MINUTES OF CONFERENCE

HELD IN THE

WALL STREET METHODIST CHURCH

BROCKVILLE, ONTARIO.

Conference Organized June 4th, 1891.

The Eighth Session of the Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church assembled, according to appointment, in the Wall Street Methodist Church, Brockville, Ont., Thursday, June 4th, 1891, at 9 o'clock a.m.

The Rev. T. G. WILLIAMS, D.D., President, in the chair.

After singing, and the reading of a portion of Scripture, prayer was offered by the Rev. Wm. Scott, of Ottawa, and His Honor Judge Deacon, of Pembroke.

The presiding officer called for the list of lay members as elected by the District Meetings, which was presented (see Appendix), and the Secretary then called the roll, when 106 clerical and thirty-one lay delegates answered to their names.

The Rev. J. Cooper Antliff, M.A., D.D., was elected President on the first ballot, and suitably acknowledged the honor.

The Rev. WILLIAM GOOLD HENDERSON, of Perth, was elected Secretary on the third ballot, and thanked the Conference for the expression of their confidence.

The Secretary nominated Revs. J. Webster, C. S. Deeprose, and Mr. S. S. Merrick, of Carleton Place, as Assistant Secretaries, and Rev. WM. PHILP, B.A., B.D., as Journal Secretary, which nominations were confirmed by the Conference.

Rev. James Lawson was appointed reporter for the Christian Guardian, and Rev. A. B. Johnston as clerk to sign railway certificates.

The hours of Session were established as follows:—9 a.m. to 12 noon, and 2 o'clock p.m. to 5.30 p.m.

Rev. W. K. Shertt, M.A., was elected by ballot as Chairman of Stanstead District, in place of Rev. W. J. Jolliffe, B.C.L., transferred out of the Conference.

The Conference prayer-meeting was held from 11 to 12 o'clock noon.

OBITUARIES.

THOMAS A. AUSTIN.

Thomas A. Austin was born in Eganville, county of Renfrew, on August 24th, 1864. At the age of sixteen he entered mercantile life in the tent presented by the ladies of Montreal to the Rev. S. Huntingdon. Our departed brother was converted to God under the instrumentality of Rev. R. C. Horner, March, 1887. He received a clear evidence of his adoption, and the change was soon manifest to all around. He joined heartily in the work of the Church, and through his influence many of his young friends were converted to God.

His mind was greatly exercised regarding the ministry, but at length, in September, 1888, he determined to give up his two lucrative establishments, and took work under the Chairman in the Nipissing District. In 1889 he was accepted by the Conference as a probationer, and sent to Algoma. On this difficult field his word was blessed to the salvation of many. He lived for souls. His manner was marked alike by geniality, sympathy and earnestness.

In 1890 he was left without a station at his own request. He went on a visit to Old Orchard Beach, Me., where he was taken alarmingly ill, and his mortal career ended on August 4th. For some time before his death his joy amounted to ecstacy, calling on those around him to aid him in praising God. He left about \$3,000 by will, for missionary purposes.

In Bro. Austin the Church loses a young man of bright promise of great usefulness. His memory is highly honored wheresoever he had labored.

SAMUEL JACKSON.

Brother Jackson was the son of John Jackson and Elizabeth Wiltie, his wife, and was born in Melbourne, Province of Quebec, on September 24th, 1838. His parents were pious and devout Methodists from England. Samuel was early at school, but the advantages of a district school were not great in those days. He made rapid progress during a too brief attendance at St. Francis' College. About this time he was converted to God under the ministry of Rev. T. W. Constable. Bro. Jackson was soon put upon the exhorter's plan, and then licensed a local preacher before he was nineteen years old.

In 1858 he was employed under the Chairman on the Eaton Circuit. In 1859 he was received on trial, and stationed at Dunham. In 1862 he was received into full connexion, but his ordination was deferred, and he was allowed to attend Victoria College. In 1863 he was ordained to the sacred ministry, and in the same year he was married to Miss Lucinda B. Pierce, daughter of Frederick Pierce, of Stanbridge East, but he retired from active ministerial work that year. He received a superannuated relation in 1886. Including 1867 and 1870, he was stationed in Vergens, Vermont Conference, having

removed to the United States. Being disposed to discontinue his work there he returned to Canada, and in 1871 he took a supernumerary relation in his old Conference, which he maintained to the time of his death, which occurred March 1st, 1891.

Brother Jackson was a man of fine taste and sensibility. He was an extensive reader all his life, and possessed a good memory. For twenty years he resided in Stanbridge East, where he was much esteemed by all the community, and during all these years he was a faithful and valued helper on the Freligsburg Circuit. With his liberality and energy he was instrumental in building a beautiful church in his village, the sight of which will often recall his benevolence and faithfulness to the Methodist Church that he loved so well. He was a good preacher, and had an extensive knowledge of the Discipline and usages of our Church. He was a true friend and a faithful minister of the Word of God. His illness was protracted, and for the last year and a half he did but little work. Many physicians could not stay the disease, and he went slowly but surely down to the grave. Those who visited him found him trusting in Jesus. He said to his pastor, Rev. Hiram Fowler, "It is wonderful the peace that Jesus gives." Death had no terrors, and heaven was very precious. On that bright Sabbath morning, March 1st, his soul went peacefully away - "away to his Redeemer's breast." He leaves a widow and two sons, and two little daughters. His funeral was attended by a large and sympathizing congregation, and eleven of his ministerial brethren were present. We buried him in Frelighsburg beside the graves of his little sons. Brother Jackson was in the fifty-third year of his age and the thirty-third of his ministry.

QUESTION.—Have District Sabbath-school Conventions been held? Answer.—Yes; on some Districts.

QUESTION.—What further measures can be adopted for the promotion of the work of God, etc., and what are the recommendations of the District Meetings on this subject?

ANSWER:

A memorial recommending the organization of an order of deaconesses from Brockville District, and also from Ottawa, urging the enforcement of the rules in reference to class-meetings, renewal of tickets and quarterly fasts. In addition to the foregoing, a request was received from Nipissing District asking that three men be appointed to do shanty work on District, and that the Missionary Society be asked for a grant of \$100 for each, per annum. Also that Nipissing Mission be placed under the charge of the Superintendent of Powassan, that a second man be sent to Sudbury, and that the Chairman of the District be left without a Circuit, as the best interests of the District demand it.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE STANSTED WESLEYAN COLLEGE.

