POISONING BY PEACH STONES .- A fatal case of poisoning by peach stones, which is noted in the French papers as having recent-ly occured in Paris, should serve as a warn-ing to families in which children are allowed to look after themselves for hours at a time. Probably very few adults themselves know stones of a number of peaches, and, obtaining a hammer, when left alone broke them open ndustriously and ate them; the result be that he was fatally poisoned by hydrocyanic (prussic) acid. Since the peach season is now upon us, it is as well to explain what quantity of poison the peach stone possesses Writers on toxicology state that one ounce of the kernels contain about one grain of pur known, is sufficient to kill any adult person. Even two thirds of a grain has very often proved fatal, and indeed may well be regard-ed as a fatal dose for any child.


