TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
THE TORONTO MAGDALENE ASYLUM,
OR
INDUSTRIAL HOUSE OF REFUGE.

It was intimated in last year's Report that this Institution had nearly reached its twenty-fifth year; and now that it has arrived at that mature age, we can look back with great thankfulness to the good which has been accomplished during all those past years, and forward with increased faith and hope that much more will be accomplished in the years to come. The late Horace Mann—the eminent educator—in delivering an address at the opening of a reformatory institution for boys, said, "that if only one boy were saved from ruin, it would still pay for all the cost and labour of establishing such an institution." Afterwards, in private conversation, a friend rallied Mr. Mann upon his statement, and asked him if he did not colour that a little when he said that if only one boy were saved, it would pay for the cost and labour. "Not if it were my boy," was the serious and convincing answer. But taking higher ground: If we could, from God's standpoint, realize the worth of one human soul, we would think that all the expense, labour and anxiety, connected with this Home since its foundation, are nothing compared with the good which has been done—the many lives purified—the souls saved from death.

It seems that some of the friends of this Institution find it hard to understand why women cannot be taken into the Home for a less time than one year. But if, after mature experience, the Committee thinks it wisest and best, to set the limit at one year—except in *very* extreme cases—without any argument, it will

readily be seen that nothing but insubordination would be the result were the rule broken. Perhaps it is well to look at the experience of other institutions. A Boston commission appointed to investigate the question of the cure of drunkenness, after visiting nearly all the institutions in the United States, came to the conclusion that *at least* one year's treatment or training in an asylum is necessary—a shorter period of time is quite insufficient to allay the cravings of appetite, break up the habit of indulgence, or restore any considerable degree of self-respect. As a large proportion of the women received into this Asylum, have this vice to overcome, as well as other vices, a year has often been found to be too short a time for them to gain the mastery. If they were allowed to go out sooner, their cure would seem altogether hopeless.

The number of inmates in the Home on the 1st of January, 1877, was 36; 63 have been received during the year. Of these, 20 have been sent to service, 23 left of their own accord, 8 have been sent to their friends, 6 to the General Hospital, 4 to the Lying-in Hospital, 1 went to the Children's Hospital as nurse, 1 insane, 1 sent back to Galt; leaving 35 in the Asylum on the 1st of January 1878.

From several of those who have been sent to their friends, the Matron has received letters, telling of their kind reception at home, "so much better than they deserved," as they expressed it; and also speaking of their gratitude for the good they received at the Home. One young girl, who, impatient of home restraint, had gone away to do as she pleased, had found that she had made a crooked path for herself. After spending a year in the Home, she was sent for by her friends, and went home resolved to lead a different life. From her was received a letter, telling how very glad her mother and brothers were to have her back: the past had been forgiven. One who went from the Home to service, has been married and comfortably settled.

The inmates continue to receive regular religious instruction on the Sabbath and during the week. And we sincerely thank the gentlemen who have conducted the services on the Sabbath; and the ladies who regularly read to them during the week.

Dr. Geikie continues faithful to his self-imposed duty of attending the inmates whenever his services or advice are needed. We can only reiterate our thankfulness to him.

We also again wish to give expression to our appreciation of the invaluable services of the Matron, Mrs. Aiken. When we remember the different dispositions of those placed under her care—their undisciplined lives and hearts—it will be seen that her position is one of great difficulty. It is surprising how little insubordination there is, how great a degree of peace and harmony exists under her wise management.

The inmates have earned, during the year, by washing and sewing, the sum of \$1037.75.

The members of the Committee often hear the remark, "I would rather be connected with any other charity than this—it seems hopeless work to try to reclaim those so hardened in sin, there seems very little result for all the trouble." Happily for us, God does not make us responsible for great results; if we do faithfully what He has set for us to do—bring the lost and sinful ones within sound of the voice of Him who came to seek and to save the lost. We acknowledge there seems more hope if we have the fresh, unsullied life of a child to guide; but it is not for us to decide when a life is too sinful to be purified by Christ. Often a child forgets its early teaching. There are those in the Home who have been taught the right, either in their own homes, or in charitable institutions. There must still be some haven, where, if they will, they may reform.

The earth is the Lord's, and He has said that the gold is His, also the silver; and if we are faithful stewards, there ought ever to be enough gold in His treasury—enough faith among His people to cultivate, not only the good ground, but the stoney, thorny field also; for we believe His power is sufficient to bring forth fruit in spite of thorns and stones—to make the desolate places glad, and cause the wilderness to blossom as the rose.
