficulty in securing men, while others say they are having trouble. The lateness of the Ontario harvest and the exodus to the Northwest, to both of which are attached high wages, have combined to deplete the available supply of lumbermen. With the completion of the harvesting operations, however, the situation will be relieved. A number of the firms having retained the names of last season's good hands, are re-engaging them easily this time. From the Soo comes the report that the Lake Superior Consolidated Company is after 2,000 men, many of which are being hired here.

Everything is moving briskly up in the Georgian Bay district, and the late logs are coming along satisfactorily. A sale of limits is reported from Thessalon. N. & A. Dymont, of that town, sold two townships recently to George Neibergall & Son, of Windsor. This firm will establish a well equipped mill at Echo Bay, on the Soo branch of the C. P. R. Ritchie Bros' mill at Aylmer, Que., above Ottawa, will have a record cut this season, amounting, it is expected, to fully 20,000,000 feet. It is mostly intended for the English and South African market, but Buffalo will get some. The red pine goes to Watson & Todd, Liverpool, and the white pine to the W. C. Edward Company.

The Pembroke Lumber Company's mill has been shut down at night, and the gang sent forward to work in the camps. The Shephard & Morse mill at Hintonburg was also shut down on night operations on

account of the exhaustion of the log supply. It will resume night work shortly, however, as more logs are on the way.

The recent accident at Fraser & Company's new mill, whereby the power house was laid in ruins by a cyclone, will delay the commencement of cutting operations about six weeks or two months.

LUMBER SHIPMENTS TO THE UNITED STATES.

The shipments of lumber from Canada to the United States continue to increase. The last statement compiled covers the twelve months ending May 31st, 1903. The export in that period was 653,358,000 feet, valued at \$9,603,274, as compared with 594,596,000 feet, of a value of \$8,253,168, for the eleven months ending May 31st, 1902. This is an increase of over 58,000,000 feet. There is also a steady increase in the value of lumber exported, the average price this year being 15 per cent. higher than in 1901 and 6 per cent. above that in 1902.

The increase in value and amount of shingles exported is about in line with that in lumber, except that the price is increasing at a greater ratio than the volume. The export for eleven months ending May 31st for three years was as follows: 1903, 653,487,000 shingles; 1902, 624,736,000; 1901, 483,946,000. The average value for the three years was \$2.06, \$1.92 and \$1.25.

TIMBER LIMIT TRANSACTIONS.

Richard Keay & Company have bought the Hanbury timber limit in the Tuck Mountain district, Manitoba, and will operate it in future.

Christie & Fraser, of Victoria, B. C., have purchased from the Eric Milling Company their timber limits and logging outfit on Guilford Island, the purchase price being in the neighborhood of \$15,000. There are some 12,000 acres of timber lands.

It is rumored that American capitalists are negotiating for the purchase of the timber limits and mills of the William Richards Company at Campbellton, Chatham and Borestown, N. B. It is also stated that an American syndicate has an option on the properties of the Edward Sinclair Company, of Newcastle, N. B.

The Michigan Land & Lumber Company, of Blind River, Ont., are reported to have sold about one-half of their timber

limits in the Algoma district to the Morgan Lumber Company, of Toronto. The limits sold are estimated to contain between 65,000,000 and 75,000,000 feet of timber and the deal includes the logging outfit of the Michigan Company. The consideration is said to be \$300,000 cash. The company still holds three townships estimated to contain 75,000,000 feet, but it is unlikely they will operate the coming winter.

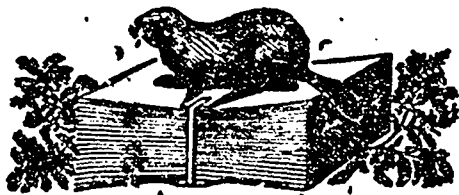
