A patent wringer (made of India rubber rollers which can be adjusted) is almost indispensable in washing. It does not wear the clothes like the twisting and wrenching of hand wringing, sares the most exhausting part of the wash, besides leaving the clothes drier than can be the case with ordinary hand wringing.

Black or very dark calicoes should be stiftened with gumarabic—five cents' worth is enough for a dress. If, however, starch is used, the garments should be turned wrong side out.

wast Flannels in lukewarm water, and rinse in water of the same temperature. Avoid rubbing soap upon the fiannels. Stretch them when thoroughly clean, snap them caergetically and hang them up immediately—by the fire if the weather is bad. Two waters are enough for fiannels.
