WHEREAS doubts have arisen as to the true meaning and effect of the sixth Section of the Act passed in the sixteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled, "*An Act to amend the Act passed in the Session held in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act to amend the Act of Incorporation of the Niagara Harbour and Dock Company,'*" and it is desirable to remove the same; Be it therefore declared and enacted, &c.,

Preamble.

16 V. c. 70.

That no Creditor of the Niagara Harbour and Dock Company shall, as such Creditor or by reason of any right as such, have or maintain any claim or recourse against any of the property in the said Act referred to, which has been or may be sold under the authority of the said Act, from or after the time of such sale, or against any purchaser thereof; and that nothing in the said Act or in the said sixth Section was intended or shall be construed to give to any such Creditor any such claim or recourse.

Conditions of the Company not to have any claims upon property sold under the said Act.
