Your Committee, to whom was entrusted, at the Annual Session, in Hamilton, the duty of revising the Constitution and By-laws of the Order in Canada, beg to report that, though they have made considerable progress in the work assigned them, owing to personal and family illness on the part of some of the members of the committee, they have been unable fully to complete their work, and would, therefore, ask that they be permitted to defer bringing in, a full report until the next Annual Session of G. T. Your Committee make this request the more freely, believing as they do, that as the Constitution now reads, no definite action can be had by the G. T., towards ratifying changes in the Constitution at a semi-annual session. They would, however, recommend that any further changes desired by Members than those submitted at the Annual Session in Hamilton, should be handed in at the present Session, and receive its sanction to be placed in hand of Committee.

SEMI-ANNUAL REPORT OF THE GRAND WORTHY
CHIEF TEMPLAR.

GUELPH, APRIL 2ND, 1861.

OFFICERS AND REPRESENTATIVES:

Again, through the Infinite mercy of our Heavenly Father, we are permitted to meet in our Legislative Halls, to talk of those things that concern our noble Order, and to interchange kindly feelings of friendship and regard. May this session prove a most profitable one. Though the Constitution does not require a Report from your Chief Officer at the half yearly session, and such a report has never been presented, I have deemed it prudent, for two considerations, to present you with one—First, in order that the fraternity, in general, may become acquainted with all the official acts of their chief officer, during the interim, which, in the absence of such a report, they would know nothing of until the annual session, at which time custom requires him to report; and Secondly, to correct some mis-statements in reference to our Order, which have been industriously circulated during the past six months, and on which I have had no small amount of correspondence.

Previous, however, to referring to these two considerations, I will lay before you the general state of the Order.

It affords me profound satisfaction again to be able to report our Order in a most prosperous condition. Our march is still onward, as the report of the G. W. S. will bear testimony. God has been graciously pleased to continue his blessings upon the efforts put forth to extend the principles of our noble Order, inclining the minds of the benevolent and the good

to still greater exertions, to remove the evil against which it is the peculiar object of our Order to wage war.

The reports of Deputies are most encouraging, and as a sign of the interest being manifested in the workings of our institution, I would remark, that more deputies have attended to this part of their duty since last session, than on any previous occasion. Our new deputies, especially, have attended to this matter. The only complaint I have had from any, was our inability to send efficient lecturers through the different portions of the country, to address public meetings and present the claims of our order.

In accordance with the recommendation of the Committee on the state of the Order, at our last session, we made another effort to introduce our Order into Eastern Canada, and this time, through the exertions of Brother William Hay, one of our new Deputies, we have succeeded in planting our standard there. Letters of enquiry, in reference to the workings of our Order, have been received from different parts of that section of the Province; and, could some of the many efficient lecturers we have among us be induced to turn their attention in that direction, I am persuaded that a large number of Temples could be instituted in a short time. Our Order needs only to be presented in order to command the support and sympathy of all lovers of temperance and the race. It is peculiarly adapted to the wants of the people, better, perhaps, than any other similar organization. It possesses one most important feature, that the Sons of Temperance, that veteran organization, has not, and which they feel the need of, viz:—the admission of females to full membership, sharing alike in offices and honours with the male members; and could the G. T. send out even one efficient public speaker, one thoroughly acquainted with our Order from its first institution to the present time, we might have a Temple in every neighborhood in both East and West Canada. I am persuaded of the correctness of this assertion, from the success attending my own feeble efforts. I have not failed in one solitary instance, where I have endeavored to present the claims of our Order, even amid strenuous opposition, to institute a Temple. Since last session, we have had an increase of fifty new Temples, and in several Counties where interest was being lost, new life has been instilled into our members, and they have gone to work with renewed energy. The exact number of members in connection with our Order I am not prepared to state, but refer you to the report of the G. W. S., which I am persuaded will show an increase.

