CANADIAN ROUTE MAY BE USED TO TRANSPORT TROOPS TO CHINA

An Imperial Officer Now in Canada to Report on the Advantages
of Using the C.P.R.—Everything Favors
Our Route.

Ottawa, July 4.—(Special.)—Correspondent
Lynch of The London Express and an im-
perial officer went west to-day en route
for China. The correspondent, interview-
ed, said he expected the Canadian route
Japan would be allied with Britain in the
Chinese fight. The troops will be drawn
largely from India, whose garrisons would
be filled by men from South Africa. The
reserve in England would send out con-
dition. He thought the Canadian route would
be chosen for transporting English troops,
because it was cool, more comfortable and
as short as the Suez and Red Sea route.
The greater comfort of the Canadian route
was the prime desideratum because the
troops could be landed in China in perfect
condition. The imperial military officer
has been sent out to report upon the Ca-
nadian route as to the advisability of send-
ing troops over it.

Also Interviewed at Montreal.
Montreal, July 4.—(Special.)—The
London Mailer is expected to be in
Canada to-day. Today's Imperial
Limited took Mr. George Lynch of the
Daily Express who was with Sir George
White at Ladysmith.

Being seen here this morning Mr. Lynch
declared that in the event of war being
declared there was a strong probability
of troops being sent via Canada.

The question, he said, was being mooted
in London when he left and was favor-
ably received owing to the Suez Canal
and Red Sea route being oppressive at
this season of the year.

Canadian Route the Right One.
The trip via Canada would ensure the
troops landing in superior physical con-
dition, the splendid rail accommodation
of the C.P.R. would guarantee rapid land
transport and while not knowing the fac-
tories of Vancouver to China he supposed
great steamers of the C.I.M. could be se-
cured.

The Best Transport Work.
The best transport work in connection
with the African campaign was done
by the steamship Kingston, which carried
30,000 troops in four trips. The time from
England to China by either Canadian or
Suez route was about the same, but the
Canadian route had all the advantages in
the way of favorable climatic conditions,
Khartoum being a hot, malarial place, and
that the bulk of troops will go from In-
dia, but may be added would be sent
from England.

Ottawa, July 4.—(Special.)—The House

More Judges for Quebec.
The afternoon session was devoted to a
discussion of the bill to amend the act re-
specting provincial courts. The refer-
ence to Quebec and aims to increase the
number of judges from 31 to 34, by in-
creasing the number in Montreal from 14
to 17. It would mean an increase of
\$15,000 yearly in salaries.
Messrs. Casgrain and Bergeron opposed
the bill, because there were already
enough.
Judges to do all the work required, Mr.
Bergeron claimed the bill was merely
brought in to give judgeships to political
friends of the Government. The Opposition
declared that there were enough judges if
they were distributed properly, but under
the system of legal administration in Que-
bec one judge had too much to do, while
another had a clock.
Mr. Wilfrid Laurier and Hon. C. Fitz-
patrick agreed to this proposition, but
maintained that as the administration of
justice was in the hands of the province
the Dominion could not remedy it. Be-
sides, as Sir Wilfrid said, the French-Canadians
were wedded to their system that
prevented having a Superior Court judge
try cases that could be as well disposed of
by a magistrate.

One Way to Run a Jail.
