OUR FUTURE POLITICS.

It is somewhat amusing to witness the frantic race of certain scribblers on what is called the Liberal Conservative side with regard to the stirring up of party strife and party organization. They cling to old ideas, and the only way in which they manifest a Conservative spirit is by ignoring the great political change that we are about to enter upon. It is all very well for these gentlemen to depict the Liberals of the country as a set of unprincipled knaves, as devoid of patriotism as they are of the principles of common honesty, but they know perfectly well that a small influence such as this has had in the past, and what a slim prospect there is for the adoption of their violent creed in future. There was a time when party strife of the bitter kind could be accounted for. Abuse of a serious character existed, and as long as a set of men stood up in their defence it was right and proper that true lovers of their country should sternly and determinedly oppose the giant corruptions of the day. But it is as late discovered by the leaders on both sides that, under such a system, the simple reason that neither party could retain the reins of power long enough to carry out its measures. Hence the compromising arrangement resulting in a strong coalition government in Canada, and hence the burial, for the time being, of the hatchet of political warfare.

Party government is very proper when there are well-defined principles of political action in operation. It would not, in our opinion, be well that any government should be in a position to carry out all its measures independent of opposition, and in this relation we may express our firm belief that under Confederation there will be in Parliament at all times an element of opposition to put on the strings when there is danger of heavy or ill-considered legislation, but we think those who are now so eager to renew the war which involved so much of acrimony and violence into our former politics are not acting wisely. The welfare of the nation at large is of much greater importance than the personal aggrandizement of a few needy adventurers, and it will be time enough surely to enter into the subject of political organization when we learn the full details of the government under which we are to exist. It is quite natural that men should retain their old party leanings, and it is not, perhaps, wrong to warn our party leaders, generally, to be upon their guard against being taken by surprise, but we think the man who undertakes to cast the people of Canada, at this particular juncture, with the idea that they should renew the old tactics and fight in the old political trenches, just as if nothing had happened. The fact of the matter is that no person can forecast our political future with certainty, and hence we would admire the election, under Confederation, of men who are capable and honest, leaving to the future the discussions which occasion may demand.

## WHAT'S IN A NAME?

The subject of naming Confederated British America is again on the carpet. From all we can learn, it seems probable that the name we are to be known by to the world will be Canada or the good old-fashioned Canada. If Mr. May's advisers are to come so close to our old name, we trust they will be led to consider the addition of the superlative—Canada in fact the largest of the Provinces to be Confederated, and we think it would be much easier adopted by the whole than any high-sounding Latinized cognomen. The question of the general name being decided in favor of either Canada or Canada, it will be absolutely necessary to find new names for the sections now known as Upper and Lower Canada. What shall those names be? There is something in a name, and the man who can discover some short, expressive name for the section in which we live, will be conferring a lasting benefit upon the people at large. We have heard a great number of names canvassed—some of them euphonious enough—but generally speaking they are by far too pretentious. In this respect the people of the neighboring republics have been very happy. Instead of reaching through Latin and Greek lexicons for a title, they simply adopted in nearly every case the Indian name, and nothing more appropriate could be desired. Who could wish for far names than Alabama, Kentucky, Tennessee, Ohio, Missouri, Iowa, &c.? Why not then give the naming of our new States, whatever they may be, to a council of intelligent Indians. We feel confident their choice would be more appropriate than any names we have yet seen.

## BE PREPARED.

As it is now unlikely that a reform will be brought in to endanger the existence of the present English Government for some time, it is almost certain that the Confederation Bill will be passed through without delay, and ere we are aware of it almost, we shall be called upon to select men to represent us in the local and general legislatures. It is important that the people of Huron and Bruce should at once look about them for available men, to whom they could commit the task of representing them in Toronto or Ottawa. The people of Bruce are already on the alert, and already some dozen or more members of Parliament are cut out in the rough, ready (and so forth) willing to be polished up and sent forth at a moment's warning. The settlers of Huron are not quite so excited in these matters,

# GOBERICH SALT WELL.

ALL RIGHT AGAIN.  
EXTRAORDINARY PUMPING.

THE BRINE 165' IN STRENGTH.  
After a stoppage of several weeks, our Salt Well is, we are happy to say, again in full blast. Some three or four weeks ago the pump suddenly ceased to bring up either brine or water, and it was evident something was wrong down below. The piping was drawn out successfully, and after such repairs to the pumping apparatus as prudence dictated, the well was again tested, with the same result. The sand-pump was put down to clear the bottom, and when at its greatest depth, the rock broke, leaving the tool in the large cavity which must have been formed. It was found impossible to extract it, or to cast a drop of brine to the surface. Engineers were at fault, and the salt well affair had "played out," just as they thought it would, but, lo and behold! on again drawing the pipes it was discovered by accident that one of them was split badly. A new one was fitted on, the salt bag, &c., taken off, the piping re-laid, the pump rod put in, when, after a few strokes of the engine, up came the brine in a heavy stream, and fully 165 deg. in strength. That was on Saturday, and the overjoyed directors left to tell the good news in the city. On Monday the pump was going early, and the brine during the whole day stood at a uniform height of 165 deg.—that is, the mark for 100 deg. on the salometer was at least the fourth of an inch out of the water! What think ye of that, men of Saginaw? And you, Waterlooyans? We assure our readers that what we say is utterly devoid of exaggeration, and we can show the salt records of America to challenge a day's pumping of brine equally strong and pure! This last test proves conclusively that the supply of brine in this vicinity is unlimited, and Prof. Hunt's prediction as to the purity of the manufactured salt is already verified in the most practical manner by the eagerness with which it is bought up by dealers throughout the country. We have become so much accustomed to witnessing the pumping of strong brine, and the manufacture of pure, white salt, that we hardly realize the great advantages we are to derive from this discovery, but it is certain that it will add greatly to the wealth and importance of the town, and the prosperity of the County generally.

## ANOTHER SALT WELL.

A Company of Goderich gentlemen, having secured a piece of land near the Railway Station, from M. C. Cameron, Esq., have already erected a derrick on which the engine is being placed, and in a very few days they will be drilling towards salt and wealth. We trust their enterprise will meet with the reward it merits, and that ere many months we shall be able to record the progress of several new salt wells.
