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HOCKEY IN MUTUAL-STREET.

A Fine Exhibition Contest Between Osgoode and Granite Results in the Favourite's Favor by 24 to 10.

Most attention was attracted by the broadsword combat between Duncun C. Ross and F. S. Castellano. Ross came on the stage with both arms bared to the shoulders, an indication that he held his opponent very tight.

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MAY ABOLISH ROYALTIES.

Exploitation of the mineral resources of the northern portion of this province.

A Case in Point. The case in appeal, to which reference is made, arose in India under the following circumstances: In the year 1880 the Orang Mining Company was incorporated under the Joint Stock Companies Act of 1862 and 1880.

Forty thousand shares were allotted to the vendors of the company, the residue was left for the public, and the full amount was paid thereon. The operations of the company were not at first successful, and a winding-up order was obtained.

Application was subsequently made to court for a winding-up order, and the court, on the introduction of fresh capital and the resumption of business operations, such an order was made accordingly.

An extraordinary general meeting of the company was held in 1885, and an resolution was passed directing that the capital should be increased by the issue of 120,000 preference shares of 21 each, to be credited in the capital books of the company as having the sum of 2,520,000 paid thereon.

There has been an active trade in the past few days, the incentive being a reduction in freight rates. An order has been issued on Saturday by the Canadian Pacific withdrawing the lower rates, and a good deal of unfavorable gossip has been going on in the market.

Toronto wholesale dealers interviewed the Controller of Customs on Saturday in connection with changes to be made in the tariff. Messrs. Anderson, Brock, Caldwell, Coombs, McKinnon, Ivy, Dunnett, Blackley and Darling, representing the dry goods section of the Board of Trade, asked the Controller of Customs to consider the proposed changes in the tariff on buttons.

The dry goods men claimed that the duty levied at Toronto was not in accordance with the tariff, and that the Controller should see to it that the duty was levied in such a satisfactory manner that the attention of the department was not attracted to the matter.

The Controller assured them that he would receive the attention of the department and that the grievance department desired remedied was the entering of false ornaments on the list.

RECORDS IN COLLEGE ATHLETICS.

Many Were Broken in 1893—Intercollegiate Association Meets.

New York, Feb. 24.—The Intercollegiate Association of Athletes met here today, 18 of the 24 colleges in the organization being represented. The important amendments to the constitution and by-laws make a change of the hammer-throwing as well as the shot-putting.

The Ontario Joint Stock Companies' Act, section 43, is couched almost in the same terms as the one in force in the Dominion.

Now, while it is believed that the sale of mining shares at a discount is a critical juncture, it is not a new thing, and is frequently the practice in this province, some doubt as to the legality of such transactions.

Against these orders appeal was brought by the company and by Walworth before the House of Lords in 1885.

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FINANCE AND TRADE.

The bullish fever is still on, and its continuation is looked for, especially by those who are carrying small jags on margin.

The number of operators watching the tickers is growing, but most of them are old-timers, carrying a little Cable, Telegraph or Gas. The advance in these stocks is producing a better feeling, and a cheering outlook is predicted.

An advance is talked of for Imperial, Dominion Standard and Merchants. Fair progress was made in these securities the past couple days, but as compared with a year ago the closing prices on Saturday show Imperial to be 10 per cent. lower, Dominion 7 per cent. lower, Standard and Merchants 7 per cent. lower.