The Trustees of the Stanstead Wesleyan College respectfully submit to the Conference the following report for the year 1890-91. We present first Principal McAmmond's report:—

We are pleased to report that the attendance throughout the year has been much more regular than usual, giving us an average of almost one hundred for each term.

As to the educational work of the year, one student has completed the First year's course in Arts, prescribed by McGill University; eight have taken the work of Matriculation, and are now engaged at their examinations; one has completed the Ladies' Collegiate Course, and will proceed to the degree of Mistress in the Liberal Arts; fifteen have completed the course in Commercial Science, and will accordingly receive their diplomas this month; twenty-four have covered the work of the various grades, and are now writing for their Government certificates; three will write for their Model School diplomas. In Music and Fine Art, we have had during the year about thirty pupils. There is a growing desire among the students generally to avail themselves of the advantages offered by the institution, through affiliation with McGill, and we have every reason to believe that the coming year will bring us an increased number of students for the course in Arts. We are also pleased to report that the year has been fruitful in spiritual results. The religious services have been seasons of gracious, divine manifestations, resulting in the conversion of several of our students. For the coming year it will be necessary to secure some new teachers to fill the positions rendered vacant by the resignation of some of our present staff. The Advisory Board recommends the re-appointment of the Rev. F. McAmmond, B.A., as Principal and Governor for the ensuing year, and Prof. H. W. Townsend, B.A., as Mathematical and Classical teacher.

As to the financial results, the income for the year has been \$7,699.85, an increase over the preceding year of \$3,097.23.

At the last Conference I had the honor to be appointed as one of the official visitors to the Stanstead Wesleyan College.

During the scholastic year just now closing, I have had the pleasure of visiting the College, both in the first half and second half of the year.

Having known the College somewhat intimately for a little more than sixteen years, I am happy to report that I have found the College this year, in some important respects, in a better condition than ever before. The grading of the pupils is improved.

From the answers given to me when examining the classes, I shall expect the result of the Government examinations to be more creditable than ever this year. I had the pleasure of attending a college prayer-meeting, and while conducting the same, I was delighted with the large number of students of both sexes who took part, many of whom had been converted during the session.

One of the teachers assured me that she had been largely blessed spiritually through her residence in the College. The library in the College is very small and should be increased.

I have never regarded the prospects of the College to be brighter than now; as one specially interested, I feel that we may thank God and take courage.

The Secretary of the Board reports that during the past year \$2,430.31 have been collected through the effort to reduce the debt, but that amount has been wholly absorbed by the payment of interest, the \$1,100 referred to in the report of the Treasurer and some necessary expenses in collecting. During the past two years \$10,365 have been subscribed for the debt, \$5,017 have been paid, leaving \$5,348 of unpaid subscriptions. It is hoped that a large proportion of this amont will be realized during the year. The Trustees would express their pleasure that the Conference has adopted the following method for the entire liquidation of the debt, and it is hoped this will prove successful. The ensuing financial meetings of the Districts are urged to arrange, either by the respective pastors or by local agents, for the raising of the following amounts:—Montreal, \$3,000; Kingston, \$1,500; Brockville, \$2,000; Matilda, \$1,500; Perth, \$1,500; Pembroke, \$1,500; Ottawa, \$2,000; Quebec, \$1,000; Stanstead, \$1,000; Waterloo, \$1,000; Huntingdon, \$500.

The Trustees avail themselves of this opportunity of placing on record their high appreciation of the work done during the year by Principal McAmmond and his excellent staff of teachers. We believe the work has been most thorough. We bespeak from the members of the Conference and the loyal Methodists throughout the country a generous and hearty support of this College, which is growing in usefulness and influence.

REPORT OF THE STATISTICAL COMMITTEE.

The Statistical Committee has been laboring under great disadvantages in consequence of the incompleteness of the returns. If the Districts could arrange to have their schedules complete before Conference, it would greatly facilitate the work of the Committee; and we would respectfully call the attention of the Chairmen of Districts to the resolutions of General Conference, 1890, particularly the following:—"Chairmen of Districts must insist upon full and complete returns being furnished at the May District Meeting."

Although quite a number of persons have removed by letter, and over 1,100 persons were dropped during the year, we are glad to report a net increase of 1,183 in the membership.

The present membership of this Conference is as follows:—Full members, 33,582; on trial, 1,743; total, 35,325.

The number of baptisms during the year:—Infants, 2,480; adults, 291; total, 2,771. Marriages, 956; burials, 1,403.

REPORT OF SUNDAY-SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

The returns indicate that the interest of our Church in Sunday-school work is steadily increasing. Twenty-eight additional teachers have been employed during the year, and the average attendance is much higher than last year.

The increase in the number of scholars is 2,575. It is significant that this increase is entirely in the intermediate and adult classes. The primary classes show a decrease of 179; the intermediate an increase of 961, and the adult classes an increase of 1,057. This may perhaps be in some measure due to the good work of the Epworth Leagues of the Conference. The 1,403 conversions during the year are reasons for devout thankfulness to God. This is an increase of forty-nine over last year.

Your Committee regret that the figures show eighty-nine scholars less learning the Catechism, and would recommend that Superintendents be strongly urged to give more attention to this part of the Sunday-school work.

The amount of money raised for Sunday-school purposes during the year is \$14,080.19, being \$1,034.70 in advance of last year; and yet the contributions to missions have not been diminished, but show a slight advance of \$2.67. Eight thousand two hundred and sixty-nine of our Sunday-school workers are pledged to total abstinence.

REPORT OF THE EPWORTH LEAGUE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg leave to report that the Epworth League, of which this Conference now takes official notice for the first time, is an institution intended to promote religious and literary work among our young people, affording also scope for the exercise of social relations.

The religious work is carried out on lines whereby the young people are led to take not only an interest but also a part in spiritual exercises, as in our social means of grace.

The literary, while embracing a wider scope, aims especially at the study of the Scriptures, and of Methodist history and theology.

There are now on various charges within the bounds of this Conference 46 Leagues, with a membership of 2,164. They are found to be a source of much blessing to the young people, and a valuable help to the Church. There are also several societies of Christian Endeavor on different charges, doing a good work.

