PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

SIXTH ANNIVERSARY MEETING

OF THE MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF THE WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH OF
EASTERN BRITISH AMERICA, AUXILIARY TO THE WESLEYAN
METHODIST MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF GREAT BRITAIN.

HELD AT HALIFAX, N. S., ON THE 25TH JUNE, 1862.

I. The Rev. C. DEWOLFE, D. D., occupied the chair. The service commenced with singing and prayer.

II. The Report was read by the Rev. C. STEWART.

III. The following resolutions were then submitted to the Meeting, and unanimously adopted:—

1. Moved by the Rev. C. LOCKHART, seconded by the Rev. J. CASSIDY, and supported by the Rev. D. D. CURRIE:

That the Report which has just been read be adopted and printed: and that this Meeting rejoices to find that the Wesleyan Missionary Society continues to be so cheerfully supported by its friends, and, with other similar institutions, so greatly honoured by God, in enlarging "the Kingdom of His dear Son."

2. Moved by the Rev. J. JORDAN, and seconded by the Rev. JOSEPH HART:

That this Meeting, acknowledging the Gospel of Christ to be the only remedy for human sin and misery, and believing that it is the exclusive prerogative of the Holy Spirit to render that Gospel effectual to the salvation of men, therefore resolves to practice and recommend more importunate and persevering prayer for the promised outpouring of the Holy Ghost, and the conversion of the whole world.

3. Moved by the Rev. T. HARRIS, and seconded by the Rev. A. W. NICHOLSON:

That, in view of the recent commotions in Heathen lands—particularly India and China; the progress of discovery in Africa; the waning of Mohammedan power in Turkey; and the political changes in Russia, Italy, and America—this Meeting recognizes the hand of Divine Providence, as opening up the way for the proclamation of the Truth as it is in Jesus to every creature, and the increasing responsibility of all Christians to enlarged liberality in furnishing the means for accomplishing that purpose.

4. Moved by Rev. JOHN McMURRAY, and seconded by the Rev. JOHN SNOWBALL.

That the Committee for the ensuing year shall consist, in addition to the PRESIDENT, the Co-DELEGATE, and SECRETARY of Conference, and the Chairmen of the respective Districts, of

REPORT.

ALL those who are engaged in the extension of the Christian religion, whether directly, by evangelistic effort, or indirectly, by the aid of their sympathies, their prayers, and their contributions, are doing a great work; and they may rest assured that their labors shall not be in vain in the Lord. In due time they shall reap, if they faint not. But, while it is left for eternity to reveal the full value of such sacrifices and exertions as are made in this cause,—when they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament, and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever,—yet it is cheering to find, in the present life, that their instrumentality is honoured with success, and that the pleasure of the Lord is prospered in their hands.

Such are the happy circumstances under which the Annual Report of the Wesleyan Missionary Society is again presented to the contributors to its funds. The past year has been one of great perplexity and distress among all Christian nations; and in these evils the inhabitants of Great Britain and her Colonies have largely participated. There is good evidence, however, that the work of God has been steadily advancing in the world. The cause of Protestant Missions has generally been well sustained; and it is gratifying to find that the receipts of the Wesleyan Society have nearly equalled the large amount raised during the previous year. At the recent Anniversary in London it was stated that the income for the last year was £137,280 0s 7d., or \$686,400.13—of which sum \$178,335.02, or rather more than a fourth of the whole, were contributed in the Colonies, and on Mission Stations.

The total expenditure for the same period amounted to \$694,056.02, leaving a balance due to the General Treasurers of \$7,655.88.

The following summary will afford some idea of the agencies and operations of this Society:

To which must be added the sum of \$39.00, which, though included in the lists of last year, did not appear in the balance sheet, making a total of \$11,378.10; but showing a deficiency as compared with last year of 974.70.

The following extracts from the Parent Society's Report, will doubtless be perused with interest:

EUROPE.

GERMANY.—The steady progress of the work in all departments has rendered the employment of another Minister necessary, and one has, accordingly, been sent during the year. The number of members exhibits an increase of 113, with 137 on trial.

