



INDIA INTELLIGENCE.

From the Times. The steamer Bremen, which conveyed the mail, left Bombay, Nov. 1st, and arrived at Suva on the 20th.

The intelligence which we have received by this mail is not of a striking character. There has not been any arrival at Bombay from China since that of the steamer with news of the 24th of August.

From the Overland Bombay Courier, Nov. 1, 1841. We have received an intelligence from China during the last month of later date than that contained in the Overland Courier of the 1st of Oct.

The topic of greatest interest at the present moment is the prospect of a war with Burmah. The news of our latest intelligence from the East is that the King (Tharavadi) was on the latter day of the month of August at Rangoon, where it was expected he would arrive in less than a fortnight.

The Governor-General evidently thinks the danger imminent. Immediately the above intelligence reached Calcutta orders were issued for the despatch of troops to Mouleim. Troops have been taken up on a merchant steamer hired for the occasion.