But your Committee would recommend that, wherever practicable, Epworth Leagues be formed in preference to any other society, as being the institution approved and sanctioned by our General Conference.

They would also recommend that care be given to develop especially the religious department, and that the Leagues receive the hearty sympathy and support of the pastor and church in each place.

They would further respectfully suggest that the provisions of the Discipline, par. 311, page 137, in regard to the holding of District Conventions, be carried out.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

The Treasurer's Annual Report and Statement for the year ending July 31st, 1890, as passed by the Board.

The estimates for the year just closed were made on the most economical scale, and were barely sufficient to meet the current expenses of the year. The various Circuits in the Connexion raised \$49,461.92, or \$1,254.48 more than last year; and the ministerial subscriptions were also a little in advance. There were, however, small deficiencies in the amounts expected from both these sources of income.

There was a falling off in the Interest Account, arising from our inability to get several comparatively large sums of interest which, though due and considered perfectly reliable, we could not realize before the close of the year; and also, because in one of our large investments a reduction of one per cent. had to be made.

I am happy to say that the Book Room has increased the annual grant to the Fund up to \$6,300, an advance of \$300.

Notwithstanding the increased expenditure incurred by the removal to our new premises, the expenses of the Fund have been reduced some \$68.

The additional amount required to pay claimants was \$2,398.69, and all have been paid in full and all expenses met; but the circumstances above referred to have left the Annual Account deficient \$1,010.56. Of this amount, however, more than \$800 are in the hands of reliable parties, who are expected to pay up in a very short time.

After writing off the amounts recommended by the Board, and without embracing the munificent legacy of William Gooderham, Esq., not yet received, the investments of the Fund now amount to \$176,503.76.

In accordance with the instructions of the Board, a competent committee of laymen have examined all the securities held on behalf of the Fund, and reported to the Board that they found the securities in a very satisfactory condition.

REPORT OF THE TREASURER OF THE SUPERANNUATION FUND OF THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE.

There are in the Montreal Conference thirteen Districts assessed for the Fund, \$9,705; of this amount, \$1,550.27 was paid to the Treasurer, Rev. James Gray, before the 1st of May. There has been paid since the 1st of May an additional amount of \$8,137.10, making a total of \$9,688.37; leaving a deficiency of \$16.63 of income from Circuits.

There are in the Conference 203 ministers and probationers who have paid into this Fund. There were \$627 paid in at the Financial District Meeting; and \$1,911 since the 1st of May, making a total of \$2,538 paid into this Fund this year.

The grand total paid in this year by this Conference is \$12,226.37.

- 3. That the request of Rev. G. S. Eldridge, B.A, for superannuation be granted, and that the Conference recommend the Superannuation Board to commute his claim.
- 4. That the request of Rev. E. A. Geoffroy for superannuation be granted.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON STATE OF THE WORK.

The work of the Lord has prospered during the past year in a marked degree. The fruitage of the labors put forth is seen in a large increase in membership and general prosperity in almost every department of the work. This generally prosperous state of the work is an evidence that God has set upon it the seal of His approval, and affords good ground upon which to rest our belief in future prosperity. The increase of membership over that of the past year is 1,183, due, in a large measure, to the conversion of sinners who have afterwards enrolled themselves upon our lists.

The success of the Conference educational institutions during the past year has been beyond that of the previous year, which was an exceptionally prosperous one. The financial status of these institutions has been improved, and the outlook is bright with promise. At Stanstead, not only has the educational work been of a highly satisfactory character, but a great interest in spiritual work has been awakened in the minds and hearts of the students and others, thus indicating that a religious educa-

tion in the highest sense of the term is afforded our young people gathered within its walls.

The success of the Montreal Book Room is a noteworthy fact. This success might be largely increased if the debts now due the Concern were paid at an early date, and if those who comprise this Conference would give the Book Room at Montreal the preference when making purchases. It will be found that the most favorable terms and prices can be secured at this establishment.

The religious periodicals and papers of our Connexion furnish most interesting and instructive reading for the Sunday-school scholars, members of the Epworth League and the home circle respectively. While this may be said of our literature, it is a matter of regret that the members of the Methodist Church do not avail themselves of the intelligence conveyed through the *Guardian* by subscribing for it more largely.

As a feature of our polity, the class-meeting has always proved a very important means of grace, and has largely assisted in maintaining loyalty to our Church; it is therefore respectfully recommended that wherever practicable the long-established usage of speaking words of comfort, cheer, consolation and edification to each member separately by the leader be continued so as to distinguish the class-meeting from fellowship-meetings.

With reference to that part of the work which is recognized as evangelistic work, your Committee is of opinion that the time has arrived for the adoption of systematic supervision over the evangelistic services held within the limits of the Conference. This appears necessary, not only as a prudential step against teaching that may conflict with our distinctively Methodistic doctrines, but that provision may be made for the payment of a regular salary to Evangelists, in accord with the provisions of paragraph 180, page 87, of the Discipline.

It is a matter for great thankfulness to God that the way for preaching a living faith in China is being graciously opened up, and that three young men of this Conference have offered themselves for this work.

Your Committee with satisfaction can state that the Epworth League is an institution worthy of the united support of our Churches, as no means for instructing the young that spring up in our Church has been more successful in gathering in and interesting them in matters relating to religious work.

The French Methodist Institute has been blessed with about double the number of students it had the previous year; fifteen of these were from Roman Catholic families, and a gracious work of the Spirit resulted in the conversion of many to God.

The important work in connection with the appointment of deaconesses, though endorsed by the General Conference, has not yet assumed a distinct organic existence within our borders.

It is respectfully recommended that Financial District Meetings devote a portion of their annual session to the promotion of the spiritual work of the Church.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

Your Committee beg leave to report as follows:—

1. That no memorials have been presented to the Committee bearing upon the subject of Sabbath Observance.

2. That upon inquiry of those persons who are in a position to give information, we learn that boating, driving in carriages, and travelling by railway on Sunday are common and growing evils of the present time.

3. That the law is painfully defective in providing the proper means in punishing certain forms of Sabbath desecration. Persons who employ laborers on the Sabbath day cannot be punished by the law as it now is. Those who go out boating or driving on Sabbath, and wish to evade the law, hire their boats and horses on Saturday evening.