SPAIN.—Mr. Alton, after visiting Madrid and Gibraltar, has paid two visits to Cadiz, where he has discerned some remaining fruit of the Society's former labors, and is encouraged to attempt additional efforts for the benefit of countrymen and others. His plans are not as yet completely formed:

and, if they were, it might not be proper to publish them while the Spanish Government continues to display that spirit of intolerance which has characterized it during the year—the latest instance of which has attracted the attention of our Parliament and Government.

GIBRALTAR.—The Spanish department shows a large increase in the number of scholars, which—considering that they are all the children of Romanists, and that all are taught the Holy Scriptures and the Catechism—is an encouraging circumstance. In the English department the numbers, both of members and scholars, have been affected by the removals which necessarily occur on all military stations; but the congregations continue good, and the deportment of the members is generally consistent.

ITALY.—Mr. Piggott, in company with Mr. Green, who came to England on a visit, proceeded to his station as soon as practicable after the last Conference; and both have since been employed in exploratory tours. Bologna, Modena, Florence, Milan, Rome, Naples, and other places, have been visited, various enquiries carried on, and conversations held, with a view to promote the general object, in which they have met with much that may be regarded as highly encouraging. A “great door and effectual” is, undoubtedly, open; and were a considerable number of men, pious, intelligent, and well grounded in Theology, now to enter it, they might be the means of conferring incalculable benefits both upon the present generation, and upon the future inhabitants of that great country.

CEYLON AND CONTINENTAL INDIA.

CEYLON.—The returns show an increase of 75 members, with 477 on trial. The increase in the number of schools is 10, and of scholars 329. A new Station is recommended for occupation, in which the people earnestly desire to have Christian ordinances established; and have given proof of their sincerity by offering to erect suitable chapels at their own expense.

From the **TAMIL DISTRICT** an increase of 35 members is reported, along with earnest applications for increased help, rendered necessary by the increased growth of the work. Sixteen adult baptisms are also reported, and one recantation of Romanism. Five of the newly baptized are former pupils of Mission Schools—a fact which has afforded just ground for encouragement to those engaged in this department of labor.

MADRAS DISTRICT.—In this District there is a small increase in the number of members of Society, and eighteen are reported as on trial for membership. Two native candidates for the ministry are recommended, one, the

son of a former native preacher, now deceased; the other a convert, who has been trained in our schools. There has been a steady progress in every branch of the school department during the year; the net increase of pupils being three hundred and forty-nine.

MYSORE DISTRICT.—Two valuable members of the Mission have, during the year, been removed by death—Mr. Samuel Cocking, a promising young minister, and the beloved wife of Mr. Sykes.

The numerical returns show an increase of 19 members, with 22 on trial; and of 266 scholars in the various schools. Among these the three principal schools, in which both English and the native languages are taught, exhibit an increase of numbers; of the Mysore school it is reported that "as great interest has been manifested in the Bible lessons, especially those of an historic character, as in the secular lessons."

From **BARRACKPORE**, Mr. Pearson reports a considerable diminution of numbers, caused by the customary removals; but his labours have on the whole, been prosecuted with gratifying results.

CHINA.

The Annual District Meeting was held at **CANTON**, in December last, and was attended by all the brethren. The meeting supplied several particulars relative to the erection of places of worship. "A chapel has been built in Tsang Sha—Sand Street—at a cost of £400. Also three places for preaching, all of which are now the freehold property of the Society. Two houses have also been built on a plot of ground purchased in the western suburbs."

Nor is it only to the work of preaching that the energies of the Missionaries are directed. Three schools, containing 155 scholars, claim and receive stated instruction from the Rev. G. Piercy; while two young brethren, Chinese, whose names are now printed on the plan of the Canton Circuit as Local preachers, receive stated instruction from the Rev. S. Hutton, with a view to more extensive employment, if found faithful and qualified hereafter.

The character of the native professors of Christianity is given in the following highly gratifying expressions:—"The religious state of our Chinese members is such as to give us great satisfaction and encouragement. We are glad to see in some of them a marked advancement in the Christian life, and a steadily increasing zeal for the glory of God, and the salvation of their countrymen. One of their number has died during the year, as we trust in the Lord." The total number returned is: members, 21, showing an increase of two; and scholars 155.