Our Temples too, are taking a lively interest in the instituting of Bands of Hope. This is a move in the right direction, and now that we have a suitable Ritual for such organizations, furnished free of cost, I trust that no Temple will omit to form one of these Juvenile Temperance Societies. It is to the youth of our country that we must look to battle for the right, when we have been gathered unto our fathers. If, then, we train them up to love and practice temperance, we need not fear for their future, in reference to the evil we are contending against. I come

port.

And first I beg to lay before you the following instructions issued since
last session :

1st. That a degree member ordering his name erased from the books
of his Templè, thus dissolving his connection with our Order, forfeits all
honours previously attained, and must, on again being initiated, retake
the degrees before he can be entitled to the privileges of the Degree
Temple, or be eligible to the office of W. C. T.

2nd. That no officer, either Grand or Subordinate, has the power to
grant a dispensation to confer the degrees on any party under the age
prescribed by the Constitution.

3rd. That a W. C. T. has the power, as the Constitution now stands,
of voting at the election of officers the same as any other member.

4th. That when a member accused of any offence against our laws is
present, and demands an immediate trial, and the Temple consents there-
to, the case must be proceeded with, even though the accuser object
thereto, and states he is not ready.

5th. That a Prov. Deputy has not the power to instal the officers of a
Temple already in existence, but may do so in the absence of the County
Deputy, and the Degree Templar, when so requested by the Temple.

6th. That a party advertising liquors in a paper under his sole control,
cannot become a member of this order; and a member of our order so
doing is liable to a charge.

7th. That a Temple cannot, without violating the spirit of the Consti-
tution, remit the dues of a member, or grant a clearance card, until all
arrears are actually paid.

8th. That when a charge is preferred against a Temple it places them
in the same position that an individual member would be under similar
circumstances, viz :—In a state of suspension, and this applies to all the
members thereof; consequently they are debarred the privilege of visiting
sister temples while that charge is pending.

9th. Reiterated the decision of the G. W. C. T. VanNorman, given at
the London Session, "That a Temple cannot change its chartered loca-
tion without a dispensation, and added thereto, that such dispensation
must come from the G. W. C. T.

10th. That a Temple forfeits its charter by striking out of the Pledge,
the word "Cider."

11th. That a Temple violates the Constitution by "excusing a member from all blame," who has violated his or her pledge, without inflicting some penalty, and is liable to a charge.

12th. That a member of our order who is in the habit of playing Billiards, or engaging in any other game of chance, where any thing is at stake, is liable to expulsion.

13th. That a member of our order renting a building for a tavern stand or liquor store violates his obligation.

14th. Two Temples, A and B, are located within three miles of each other; a party is proposed in Temple A, and is rejected. He goes to Temple B, and is proposed, but before the ballot is taken he is proposed, under dispensation, in Temple A, and again rejected. The deputy cognizant of this fact, sanctions his election subsequently in Temple B. Given as my decision that the deputy acted indiscreetly and violated the spirit of the Constitution.

15th. Two Temples, A and B, located in the same town, a party being in arrears in Temple A, applies for membership in Temple B, and is initiated, Temple B, knowing the facts in the case. Decided that Temple B, acted illegally in thus receiving said party, and that the second initiation is null and void, and the party liable to a charge in Temple A.

16th. That a member having been suspended or expelled from his or her Temple and appealing to the G. T. is not entitled to a seat in the subordinate temple until the action is reversed by the G. T.

17th. Two questions are asked:—First—which is binding on the Order here, the decisions in Chase's Digest or those of our G. W. C. T., when they conflict with each other. Second—which is binding on the order here, the decisions of the R. W. G. Templar, or those of our G. W. C. T., when they conflict with each other? Both these questions involve the same principle, and have received the same reply as follows: First—the decisions of our G. W. C. Templar. The "Digest" is, or should be, merely a collection of the laws passed by the different Grand Lodges, and only shows the opinions held by those bodies in different localities. Second—Same as above, though the case is hardly a supposable one. The R. W. G. Templar has no authority to give decisions on points of law, touching subordinate temples in localities where Grand Temples exist, and has never, to my knowledge, attempted to do so. He is only addressed through Grand Temples, and his decisions when not given in answer to questions coming from such bodies, are only binding on subordinate Temples, immediately under the jurisdiction of the R. W. G. Lodge.