4. That the Lord's Day Alliance of the Dominion of Canada has through its legal committee introduced a bill, known as the Charlton Bill, into Parliament. The object of this bill is to secure the better observance of the Sabbath. The last General Conference recognized the good work already done by the Alliance in awakening a wider and deeper interest in the subject, and recommended that the entire Church make a united and vigorous effort to secure the passage of the bill.

5. The General Conference appointed a standing committe to co-operate with the Alliance, and other societies of a similar kind, in promoting the sancity of the Sabbath, and recommend that a service be devoted specially to the subject in all our churches once a year.

Your Committee recommend the Conference to concur in the recommendations of the General Conference, and to urge upon its members and congregations throughout the Connexion the great importance of observing with the utmost care and fidelity the Holy Sabbath.

Your Committee further recommend that the following memorial be sent to the Dominion Parliament and Senate signed by the President and Secretary of Conference, asking for the passage of the Charlton Bill, re Sabbath Observance:—

To the Honorable the House of Commons and Senate of the Dominion of Canada:—

Whereas, the Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church in Canada, assembled in the town of Brockville, in the Province of Ontario, feeling the great need of better legislation in regard to Sabbath Observance, in order that the sanctity of the Lord's Day may be duly maintained, and that all the people of our Christian land may enjoy the fullest benefit of rest and worship as evidently designed by the Creator, would most respectfully ask your honorable body to pass the bill known as the Charlton Bill, re Sabbath Observance, that the hands of God's people may be strengthened in their efforts to secure the better and more general observance of the Christian Sabbath.

REPORT OF THE MEMORIAL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg leave to report, as follows:--

1. Re the return of French members.—In the judgment of your Committee, the resolution from the Quebec Districts, touching the return of French members is of such a nature as not to require the action of the Conference at the present time.

2. Re the Petition of the Woman's Missionary Society.—Your Committee desire to give expression to their confidence in and their sympathy with the Woman's Missionary Society, and pray that their important and self-denying labors may be more than ever successful in extending the Redeemer's kingdom; but, owing to the great number of connexional collections already required by the Discipline, your Committee regret that they cannot see their way clear to recommend the Conference to set apart a special Sunday, as asked for in the petition.

3. Re the Order of Deaconesses.—Your Committee heartily endorse the prayer of the memorial, and, as the General Conference took action in this matter, your Committee recommend the Conference to appoint the following Committee:—The President of Conference, W. Tees, Esq., Rev. H. F. Bland, Rev. Dr. Douglas and Rev. W. Jackson, whose duty it shall be to meet during the year and prepare a scheme for the consideration of the next Annual Conference.

4. Whereas there have been, and there now are, at work within the bounds of the Montreal Conference several evangelists of whose qualification the Conference authorities have no knowledge, and who are in no way responsible to the Conference for their moral character or doctrinal correctness.

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Conference appoint a committee of five, to be nominated by the President, to whom the names of all evangelists shall be submitted, and it shall be the duty of said committee to inquire into their qualifications for our work; and no evangelists shall be employed within the bounds of this Conference who have not received the authentication of the aforementioned committee, as well as the sanction of some Quarterly Board.

5. Re Prison Reform.—Your Committee here endorse the memorial from the Prison Reform Association, as far as they have any light on the subject, and recommend the Conference to assure the Association of their

profound sympathy with them in their benevolent work.

Your Committee also recommend the Conference to appoint a delegate to attend the next conference of the Prison Reform Association, to be held next autumn.

All of which your Committee respectfully submit.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

Your Committee on Temperance beg leave to submit the following report:—

1. We recommend that a memorial be sent to the House of Commons of Canada from this Conference, praying that a law prohibiting the manufacture, importation and sale of intoxicating liquors as a beverage,

be passed at the present session.

2. We also recommend that, in view of the fact that a very much stronger desire for the prohibition of the liquor traffic has been made apparent by the large number of petitions already presented to the House of Commons during the present session, and that we have reasonable expectation and strong hopes that such a law may be placed on the statute books in the near future, we would earnestly request that the ministers of our Conference would, upon every occasion presented to them, strongly urge upon our people to rise to the high standard of duty that will then be presented to them, by showing to the world which side they endorse on this most important question, by giving to the persons who may be appointed to see to the enforcement of such a law all the active assistance necessary, which tends to make all law a success.

And we would also request our ministerial brethren to lay before the members of our Church, the necessity of consistency in profession and action, by refusing to sign any and all petitions presented to them asking

for licenses to be issued for the sale of intoxicating liquors.

We would also call your attention to the argument that is often used against prohibition, that is, the revenue of the Dominion would fall short to the extent of the amount now received from the excise department. We think the Methodist Church should place upon record the willingness of its members to approve of and endorse the imposition of direct taxation to the extent to make up for any loss that may be sustained by the enacting of a prohibitory law. We recommend the Conference to place upon record its attitude of antagonism to the principle of compensation. We hold that those engaged in the liquor traffic have been allowed in the

past to make large sums of money out of our fellow-citizens under the protection of the law, and we feel that they will have no just cause of complaint if that protection be withdrawn, and they then properly stand on the common platform with the rest of their fellow-subjects. We recommend that the request of the Dominion Alliance be complied with, and that four brethren (on the nomination of the President) be selected to represent this Conference at their meeting in Toronto in September.

SECOND REPORT.

Your Committee on Temperance beg leave to present their second

1. We beg to nominate the following brethren as delegates from this Conference to the Temperance Convention to be held in Chicago, in the year 1892, namely: Rev. Dr. Williams, Rev. Mr. Chown, Judge Deacon, Dr. Alexander, R. J. Latimer, Esq.

2. That the President be requested to appoint a Special Committee to draft a memorial to the House of Commons, as recommended in our first report, and approved of by the Conference.

CONSTITUTION OF THE SUSTENTATION FUND.

1. The name of this Fund shall be, "The Sustentation Fund of the Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church."

