

## MANAGERS' REPORT.

In submitting the Annual Report of the Managers this year, we congratulate the members of the congregation on their having the most encouraging report this year of any for the past few years. Stipend has been paid in full, and \$125 paid on arrears of 1897. All current accounts and some arrears of 1897 have been paid, with a balance on hand of \$84.18. \$100 of principal has been paid on church building account; and there are still sufficient funds on hand to pay all interest accruing during the past year. While

we have not contributed quite as much to church schemes as in 1897, we have contributed \$148 more to stipend, besides the ordinary collections being \$65 more than in 1897. # REPORT OF W. F. M. SOCIETY.

The W. F.M S. have held their meetings regularly during the year with an average attendance of 10 members. The roll call remains the same as past few years, viz., "15," and though we have no increase of numbers to report, yet the contribution has increased from \$35.50 to \$39.25, while the bale of clothing for Mission Schools in the North West was valued at \$35. This Society wishes to express its appreciation of the aid given by "Scattered Helpers" in the congregation, who, though not able to attend the regular meetings, have by their contributions, both to finances and bale of goods, greatly assisted the work and encouraged the workers.
