

1. The Solemnity of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on Sunday, February 9.

2. The Solemnity of the Feast of St. Joseph, on Sunday, March 8.

3. The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on Sunday, March 15.

4. The Solemnity of Corpus Christi, on Sunday, June 7.

5. The Solemnity of the Saints Peter and Paul, on the Sunday following the feast of the same—that is, July 5. The Fast of the Vigil is on Saturday, July 4.

6. The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on Sun-

day, August 16. The Fast of the Vigil, on Friday, August 14.

7. The Solemnity of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on Sunday, September 13.

8. The Solemnity of St. Michael the Archangel, on Sunday, September 27, the Sunday preceding the feast of the same.

On the 24th of October, anniversary of the consecration of the Bishop, the prayer "Deus Omnium" is to be added in the Mass of the day.

LENTEEN REGULATIONS.

The Lenten Regulations for the diocese of New Westminster, for the year 1896, will be as follows:—

1. By dispensation obtained from the Holy See, on the 7th of August, 1879, and on the 11th of December, 1893, the use of flesh meat is allowed in this diocese, at the principal meal, on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, throughout Lent, except on Saturday in Ember Week, and Thursday and Saturday in Holy Week.

2. Meat is allowed at every meal on all Sundays throughout Lent.

3. Persons who are not obliged to fast may use flesh meat at every meal on those days when it is allowed at the principal meal.

4. The use of flesh meat and fish at the same meal is prohibited.

5. The use of white meats—that is, milk, butter, cheese and eggs, by dispensation is allowed on all days throughout Lent.

6. It is permitted to use drippings or lard, instead of butter or oil, in preparing victuals, not only during Lent, but also on all days of abstinence throughout the year.

7. Persons using the above dispensations are bound to atone for their sins by other works of penance, and to give alms according to their means, the use of which is determined by the Bishop.

Present Bishop: Right Reverend PAUL DURIEU, O.M.I., D.D., born at St. Pal-de-Mons, Diocese of Puy, France, on December 4th, 1830; made his Profession in the Order of the O.M.I., November 1st, 1849; ordained Priest, March 11th, 1851; named Titulary Bishop of Marcopolis, and Coadjutor of Right Rev. Bishop D'Herbomez, June 2nd, 1875; consecrated, October 24th, 1875; appointed first Bishop of New Westminster, September 2nd, 1890.

Former Bishop: Right Reverend LOUIS JOSEPH D'HERBOMEZ, born at Brillion, Diocese of Cambrai, on January 17th, 1822; made his Profession on November 21st, 1848; ordained Priest, October 11th, 1849; named Titulary Bishop of Miletopolis and Vicar Apostolic of British Columbia, December 22nd, 1863; consecrated, October 1st, 1864; died at New Westminster, June 3rd, 1889.