2. The one object of this Fund shall be to supply those fields in our Home Work which are now, and shall hereafter be, known as "Domestic Missions," or "Dependent Circuits on Stations," so that ministers and preachers duly appointed to those fields shall be regular claimants on the Fund, and shall be entitled to supplemental grants therefrom, whenever their "total income" from other sources shall actually fall below the following scale of minimum allowances, viz:—

For a single preacher on probation, \$300 per annum; for a single ordained minister, \$400 per annum; for a married minister, in full connexion, \$500 per annum, with \$25 for each subsequent year until his allowance reaches \$600 per annum.

N.B.—The term, "allowance," or "allowances," shall be understood as including only the items of ministerial support, viz., salary, board and fuel, exclusive of and in addition to any necessary charges for house rent, horse-keeping, travelling, removals, and circuit incidentals.

Note.—That in regard to the distribution of the money contributed to this Fund, the Committee shall have discretionary power to make grants to ministers with families, even when the minimum allowance, \$600, is exceeded.

3. The income of this Fund shall consist of moneys raised within the bounds of our Conference, by collections and subscriptions on all the various Circuits and Missions, excepting the Indian and the French.

4. The general management of the Fund shall be entrusted to a Sustentation Fund Committee composed of one minister and one layman, elected by each annual District Meeting, and a ministerial secretary-treasurer elected by the Conference on the nomination of the Committee;

and this Committee shall transact the necessary business thereof at each annual Conference, in accordance with the following regulations:-

(a) With a view to raising the income needed, the Committee shall annually make a careful estimate of the prospective aggregate deficiencies on dependent fields, and suggest the amount desired from each District, in order to meet such deficiencies.

(b) In making grants from the Fund, the Committee shall have strict regard to the aforementioned "Scale of minimum allowances," and also to such actual "net deficiencies" of claimants as the Quarterly Boards respectively declare themselves unable to meet, and especially when the supplemental grants requested are likewise recommended by the District Meetings, and also any other necessitous cases recommended by the annual District Meeting.

(c) Should the income of the Fund in any year prove insufficient to meet the claims thereon, then the grants shall be so distributed as to make up the allowances of claimants to the same percentage according to the aforementioned "scale," but should there be a surplus over the claims, as per said "scale," it shall be carried forward, and included in the income of the year next following.

(d) A report shall be presented by the Committee to the Conference annually, while in session, including a summary of business transacted, an audited statement of receipts and disbursements, and any suggestions deemed necessary to the interests of the Fund, said report, as adopted by the Conference, to be published in the Minutes.

4. That no application from any Circuit or Mission be entertained by the Committee unless that Circuit or Mission has made the most earnest efforts to secure at least twenty cents per member.

In order to obtain greater support for this important Fund, the Financial District Meetings are requested to arrange for the holding of platform meetings, and the appointment of deputations to advocate the claims of the Fund on all the Circuits and Missions.

We recommend that most earnest efforts be put forth in every Circuit and Mission to raise at least twenty cents per member for the Fund.

That the Secretary-Treasurer, the Rev. Dr. Antliff, be reappointed for the coming year.

INTERIM REPORT OF THE UNION CHURCH RELIEF FUND.

In presenting the report of work done since the last General Conference, the Treasurer begs to say that the Committee appointed met soon after the rising of the General Conference, and after careful consideration of each case, decided to carry out the recommendations of the General Conference, and made the appropriations accordingly.

Many members of the Committee expressed great regret that no effort was to be made to raise any sum to reduce the obligations of the Fund, through the meetings to be held in March to celebrate the one-hundredth year of Methodism.

Your Treasurer also regrets to report that remittances have come in unusually slow, not so much from lack of loyalty to the Fund, as from neglect to take up and forward the collections on time. This necessitates the borrowing of money at high rates, in order to keep faith with claimants.

It is of the greatest importance that the ministers look after the interests of this Fund, promptly take up the collections as required by the Discipline, in October, and forward at once to the Treasurer. There are not probably one hundred Circuits in the whole Dominion where this cannot be done.

The amount paid into the Treasurer and to the Rev. James Gray (who has acted in his absence) was \$604.54 to the 15th May, 1891.

The foregoing is respectfully and loyally submitted, with the hope that the future may be brighter, and the collections larger.

MODE OF EXAMINATION FOR THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE.

Candidates for our Ministry and Probationers shall be examined by means of papers prepared by the respective Examiners.

There shall also be an oral examination if required.

In addition to the usual thorough Theological Examination of Candidates before the District Meeting, the Chairman shall examine each Can-

didate as to his studies and general reading for the year, with a view to giving advice as to his course and method of study. No Candidate shall be allowed the year of probation until the studies for that year are completed.

The examination of Candidates shall be held in each District, under the supervision of the Chairman, and the Examiners resident on the District, on the third Wednesday in April in each year, and at such place as the Chairman shall appoint. All papers shall be sent by the Examiners to the Chairman not later than the second Wednesday in April in each year. The answers to the papers shall be sent by the Chairman to the respective Examiners, who shall forward to the Secretary of the Board the valuation. The Secretary shall prepare the certificates, and forward them to the Chairman of the District, to be presented by him to the May District Meeting. The Secretary of the Board shall send the Chairman of each District the name of any Candidate or Probationer who may have taken part of the subjects in any given course, and the standing he has attained, but shall not issue the certificate in any year's course until the Candidate or Probationer has completed it; and further, the standard qualification for young men recommended to be received into our Conference as Probationers shall not be lower than fifty per cent. of the marks on the preliminary course of study in the aggregate, and thirtythree and one-third per cent. in each subject. Also a standing of thirtythree and one-third per cent. shall be required in order to pass in each subject of the subsequent course, and the Conference directs that existing regulations relating to the time and manner of examinations be imperatively observed, and more especially that it be deemed absolutely peremptory that the examinations be held on the same day throughout the whole Conference, and that all the young men in any District writing on any given subject write at the same hour. The maximum time for each paper shall be two hours. No supplementary examination shall be allowed between the regular time of examinations and the close of Conference. Each Examiner is expected to send at least one copy of each examination paper to the Chairmen of Districts.

REPORT OF CHURCH PROPERTY COMMITTEE.

The report of this Committee was presented by Rev. T. C. Brown, and recommends as follows:---

MONTREAL DISTRICT.

Point St. Charles.—That permission be granted the trustees of Point St. Charles church and parsonage properties to sell one or both properties, and apply the proceeds to the erection of a new church on the corner of Wellington and Chown Streets, Point St. Charles.