18th. The following question has come to me from half-a-dozen different quarters:—"Can we receive as members coloured persons; and will the G. T. grant a charter to such parties, report stating the contrary?"

The following is my reply:—We receive into our order all who are willing to subscribe to our laws, irrespective of their colour. It is sufficient for us to know that they have a Soul to save from the blighting effects of intemperance, in order to throw open our doors to them; and if application should be made for a Charter to open a temple by such parties, it would be granted.

The foregoing comprise the instructions issued by your G. W. C. T. since last session. The correspondence of your chief officer has been somewhat extensive, involving no small amount of time, yet generally of a pleasing nature, and I trust has resulted in good.

A number of letters have been received by me, making inquiries in reference to certain statements made touching the report of the G. W. S. at last session, and the apparent decrease in the membership of our order. In order to give satisfaction on that head, I now refer to the second consideration for presenting a semi-annual report:

An attempt has been made to make it appear that our order was on the decrease, and that we had in one year lost 100 temples and 3,362 members. That such has not been the case, any one who will take the trouble honestly to investigate the subject, will not fail to see. True, the G. W. S. reports a certain number of temples as having forfeited their charters, and a less number of members than was reported by the G. W. S. Fergusson, at Bowmanville; but then, it must be borne in mind, that the last report contained only those members who had paid up their dues to the time when the report was made, while the former included all whose names appeared on the books of the different Temples, as shown by their last return, though some of them had not made return for several quarters. As to the number of Temples reported as having forfeited their charters, a large proportion of them had ceased to hold their regular meetings, and should have been reported as non-working temples; more than three years ago; in fact, some of them were thus reported, as may be seen by reference to our minutes. Thus I find 69 temples reported as not in working order in November 1857; 32 in April 1858; and 35 in October, 1858, since which time the system of thus marking has not been printed until last session. Did space permit, I could give the names of the different temples thus referred to, and show that many of them ceased to exist, or to hold their regular meetings, long prior to the London session. Some of them ceased to work a year before they were reported to the Grand Temple, and hence the G. W. S. could not report them as having forfeited their charters. That the apparent decrease is chargeable to the last year, or last year and a-half, is not correct, and even if it was so, it is no argument against the solidity of our order. For to expect all who unite with us to remain firm and steadfast, is expecting too much from frail human nature. There are times that try men's souls, and all human institutions must of necessity undergo a certain ordeal, to test their principles. In such times as these it often happens that they are shaken to their very foundation, and it is no strange thing to find a falling off; it would be strange indeed, were it not so. But then the ques-

tion should be: how has the institution itself withstood the shock? All benevolent and Christian institutions have been thus tried, and have come out brighter and more pure. So with our Order, many have proved unfaithful to their trust, have become dissatisfied; their ambition has been disappointed, and they have thrown off their armour, but the only effect it has had on our institution has been to stimulate us to greater exertions on behalf of our principles, and the result is we now stand brighter and firmer than on any previous occasion. At the last session I reported that the G. T. was destitute of property to carry on the work on Dr. VanNorman's induction to the office of G. W. Secretary.

Exception has been taken to this statement, and parties have endeavoured to show that the assertion was not true, but that, on the contrary, we had property to the amount of \$2,063; our only difficulty being our lack of funds to furnish a supply of Constitutions. That any honest man could be misled by such a statement as this astonishes me. A second thought would convince the greatest opponent of our order, that a matter of so trifling a nature as the printing of "a few" Constitutions would not be any great draw back to the G. W. S. and G. W. C. T.; and if that was all the difficulty, those two officers would not allow the order to be placed in difficulty for a month.

