District Board of Health Re commended That City Cancel Leases on Navy Island and Reports Conditions.

At a committee meeting of the Common Council yesterday morning a communication was read from the District Board of Health which enclosed a report from the District Medical Health Officer as to conditions on Navy Island and asked that the City Council end the leases of lots on the island. Dr. Brown's report said that most of the people on the island, were living in a condition of squalor. The house, the report said, were too small, were insufficiently ventilased and there was neither water supply nor sewerage system on the island; all the fresh water was carried from the mainland.

There are eight families on the island and in one there is a bedridden old man, Dr. Brown said, who is living in pathetic conditions. He recommended that the island be evacuated as soon as possible.