Dominion Square.—That permission be granted to the trustees of Craig Street Mission of the Dominion Square Methodist Church, Montreal, to sell their property, and apply the proceeds to purchase another property for Home Mission work in Montreal.

WATERLOO DISTRICT.

Cowansville.-The President of the Conference, Chairman of the Waterloo District, A. R. Oughtred, Esq., and G. E. Jacques, Esq., to be a committee to inquire into the matter of the Union Church at Farnham.

Waterloo.—That permission be granted to the trustees of the French Mission property in Waterloo to sell said property, and apply the proceeds to liquidate debt on the Roxton Pond Mission.

OTTAWA DISTRICT.

Ottawa. - The trustees of the Dominion Church, Ottawa, being also the trustees of the McLeod Street Church, Ottawa, have permission to sell the McLeod Street church property, with a view to conveying it to a new Board of Trustees.

North Wakefield .- That the trustees of the Methodist church in the village of North Wakefield, Quebec, be permitted to sell the church and

PERTH DISTRICT.

Pakenham.—That permission be granted the trustees of the parsonage property in Pakenham to transfer a part of their land to the trustees of the church in Pakenham, for a site for a new church.

Newboro'.—That the trustees of the Newboro' church be given permission to sell a part of the lot willed to the church by Mrs. Haskins, to assist in the erection of a new church.

Westport.—That the Trustees of the Bedford church be granted permission to sell their old church, and apply the proceeds to the erection of a new church.

QUEBEC DISTRICT.

Marbleton.—That the trustees of the Marbleton parsonage be permitted to sell the site of the old parsonage.

KINGSTON DISTRICT.

Kingston.—That the trustees of Wesley Church be allowed to sell the said church, and apply the proceeds to the liquidation of said church and parsonage belonging thereto.

Battersea.—That permission be granted the trustees of Sand Hill church property to sell the same for burial purposes, provided three members of the Trust Board be members of the Methodist Church, and whatever church shall be erected be used solely for mortuary purposes, and that such provision be explicitly made in the deed.

MATILDA DISTRICT.

Cornwall.—We recommend that the trustees of graveyard in Cornwall be permitted to sell the said graveyard.

REPORT OF THE FRENCH METHODIST INSTITUTE, MONTREAL.

ELEVENTH SESSION.

The year has been one of comfort and encouragement; these have preponderated, balanced somewhat by painful and discouraging circumstances.

The school being now more widely known, and having survived the unfavorable criticisms that are at once the annoyance and the stimulus of all new enterprises, has had in residence eighty-five students, forty-five male and forty female.

Of this number, fourteen were English, five part English, six Indian, and forty-seven French. Fifteen of these entered as Roman Catholics. The names of several of the latter will never again appear in the census as followers of His Holiness Leo XIII.

Our teaching staff has been more efficient and more spiritually minded than the previous year. Miss Masten, our very worthy lady teacher, has continued to develop the work whose organization was chiefly owing to her skill and judgment. Mr. Alfred E. Rivard, a graduate of the McGill Normal, has fully justified the recommendation of Dr. Robins, the Principal of that school, by at once ruling the pupils and helping

them to study. Mr. Rivard, who came to us a Congregationalist, is now aiding a former pupil of the Institute by doing work as a French Methodist Missionary in Connecticut. The other teachers have been Mr. Isaac Smith, employed previously in French mission work in the States; Miss Lulu M. Woodworth, of New York State; Miss Nettie E. McKee, gold medallist, of Whitby College, and Miss Sarah Ferns, each of whom have labored conscientiously and with success.

Some of the members of the Douglas Mission Band have again given lessons in drawing and sewing. Instruction in dressmaking has been given by Madame Léocadie Morin, a pupil of Rhode Island, who is being trained for a Bible-woman. With thirty-nine different classes, some of these subdivided, the staff of teachers is not deemed sufficient. This difficulty arises from the very wide difference in the attainments, or want of attainments, or the pupils on entrance, enhanced by the added labors of instruction in both languages.

The progress of the pupils has been very gratifying, as evinced in the daily routine, and in the Christmas and final examinations. Through the generosity of a few city friends, prizes were procured for those who had earned them.

With the exception of a share that the school had in a general epidemic of measles that visited the country in January, the health of the pupils has been good. Grateful acknowledgments are made to Drs. McConnel, Hutchinson and Armstrong, whose medical skill has been placed at the service of the Institute without fee.

The students' prayer-meeting and Literary Society have blessed and stimulated the young people, and a week's special services, when help was given by Presbyterian, Baptist and Salvation Army workers, resulted in about thirty students coming out on the Lords's side.

So we "thank God and take courage," and bespeak from our friends their continued and prayerful support.

He moved, seconded by Mr. Chisholm, that the President nominate a Committee, consisting of the Chairmen of the Districts and one layman from each District, to consider a plan for the relief of the College debt.

Moved by Rev. Wm. Hall, M.A., seconded by Wm. Tees, and Resolved,—That this Conference, deeply interested in true Christian education, learns with satisfaction of the turn in the tide of the affairs of the Wesleyan College at Stanstead, rejoices at the good work reported by the Rev. Principal McAmmond, M.A., and pledges itself to continue its sympathy and practical assistance.

Moved by Rev. Dr. Saunders, seconded by Judge Deacon, and Resolved,—That we believe the time has come to make a strong and united effort to liquidate the debt on Stanstead College, and the Committee suggests that a fair and just division of the debt be made among the several Districts, and that at the business meeting arrangements be made to raise the amount either by the respective parties or by local agents at a commission not to exceed ten per cent. we regard the following as a fair distribution of the amount required:—Montreal, \$3,000; Kingston, 1,500; Brockville, 2,000; Matilda, 1,500; Perth, 1,500; Pembroke, 1,000; Ottawa, 2,000; Quebec, 1,000; Stanstead, 1,000; Waterloo, 1,000; Huntingdon, 500; total, 16,000.

MISCELLANEOUS RESOLUTIONS.

OKA INDIANS.