The amount of property reported on hand, by Dr. VanNorman, at last session, was all furnished between the Bowmanville session where he was elected and the session in Hamilton in October, that is, during the six months immediately preceeding the time at which the report was made, as a reference to the minutes of past sessions will plainly show. Another mistatement to which I purposed referring is, in reference to the system of voting pursued in our G. T., but, as the Committee on the Constitution have that matter under their consideration, I will only remark that the system pursued by us is a just and legitimate one, founded on the principle of "Representation according to population." The regular representative of a subordinate Temple casts all the votes which said temple is entitled to, according to their numbers, when he is present in Grand Temple. But, to provide for his non-attendance, each Temple is entitled to elect a proxy, who is entitled to a seat in the G. T., but only votes when the regular representative is absent. If both are present both cannot vote, so that the assertion that the proxy "also has a vote," is not correct. It is also pleasing to see Br. Tolmie in his place at this session, which proves that the assertion that he *had* left the order is also incorrect.

Other mistatements have been made, but these are the main ones and have received sufficient attention. Brothers and Sisters: to conclude, let me entreat you not to rest satisfied with what has been done, but let the success that has attended your labors during the past, stimulate you to still greater exertions in behalf of our noble order. Great battles have yet to be fought for the right; the enemy is still abroad in our land, and our fellow men still groan under the galling chains of intemperance.—Be up then and doing! Stir up the lukewarm in your immediate neighborhood, resuscitate the Temples, if any, that may have gone down in

To this end I would strongly urge on you the necessity of holding public temperance meetings as often as once a month, not as good templars but as temperance people, and enlist the co-operation of the ministers of the different denominations in your locality, and circulate the total abstinence pledge. In addition to this, I would urge you to support Temperance publications, circulate temperance tracts and books, to the extent of your ability. The following temperance publications are especially worthy the support of every temperance man and woman, viz:—The "Canada Temperance Advocate," published semi-monthly at 50 cents per year, and the "Life Boat," published weekly at 37½ cents per year; both strong advocates of the principles we battle for. I am also pleased to be able to inform you that by the middle of the present month another temperance journal will be added to the list; and as it will be particularly devoted to the interests of our order, I bespeak for it your warmest support. The "Temperance Illustrated Eclectic Journal," the name of the new paper, will be issued semi-monthly, each number containing sixteen pages, at One Dollar per year. A specimen copy will be sent to each Temple of our order, and I trust they will examine it carefully, and if its literary character recommends it, then subscribe at once. I would not thus refer to any new effort in this line were I not satisfied of the honourable intention of Messrs Roper and Creasy the proprietors of the new Journal.

One other matter and I conclude. At the last session Toronto was chosen as the place to hold the Annual Session of this Body, but, by that choice, an established rule of the Grand Temple has been violated. By resolution of the G. T., the Annual Session should be held alternately East and West of Toronto. My attention has been called to this several times during the interim, and I now call your attention to the matter and trust you will correct the mistake, which you now have the power to do.

Finally, I would call the attention of the G. T. and of the members of our order in general, to the propriety of active steps being taken in the way of petitioning Parliament on the question of a Prohibitory Law. Let the agitation be kept up, and not one session of the Legislature be allowed to pass without our voice being heard on this subject. It is a subject of regret that temperance men forget altogether this question, at times when an election for members of Parliament takes place, and vote on the side of whisky. This should not be. We should be consistent and stand by our principles, and until we wake up to our real duty in this matter we cannot expect to see our land free.

May the great Architect of the Universe guide us aright in this matter, and make us true to our obligations.

REPORT OF THE SPECIAL FINANCE COMMITTEE.

To the Grand Worthy Chief Templar and Officers of the Grand Temple.

Your special committee appointed to report on the action taken by your committee appointed at the last annual session of this Grand Temple, held at the City of Hamilton, to examine the books of the G. W. S., and to report thereon, beg leave to report as follows :

HAMILTON, 29TH OCTOBER, 1861:

The committee appointed to examine the books of G. W. S. met at the house of Dr. VanNorman, 10 o'clock, a. m.

After examining the books to a sufficient extent to satisfy ourselves of their condition, and the manner in which they have been kept by the past G. W. Secretary—it was unanimously resolved,

1st. That we approve the diligence and labor of G. W. S. VanNorman, in bringing forward the unfinished work in the books of his office.

