Resolved, that this Meeting do hereby tender thanks to those ladies who have so assiduously and faithfully labored during the past year in the management of the Institution and which, by God's goodness, has been so eminently prosperous.

Moved by J. L. Morris, Esq., seconded by Wm. Clendinning, Esq., and

Resolved, that T. B. Anderson and John L. Morris, Esquires, be a Committee to obtain an Act of Incorporation of the Home and School of Industry under the Corporate name of the "Hervey Institute," the objects to be the better carrying out of the present work of the School and in connection therewith when thought advisable, other christian work, such as a Young Woman's Christian Association.

It was then moved and seconded and unanimously resolved "That the new building be proceeded with without waiting to collect so large a sum as \$13,000.00 and so soon as, in the judgment of the committee, a sufficient sum shall be subscribed to warrant the commencement of the building."

The Ladies Committee of the "Home and School of Industry" have great pleasure in presenting to their friends of the Institution the twenty-sixth annual report.

The Society would take this opportunity of returning their heartfelt thanks for the liberality with which their wants have been met during the past year.

At the last annual meeting 20th May, 1873, thirty-nine children were in the "Home." To the 30th April, 1874, thirty-nine have been admitted, shewing that during that time a home has been provided for seventy-eight children. Of these seventy-eight, twenty-six have gone to parents or friends. Twelve have been provided with situations; two have died and thirty-eight still remain in the Home. The two deaths being from hooping-cough. One, was the nurse's child, the other, the child of the cook, both having their mothers' care. It is with sadness they record this loss, as death has not entered the "Home" before (but in one instance) for a number of years. The Committee desire the

public to know that the Institution is *unsectarian*, as regards the admission of children. There are at present, Baptists, Presbyterians, Church of England, Wesleyans, &c., and even where one parent is protestant and the other Roman Catholic. The majority of inmates this year are Church of England.

Since last report a few changes have taken place in the domestic arrangements.

In September, Mrs. McKenzie was engaged as teacher; but lately she has been appointed matron, which office she fills with very great satisfaction. Mrs. Johnston, who has had much experience in tuition, has been engaged as teacher. She is in every way suitable, but will not remain *on account of the constant noise of so many children in so small a house.*

The Society will always have trouble in finding officers who will be willing to be annoyed night and day with children, as they must be, where there are so many in so confined a space.

The lease of the house 109 St. Antoine Street expired on the 1st May. It could not be renewed, as the Government had taken it and the adjoining house for the Immigrants' Home. After much search a house was taken on Richmond Square at an annual rent of \$400. It does not satisfy the ladies; but they hope that it will only be a temporary refuge.

This house merely accommodates thirty-six children: there is no play ground or yard attached to it. To this house the children were removed on the last week of April.

This shews the necessity for the erection of the new building. A few instances may be given as an indication of what they have to contend with; and they hope, that it may induce friends to come forward and supply the necessary means, whereby they may be enabled to have their new building ready for their next annual meeting.

One family has been sent in where the youngest child is

a little younger than is generally taken, the father not wishing to separate them. The child is very troublesome during the night and disturbs all in that dormitory, yet it must remain and do so, as there is not another to place her in. In this same family the boy is within a few months of the age that can be retained in the Institution. Where is this boy to be sent? When he is seven years old he will require to be separated from his sisters. The father found it painful enough to part from them, without being obliged to separate the children. There is a great necessity for more room to keep boys where sisters come in with them, and where the parents desire the children to be under the same roof.

Another example may be given in the case of sickness. There is not a room to isolate a sick child, thus exposing those in health to contagion.

Moreover it has been found necessary to send girls out to situations at the age of *twelve*, instead of *fourteen*, to make room for other applications.

The children were provided with an abundant Christmas dinner. A tree was also prepared with many handsome and useful articles, which were distributed among the children, much to their delight.

In the "Home" there are at present thirty girls who are being trained to industrious habits, are taught to read, write cipher and sew. The teacher having the valuable assistance of a young ladies' Committee who instruct the two elder classes in geography, history, arithmetic and singing.

From the Home over a hundred girls have been sent out to service, great care having been taken to place them under the charge of Christian ladies who have fulfilled their promises to attend to their moral training and religious instruction and in not a few cases, they have also attended to their secular education.

Gratifying accounts are from time to time received of the girls under their care. The Committee would cordially invite ladies to visit the "Home," which would deepen their interest and sympathy in the work carried on.

Through the exertions of ladies belonging to different protestant churches of this city a Floral Festival, in aid of the building fund, was held in the Mechanics' Hall on the 27th April, which realized over \$2,000.

The Committee, feeling greatly encouraged by the success of this effort, and the many kind promises that have been given of subscriptions towards the building fund, do fondly hope that God's blessing may attend their work in the future as it has done in the past. May it ever be remem-

bered that the poor we have always with us,—and the destitute little ones are the objects of God's peculiar care.
