77 VISIT TO ENGLAND
PROPOSED ASSEMBLY

Should Have Direct Relations
With Emperor—Will Not Inter-
fere with People's Will—The Police
Take Names of Those Attending
the Congress.

Moscow, July 19.—The zemstvo con-
gress opened at mid-day today in the
residence of Prince Dolgorouki.

The congress to-day was attended by
25 delegates. Count Heyden, leader
of the deputations, representing the con-
gress recently received by the emperor,
presided.

M. Fiolovine, president of the organiza-
tion, made a statement dealing with the
statement dealing with the obstacles
placed in the way of the congress, an-
nouncing that Governor-General Kozloff
had promised that there would be no
recourse to extreme measures, when the
chief of police with numerous commis-
saries and officials entered the room.

The chief announced that the police
had prohibited the meeting of the con-
gress and ordered the seizure of the
documents. Count Heyden protested
against the proceeding, but the chief
of police began taking the names of the
delegates. Then cries were raised, "Write
down the names of those attending."

Many persons present who were not
delegates to the congress requested that
their names also be taken. The police
then departed in order to draw up sum-
mons and the sitting was resumed.

The sitting was resumed, and the
address of a national assembly on the
subject outlined by the commission pre-
sented by M. Boulignin, minister of
agriculture, was minutely and critically
discussed and denounced as totally
inadequate to remove Russian internal
grievances, because it included a prop-
erty qualification and an electoral

At the same time it was recognized
that the proposed assembly would

representation.

Therefore, it was considered desir-
able that in the event of the carrying
out of the Boulignin or a similar pro-
ject, the delegates to the assembly
should be chosen by the municipalities
and should participate in the
assembly to the greatest possible ex-
tent, and should be able to obtain a guar-
antee of individuality and freedom.

With Direct Relations
Numerous resolutions embodying the
views of the delegates were adopted
unanimously, as were also resolutions
complaining of excessive administra-
tive and police control of elections, and
insisting that publicity be given to the
proceedings of the proposed assembly,
which should be in direct relations
with the emperor, without interference
from the council of the empire.

PUBLICITY FOR PASS HOLDERS.
Iowa Would Prevent Railway
Favors Being Misplaced.

Des Moines, Ia., July 19.—When the
anti-pass bill is offered in the next
legislature it will have attached to it
a provision requiring the publication
of the names of those who apply to
the railroad for passes, and the names
of those who issue them, in order to
secure free transportation.

The railroad will be required by this
provision to file the names of those
to whom passes have been issued during
the preceding year. The bill, as proposed,
will provide that any person who
passes shall be prohibited, except that
railroad employees and their families
may not be excepted.

But, fearing that members of the leg-
islature and other public officers may
be easily influenced by the railroad
employees, by becoming attorneys
for companies, for instance, it is
proposed to add to the bill a com-
mission bill, an anti-pass bill, which
will require passes to be issued only
to those who are engaged in the
business of the railroad, and who
are not in the employ of the railroad.

The State of Washington recently
passed a law creating a state railroad
commission and a tax commission,
which is empowered to audit the
accounts of the railroad companies,
and as a part of the railroad com-
mission bill, an anti-pass bill, which
will require passes to be issued only
to those who are engaged in the
business of the railroad, and who

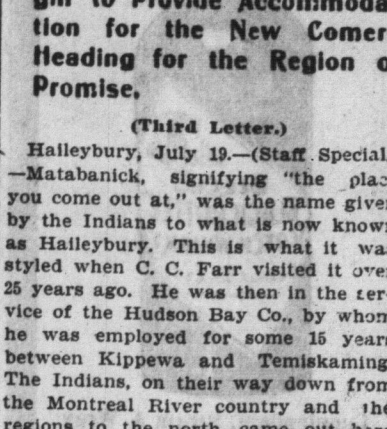