In pursuance of the instructions of the Committee, Mr. Cox has visited the north of China, that he might, by personal observation, be qualified to form an opinion as to the openings which existed, or were likely to be created, for the diffusion of Christianity, by the operations of the Tae-pings; with one of whose rulers, the reputed second in dignity, he had some previous acquaintance. It is painful to add that the result of the enquiries which he was commissioned to make is by no means favorable, to the prospects of religion. In an interview with the Shield King he ascertained with deep regret that neither he, nor any other faithful Missionary of this Society, would be tolerated in preaching at Nanking.

AFRICA.

CAPE OF GOOD HOPE.—The gracious revivals which some Circuits in the District have experienced have led to a net increase of about sixty members; and two new chapels have been completed and opened, two-thirds of the cost having been provided by local effort, in each case, to the amount of £848.

EASTERN PROVINCES.—In the erection of chapels, both for Colonists and Natives, to the number of eight, four of which have been opened free of debt; in the increase of members, which has been principally among the native churches; in more than three hundred heathen baptized into Christ during the year; in the steady occupation and increased issues of the Mission-press; and the large and important industrial institutions which are fostered and assisted by the Colonial Parliament, the Committee cannot fail gladly to recognize both the growing fruit of past labours, and the seeds of still further progress.

The **BECHUANA and NORTHERN SECTION** presents equally marked features of encouragement. The printing-press has been ably and zealously worked, and has this year issued, among other works, a translation of the First Catechism in the Sirolong language. The numbers show an increase of ninety-nine; the number of adult Heathen baptized is sixty. At least two additional Missionaries are needed and requested.

WESTERN AFRICA.—No very noteworthy incident has marked the history of the year in the **GAMBIA and SIERRA LEONE** Districts; but the usual course of labour has not been unblest, since, after supplying all vacancies, there is an increase of one hundred and ninety-two members, making the total in the two Districts nearly seven thousand. From the **GOLD COAST**, the Committee learn that Mr. West was about to proceed to Rumaoui at the

close of the District Meeting, and to be accompanied by Mr. Ausah; and that though rumours at one time were rife of an attack on Abeokuta by the king of Dahomey, no such attack had been made. Meanwhile, as his Majesty had left his capital, Mr. Bernasko had received another warning from the chief officer of the town of Whydah, to the effect that he must consider himself in custody as a hostage for the good behaviour of the British people.

The numerical returns from this District show that one hundred and twenty grown persons have renounced heathenism, and been baptized into Christ during the year; that there has been a small increase in the number of members, and an increase of nearly two hundred in the number of scholars.

WEST INDIES.

On the general state of the Societies in the ANTIGUA District, the District Meeting remarks that, while a decrease in number is reported, there are in several parts of the District "pleasing indications of a good work among the people."

Two Missionaries have during the year been sent to reinforce the JAMAICA District, from which the Rev. Herbert Carter and his wife have been called to their reward. The numbers reported last year were 16,219; this year, 20,490; with more than 1,700 on trial, the fruit of that gracious visitation with which the island was lately favoured. For the due pastoral care of such multitudes, an increased number of shepherds seems absolutely necessary; and it is pleasant to observe that two are recommended.

AFFILIATED CONFERENCES.

The Missions in IRELAND have had their wonted difficulties to contend with during the past year. Emigration continues to diminish our numbers, and to lessen our unpaid agencies. It is, however, some consolation to know that many who have left our shores, not only continue members of our church, but are actively and successfully engaged in promoting her extension in other lands.

FRANCE.—After many years of earnest prayer and anxious waiting, the great Head of the Church has opened the way for the erection of a new chapel in Paris. The want of such an edifice has been much felt for many years. The enterprise is very great, and involves a large outlay; but it has been favourably viewed in high quarters, and many have manifested a deep interest in it. We hope that in the course of a year we shall see the work completed; and trust that the Lord will use this sanctuary as a means of

sending forth the light of His truth among both English and French, whether visitors or residents, in this great and important city.