Moved by Rev. S. E. Maudsley, seconded by Rev. George Porter and Dr. Alexander, and

Resolved,-That the Montreal Conference, having already declared its conviction and confidence that the Iroquois Indians have substantial rights in the Seigniory of the Lake of Two Mountains, and withal desirous of proceeding with caution, gave time to consider the terms offered by the Seminary of Montreal for its evacuation, and after three years' debate, the terms (embracing, as they did, the deportation of the Protestant Indians beyond the limits of the Seigniory, and the surrender for ever of all claims and rights they had therein) being refused, we, of necessity, are forced back to the conclusion arrived at, "that our Indians have substantial rights in the Lake Seigniory," and this, our verdict, being affirmed and corroborated by the declaration of the General Conference, that the lands claimed by the Indians were originally given in trust to the Seminary of St. Sulpice for the benefit of the Indians, we hail its appointment of a Committee on Indian Affairs as a means to gather up Methodist opinion and direct public sentiment to the consideration and help of our patient and oppressed brethren at Oka, and we pledge ourselves to co-operate with the Committee on their generous labor.

SYMPATHY WITH REV. S. G. PHILLIPS, M.A.

Moved by Rev. Wm. Rilance, seconded by Rev. Hugh Cairns, and Resolved,—That we extend to Rev. S. G. Phillips, M.A., and his family, who has been compelled to superannuate on account of personal affliction, our sympathy, and assure him of our prayers, that the grace of God may be granted, and that a speedy restoration may be afforded.

DISTRICT JOURNALS TO BE DEPOSITED IN LIBRARY OF WESLEYAN THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE, MONTREAL.

It was Resolved,—That the following resolution, passed at a former Conference session, be retained in the printed Minutes as a standing resolution: "That the Librarian of the Wesleyan Theological College be requested to take the custody of completed District Journals and other Church documents of valuable historical interest, to be deposited in the Library of said Institution, and to be accessible at all times to members of this Conference."

BILLETING.

CAMP-MEETINGS.

A Special Committee on Camp-meetings, consisting of twenty-five members, was ordered to be appointed by the chair.

CONFERENCE ANNIVERSARIES.

CLOSE OF CONFERENCE,

The Minutes were read and confirmed, a hymn was sung, the benediction pronounced by the President, and the eighth Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church was closed at midnight, June 9th, 1891.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

To the Members of the Methodist Church within the bounds of the Montreal Conference:--

Dearly Beloved Brethren,—From the beautiful town of Brockville, on the banks of the majestic St. Lawrence, where, in earlier days, camp-fires glowed and councils of war were held, we, assembled in our Annual Conference, send you words of peace and loving admonition. The associations in which we are met remind us that we as a Church represent a part of the Lord's embattled host wrestling "not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spirits of wickedness in high places."

As your ministers, called by the Spirit of God to marshal the army of Jehovah, we recognize the grave responsibility resting upon us, and earnestly pray that to us may be imparted the wisdom that God gives abundantly, and grace to help according to our need. We desire to record with grateful appreciation your inspiring trust in us, and loving loyalty to Him "whose we are, and whom we serve" How sweet to us has been your fellowship in the Gospel during another year; how zealous your able co-operation in every laudable enterprise; how noble your self-sacrificing love for God and humanity. "We give thanks to God always for you all, making mention of you in our prayers; remembering without ceasing your work of faith, and labor of love, and patience of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ in the sight of God and our Father; knowing, brethren beloved, your election of God."

As we briefly recount the mercies of the past year, the manifest goodness of God demands our loving gratitude. Even as we sadly and tenderly speak of those who have fallen by the way and entered into rest -of those whose translation "into the choir invisible" has left pathetic vacancies in pulpits and pews—we find cause for exultation. "And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any pluck them out of My hand " said the Master. Hence to the children of

faith

"There is no Death! what seems so is transition! This life of mortal breath Is but a suburb of the life elysian Whose portal we call Death.'

And so our hope is bright while our hearts may be sad thinking of our righteous dead. Our grateful remembrance is of their "overcoming." Still the necrology of the Montreal Conference echoes the testimony of oldtime Methodism-"Our people die well!" and

> "We know we shall behold them raised complete The dust swept from their beauty.glorified; New memories singing in the great God light."

We recall with pleasure and praise the fact that the past year has been rendered of special importance by the commemoration services in connection with the centennial of Canadian Methodism. From the lofty vantage ground of a century's apex we have been reviewing the rise and progress of our Church, with intense interest and profit. How wonderfully God has led and blessed the people called "Methodists." Truly "the little one has become a thousand, and the small one a great nation." May we not expect as a direct result of these anniversary services, that there will come to us a mighty renewing of the principles and methods which, while we grasp with broader and deeper conception our mission's truest ideal, which, in the future as it has been in the years gone by, must ever be to spread scriptural holiness throughout the world.

The year has been still further marked by the meeting of the General Conference, last September, in the commercial metropolis of the Dominion. When we addressed you last year in our pastoral letter, we especially bespoke your prayers on behalf of this important gathering—that through it the glory of God and the best interests of the Church might be promoted. With some were grave fears lest the anticipated discussion of questions which had been engaging the attention of all throughout the Quadrennium might imperil the general peace and harmony of the body. It is with pleasure we remind you of the progress made by the Church during the four years in question, and with devout thanksgiving we record the brotherly love which prevailed throughout the entire session at Montreal.

But we thank the Great Head of the Church that it is not necessary to weigh the results of a century or a quadrennium in order to discover the progress made by Methodism. The returns of the past year are before, us and are most encouraging. The Connexional Funds have been well sustained, and for the most part are in advance of last year. Our educational institutions have been well patronized, and have accomplished most satisfactory work. In the Wesleyan Theological College we take great satisfaction, impressed as we are, with the gracious influence it exerts upon the intellectual and spiritual life of the students. Our college at Stanstead is in a prosperous condition, and is able to give firstclass educational advantages to the youth of both sexes. We are gratified to know that a scheme has been adopted by the trustees of the institution by which its financial interests will be put into an improved condition. The Sabbath schools and work among the young have engaged the earnest attention of many of the most consecrated members of our Church and the reports are most gratifying. Best of all, the work of saving men from sin and death has gone on prosperously, and we are able to inform you that the increase in the membership of the Church for this year in the Montreal Conference alone numbers eleven hundred and

For all this we thank God and take courage; but while rejoicing in being able to report prosperity and a bright outlook for the year upon which we have entered, we would hasten to remind you that these things should only incite to greater diligence and loftier aspirations.