2nd. That he be requested to note discrepancies, and, as far as practicable adjust the accounts with the Temples, &c.

3rd. That we find it necessary for new books (Cash Book, Day Book, and Ledger,) to be procured, and that he be instructed to procure the same, and transfer the proper balances of accounts from the old to the new, with as little delay as possible.

4th. That we deem it necessary for five general accounts to be opened in the Ledger, namely: Merchandize, Cash, Printing, Grand Worthy Treasurer's, and Grand Worthy Secretary's.

5th. That the accounts of all Temples not having made any returns during the past year, be not brought forward.

6th. That a balance sheet be struck in the old Ledger, and that immediately before the semi-annual session (say 31st March, 1861.) another balance sheet be struck in the new.

7th. That copies of the foregoing resolutions be handed to the G. W. Secretary at once.

8th. That we adjourn to meet at 9 o'clock a. m. on the morning of the first day of semi-annual session at Guelph, C. W.

9th. That your committee met pursuant to adjournment and report that their suggestion or recommendation given the G. W. S. have not been carried out with the exception of procuring the new books.

10th. That your committee find in consequence of these instructions failing to be complied with, the same ambiguity in reference to the financial affairs of the Order previously complained of are continued in the system followed in the construction of the Books of the G. W. S.

11th. Your committee would further report that they deeply regret the absolute necessity which the responsibility of the duties devolving upon them, renders it obligatory on them to report on this matter in a manner which may be liable to an interpretation that your committee intend to convey an idea, that the G. W. S's. neglecting to comply with the instructions tendered to him by the Special Committee in reference to the keeping of the accounts of the G. T., implied an intention on his part to render the accounts of the G. T. unintelligible to any person but himself. But your committee do not wish to be understood that they have discovered anything beyond what may be fairly attributed to clerical errors, the commission of which involved no corrupt intention; while they recommend in the strongest terms, that the G. S. do and shall, in future, construct his books in accordance with the instructions given by the S. Com. appointed by your G. T.

12th. That your committee recommend that the G. REPORT OF STANDING COMMITTEE ON FINANCE.

To the G. W. Chief, Officers and Members of the Grand Temple:

Your committee on finance beg leave to submit their first report.

Your committee regret their inability to submit as detailed a report of the financial state of our Order, as they would wish to have done. Our inability is produced by the following cause, that your G. W. Secretary not being required, per Constitution, to submit a detailed report at the semi-annual session of this G. T., neglected to do so, on account of which the report was not as full as it would have been; and also the necessary material was not at hand to make out our report as we would have done.

Next, your committee cannot understand several of the principal accounts opened in the Grand Secretary's books; still there is every probability that those accounts are susceptible of explanation, which your

committee leave to the judgment of your temple, in regard to the satisfactory character of those explanations or system of book-keeping so destitute of the means to enable your finance committee to lay before the Grand Temple a satisfactory detailed statement of its financial affairs.

In the next place, your committee, in reference to the report of the Grand Secretary regarding the number of Temples in good working order, are of opinion that the number, 358, is incorrect, as the number of Temples in good working order in the previous report was 358, the same as reported now, while 50 new Temples have been added and 4 others have been resuscitated, and only 31 forfeited and surrendered Charters; therefore the number of good working Temples which ought to be in the present report should be 381 instead of 358.

Finally, in justice to your Grand Secretary, your committee say that he informed your committee that he did not think he was called upon, in duty, to submit a detailed report at this semi-annual session; nevertheless your committee are of opinion that he ought, according to usual practice, to have done so; and to avoid the recurrence of a similar difficulty, your committee do hereby recommend that the Grand Secretary should be called upon to submit to the executive committee a full and detailed statement of the several accounts referred to—cash and all other property of this Grand Temple at as early a day as possible; and if it is deemed necessary by the executive committee to have the same printed in circular form to be supplied to each Temple or perhaps embodied in the minutes of this session before they are published.