Each department of the CANADIAN Missions is at present enjoying a good measure of prosperity.

The reports presented to the last AUSTRALIAN Conference, showed an increase of members in both departments of the work; that in the colonies amounting to 1,137, with 1,059, on trial; that in the Mission stations amounting to 1,206, with 5,455, on trial. In one District, viz., that of Auckland, in New Zealand, there has been a decrease of 112 members, which is sufficiently accounted for by the lamentable war which has for some time been carried on between the natives and the Government.

Another very gratifying feature of the present state of the Mission Districts is the steady increase in the amount of native agency employed. Eight candidates recommended by their several District Meetings were received on trial as Native Assistant Missionaries, making the total number 36, in addition to nearly twelve hundred Local Preachers employed in the Friendly and Fiji Islands.

A recent private letter from Mr. Calvert, dated Ovalan, January 16th, 1862, supplies the latest intelligence from those islands. He announces the completion of the place of worship, designed for Fijian services at Ovalan, which was opened on New Year's Day, free from debt; and the commencement of measures to obtain a place of worship for the English residents and visitors.

The Mission work of our own Conference continues to be carried forward in faith, and oftentimes with gracious results. Several spacious Churches have been opened during the year—the limits of many of our Circuits have been enlarged—and calls for increased Ministerial service have been earnest and numerous. In some instances, also, the work of God has been greatly revived. A few extracts from communications in our Connexional organ, may here be suitably introduced:—

In NEWPORT, "It has pleased the Head of the Church again to smile upon extra services held in several localities; and many have been led to give themselves to the Lord and his Church." The Rev. J. G. Hennigar adds, "We have also much cause to be thankful, for the steadfastness manifested by most of those who united with us two years ago."

From the MAITLAND Circuit the Rev. E. Crane writes that the Lord has been pleased to grant a most glorious revival of his work there. "In the

month of December last, at Lower Rawdon, in addition to other valuable results, about forty persons were received on trial for membership. At Upper Rawdon also, in the month of January, those who had long been praying for the Holy Spirit's special power were greatly refreshed and blessed; others who had wandered from the Saviour's fold were brought back, and upwards of sixty were added to the number of probationers." Subsequently at Selmah, the grace of the Holy Spirit was poured out, and "upwards of twenty gave their names on trial for membership."

The Rev. F. W. Moore writes, "To enter into a detail of circumstances of interest connected with our work in BERMUDA during the year, would occupy more room than you could spare, but I am happy, in a few words to say, that we enjoy prosperity in every department of our Church throughout the Circuit. Our Sunday Schools are in active operation. Our Chapel Trusts are lightened of heavy burdens. Our Mission cause is being smiled upon, and our people are enjoying a good degree of spirituality.

A series of services at COTE HILL, in the GREENWICH Circuit were attended with blessed results. "Gathered in from the ranks of Satan are many who give pleasing evidence of being soundly converted to God."

On the RIVER PHILIP Circuit a new Church was dedicated to the worship of God, and from its opening services the presence and saving power of Jehovah were manifest among its attendants. Special services were at once begun, and the Rev. A. M. Desbrisay, under date Feby. 15th, writes that "not fewer than sixty persons publicly consecrated themselves to the Lord. Last Sabbath twenty-two were received into Church-fellowship, of whom twelve were heads of families. The revival extended also to the East Branch of the River, and is now progressing gloriously in that place. At this time twenty-five individuals profess to have received the quickening and converting grace of God, and others appear to be just on the point of surrendering themselves to Christ."

In the month of Nov., the Church and congregation at CHARLOTTETOWN were visited with showers of blessing. In a communication from the Rev. H. Daniel, we are informed that "as the services progressed, the interest steadily increased. Several of our elder members came forward expressing an earnest desire for entire holiness, and resolved not to rest until they obtained it. A goodly number of the youth of our Sabbath Schools, and members of our Bible Classes presented themselves for prayer, and most of them in the course of our meetings professed the enjoyment of pardon. Adult members of the congregation also, and some from the country came

forward and wrestled hard, night after night, for the knowledge of the Divine favour. And God heard their cry and sent peace to their conscience, and joy to their heart. It is pleasing to see the change which has taken place in our Sabbath School. The cheerful submission of the scholars to their teachers—their association together in bands for prayer—and their regular attendance upon the public services, show that a real work of grace has been effected in their hearts.”

