

WHO WILL BUILD THE ENGINES? The Four Tenders Opened-Hamilton and Buffalo to be Visited.

Ald. Hill presided at a meeting yesterday Waterworks as to the ten lers for the new Waterworks as to the ten lers for the new pumping engines. There were present: Ald. Leslie, Lindsey, Vaughan, Gowanlock, Superintendent Hamilton and Chief Engineer Ferguson. The latter had been called in as an expert. He was particularly severe on the masten pumps and No. 3 engine. He said that its daily duty was 10,000,000 as against the 12,000,000 guaranteed, and it had to be constantly watched to detect breakage. There were only four or five in use and they had all proved failures. If the Holly contract had been accepted at the time of the big fight, it would have saved the city its price in the saving of fuel. There were four tenders considered and

they were;

No. 1. \$94,000 for two 10-million gallon engines and boilers, to be finished in nine months from date of order.

No. 2. \$114,742 for two engines and boilers, or \$57,277 for one-engine and boilers, making an allowance of \$3800 for old No. 1 Worthington engine and four boilers.

No. 3. \$123,799 for two engines and boilers or one-engine and boilers, for \$62,931 and allow \$300 for No. 1 and four boilers.

No. 4. \$188,350 for two engines and boilers.

No. 4 \$108,200 for two engines and bollers.

Nos. 2 and 3, it is understood, are the Polson Company's tenders and the work will be all done in Toronto.

No. 1 is Killey & Beckett's of Hamilton.

No. 4 although not put in by the Holly Company, is practically their accepted \$158,250 of Toronto to Lockport, N.Y.

Ald. Lindsey favored the tender which would give engines on the same plan as those in the high level station.

After discussion it was resolved on motion of Ald. Lindsey that the committee and superintendent visit Hamilton and Buffalo (the former at their own expense) for the purpose of looking at the Killey and Holly pumps.