Not yet is the time of jubilation, but of thanksgiving and work-

"Now the sowing and the weeping,
Working hard and waiting long;
Afterward the golden reaping,
Harvest-home and grateful song."

The times in which we are living afford opport unity for the exercise of every talent in the Church. The Spirit of God is calling upon us to go up and possess the land, and we are well able. So that the prosperity we record with gratitude should only generate an increased momentum of spiritual force, in which should lie the assurance of greater achievements in the coming days. "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord; forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord."

In wishing you Godspeed in life and work for this year, suffer us to commend specially to your devout consideration certain interests of our Church, a prayerful and untiring regard for which will greatly enhance the probabilities of success.

We must ever bear in mind the importance of keeping constantly and clearly in view the true object of our existence and efforts—not the multiplication of stately church edifices, not the maintenance of an imposing ritual, not the enunciation and enforcement of a respectable morality, but always and supremely to spread scriptural holiness throughout the land. From this ideal our aspirations must not for a moment be deflected—short of its full and constant realization our efforts must not stop. We call you to witness that in the past our spiritual prosperity has ever been commensurate with our clear perception of this mission as specially committed to us. Let us, then, be true to our sacred trust; let our excelsion cry be, as we climb the heights of this great endeavor, "Holiness unto the Lord," remembering not only to keep the doctrine of a full and free salvation prominent in our theology, but, above all, to have it crystallized in our hearts and lives.

It is pleasing to call attention to the increasing prosperity of the temperance movement, and to the enthusiasm with which the battle against this mighty evil is being pushed to the gates. Our attitude against this, the greatest foe of our Church and most hateful curse of humanity, needs not to be defined nor defended. Against it we have sworn eternal hatred, and "Prohibition" is our cry. The battle is the Lord's, and the Methodist Church marches in the van of the rapidly multiplying hosts contending for God, and home, and native land. Let us fully understand that this struggle is to the death. In this instance the lion and the lamb can never lie down together. From the eyes of this monster evil flashes a menace against every interest we defend, while against every word of the Church it breathes out slaughter. We should seek fully to understand this, that our hearts might be stirred to gigantic and uncompromising The battle is the Lord's, and hence the Church's. On this fact we lay special emphasis. While recognizing the good work done by all temperance organizations, and while in kindest sympathy speeding them with the breath of our earnest prayer, we would remind you that our Church is a temperance organization, upon which rests the obligation, and with which, from its very nature, is the capacity for doing above all others the most effective temperance work. Every member should, therefore, consider himself sacredly committed to this work, and by precept and example, as well as by the righteous exercise of the franchise, endeavor to promote its prosperity.

In bespeaking your continued interest in the missionary work of our Church, we would call your attention to the growing enterprise and zeal with which this department of our work is being prosecuted. This is apparent not only in the glowing reports of prosperity which come to us from different mission fields, but it receives special emphasis from the fact that this year we are opening a new field in distant China. This, with the dear brethren who go to occupy it, we lay upon your sympathy and prayers. We also bring to your notice the remarkable movement which is transpiring in the College circles of this continent—the great student missionary enterprise, in which six thousand young people of both sexes are devoting themselves to missionary labors, and holding themselves ready to go to any part of the world to which they may be ordered by the Church. This is one of the startling developments of the age, and has a deep and important significance. The fact that so many ardent young souls—the very flower of Christian chivalry—are kneeling at the Church's altar to-day, and demanding to be sent forth to labor for Christ and men, presents to us a problem the solution of which demands our wisest and most prayerful consideration. God never calls men and women to high and holy enterprises until He wants them, and the Church has power to send them forth. Can it be that this large band of devoted youths, who have heard God's voice bidding them "Go forth into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature," while doors of opportunity swing open wide on every side, is in danger of becoming a standing reproach to the Christianity of our day and country? If there be not a prompt and hearty response to this demand for co-operation on the part of the Church, our failure under the circumstances must at least suggest the presumption, that with fields in view white unto harvest, and after praying for many years that laborers might be sent forth to the reaping, we are found reluctant to come up to the help of the Lord, and unwilling in the day of His power.

But, brethren, we are persuaded better things of you and confidently expect you, through the constraining love of Christ, to be in will and act as great as the opportunity which is upon us. While an adequate response to these demands will entail but little self-denial upon some of you, we do not forget that it will cost others severe sacrifices. But in this we only emulate the example of our Divine Lord, "Who, though He was rich, yet for our sake became poor, that we, through His poverty, might be made rich;" and we would remind you that the real essence of Christianity lies in denying ourselves, taking up the cross and following We must not forget that to this Montreal Conference is committed both by God and the Church authorities the evangelization of our French fellow-citizens. In the growing spirit of unrest and dissatisfaction of this people with their religious environment, and in the increase of independence of thought among them we mark prophetic indications which are encouraging. The French Methodist Institute, at Montreal, is doing a noble work, having adopted a policy which, in the Roman Catholic Church, has been demonstrated a fruitful source of gain-the

education of children of tender years, who are faithfully trained in the principles of revelation.

Respecting no department of our work can we speak more hopefully than of the enterprises which are being undertaken in the interest of the young. During the past year much has been accomplished through the instrumentality of the Sabbath-schools, and the reports are most gratifying. We desire to record our high appreciation of the effective labors of the devoted men and women who have, in noble consecration, given themselves especially to this work. We earnestly request that in their work of faith and labor of love they may have the hearty sympathy and co-operation of all the members of the various congregations. To all Sabbath-school superintendents, teachers and parents we would urge the propriety of giving the children and young people of our Church a thorough training in our Catechism; we strongly advise this not only because we desire that they should become versed in the theology of our Church, but especially because we are convinced that in no other way can they be so well instructed in the plan of salvation, and fitted for the defence of the faith. And now brethren, in conclusion, "we commend you to God, and the Word of His grace which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among all them which are sanctified." "For God is our witness how we long after you all in the tender mercies of Jesus Christ, and this we pray, that your love may abound yet more and more in knowledge and all discernment, so that ye may approve the things that are excellent; that ye may be sincere and void of offence unto the day of Christ;" being filled with the fruits of righteousness which are through Jesus Christ unto the glory and praise of God."