A more recent letter intimates that the cause of God has been much prospered at MARGATE, also in Prince Edward Island.

In writing from WILMOT, the Rev. A. B. Black says, “The gracious revival of religion in this Circuit continues in cheering progress. Seventy persons have been received on trial during the last two months. The former members have been greatly quickened, and many of them are seeking the blessing of perfect love.”

The DIGBY Circuit has been favoured with an outpouring of the Spirit of God. Within five weeks seventy persons professed to find the pardoning love of the Lord. The Rev. W. McCarty says, “It was no unusual sight to witness from thirty to forty penitents, at the same time bowed at the communion rail seeking mercy. How deeply affecting to see the grand-parents of three score years and ten, bowed before the Lord, with their children and grand children at their side, resolving to forsake sin and to cleave unto the Lord.”

In the AXLESFORD Circuit, the Rev. Geo. W. Tuttle, reports a “blessed work of grace in the new Church recently dedicated to the worship of God. Prayer—prayer offered at its dedication—continuous prayer—has been answered in the conversion of sinners, in the quickening of believers, and in the diffusion of a gracious religious influence through the neighbourhood.”

The PETITE RIVIERE Circuit has been blessed with prosperity in all its borders. Early in the fall, special services became a necessity at Broad Cove, and several who had been for weeks under conviction of sin came forward at once and avowed themselves determined to live for God. Later in the season, similar services were held at Mount Pleasant and at La Have River. Concerning the work in these places, the Rev. J. Hart thus writes: “The Divine Spirit, whose awakening power had been manifest in our ordinary services, continued to bless with influence which seemed steadily to intensify through several weeks; and under this influence, one and another from day to day deliberately covenanted to be the Lord’s. The majority of these were heads of families; and it was peculiarly affecting to see aged men

and women kneeling before God in deep penitence, pleading in earnest for pardon. Strong men trembled violently with emotion; and some rose from their beds to plead through the entire night for mercy."

Want and suffering have made the past year a testing season generally in the NEWFOUNDLAND DISTRICT. And "while some have fainted in the day of adversity, and in the time of temptation fallen away, it is matter of rejoicing that of more it may be said, as of the Church in Smyrna, "I know thy works, and tribulation, and poverty, BUT THOU ART RICH."

At PETITE a powerful work of God was experienced last September. "Many souls were brought to God through faith in Christ, and are promising well. At Channel, also, the cause of religion has been greatly revived. A goodly number have found the Lord; and are now earnestly and faithfully labouring to bring others to Christ."

The Annual Mission to the LABRADOR COAST was undertaken last Summer by the Rev. T. Fox. Some of the results are thus epitomized: "During the Summer we sailed above 400 miles, and visited between twenty and thirty harbours. I preached about sixty times, and held almost as many prayer-meetings, baptized twelve children, and visited from house to house, teaching, as time would permit, the things pertaining to the Kingdom of God. Three Sabbath Schools were commenced; and attention was directed to the building of six chapels. What is still better—God was with us. The Gospel was made the power of God to the salvation of several precious souls. Temperance and religion have had a most salutary effect on the Indians at George's Harbour. Drunkenness, swearing, card-playing, and other evils have been abandoned in a great measure. One young woman has been converted from the error of her ways; and the remainder of her tribe are evidently serious."

"This Mission," Mr. Fox observes, "is a very important one; and no money can be laid out to better advantage than here: no, not in Africa. It is a Mission of mercy, designed mostly to preserve those from falling who have received remission of sins, but also to invite and bring into the fold of Christ those who have been redeemed by his blood. And while the people of Newfoundland especially enjoy the benefits of this Mission, the Englishman, the Nova Scotian, the man from the United States, and the Indian share in those advantages also."

In conclusion. The Foreign Missions of the Wesleyan Church are anew commended to all who in these Provinces are favourable to the spread of Scriptural holiness. We might find our appeal for renewed and increased


