THE JOHN MACKELLAR MEMORIAL.

History of Hospital



General Hospital, Fort William.

On September 18, 1899, the first public step was taken in Fort William to care for the sick. Prior to that date the Relief Society of the Town had been in correspondence with the Victorian Order of Nurses with a view to sending a trained nurse to the Town to do district nursing. The result of the meeting held on the above date was to form a committee to canvass the town for subscriptions to insure the salary of the nurse. Their efforts were highly successful and on December first of that year Miss Farnsworth came here under the supervision of the Victorian Order of Nurses. So highly pleased were the people who had supervision of the work that the next year the scope was enlarged and a Nurses Home established in the double house on Donald street opposite the Baptist church, with two nurses, Miss Cope and Miss Hooley.

In the meantime, during the winter of 1899-1900, several public meetings were held for the purpose of devising ways and means for founding an hospital. A committee of three, Dr. Hamilton, Patrick J. Munro and George P. Pike was finally appointed to collect subscriptions for an hospital. Their efforts were quite successful in obtaining subscriptions but the best work of this committee was to secure from the McKellar Brothers the gift of a block of land bounded by Vickers, John, Arthur and Ridgeway streets, for hospital purposes, to perpetuate the name of their brother the late John McKellar. The hospital was built by donations from the citizens and by a mortgage placed on the land.

A new and larger committee was formed in the summer of 1900, at another public meeting of citizens, consisting of twelve members and the mayor to act as a board of trustees. In 1901 the board went a step further and secured an act of incorporation from the government to work under a legal form and to give the board permanent standing. The first board of trustees consisted of L. W. Lewis, L. L. Peltier, William Stevenson, Patrick J. Munro, F. E. Troutman, S. C. Young, J. J. Wells, James Murphy, Allan MacLougall, Donald McKellar, W. F. Hogarth, George P. Pike. The first officers of the incorporated board were C. W. Macris, president, F. E. Troutman, secretary, Wm. Stevenson, treasurer, P. J. Mahon, first vice-president, W. F. Hogarth, second vice-president.

During the year 1901 the Nurses Home had become too small and the committee, which was composed of men and women with Rev. W. H. Rowand as chairman, decided to have to one commodious quarters and the house on George street now owned by the Commercial Club was secured. The head of the Victorian Order was asked to send two of her best nurses and the committee felt she had complied with the request when Miss Banks and Miss Duncan came and put the Cottage hospital, as the new home was named, on a popular and prosperous footing. This place was maintained until the present hospital was completed.

The McKellar hospital board, which had been kept as a distinct organization from the Cottage hospital board, had been working steadily ahead and October 10, 1902, the corner stone was laid by Miss McKellar, and in June 1903 it was occupied on the Cottage hospital and its board ceased to exist. From the three nurses that composed the staff in 1900 there are now eleven nurses, three graduates and eight pupil nurses with Miss Banks as superintendent. When the effects of the Victorian Order committee was turned over to the McKellar hospital board, Miss Banks was transferred from matron of the Cottage hospital to superintendent of the McKellar Hospital, and she has served with honor in that capacity ever since.

The needs of an hospital are an ever pressing necessity and the board has seen many dark days in the floundering of the institution and in keeping it up to the standard required by its necessities. The Ladies Aid organized in November 1902, has been of great help to the board, especially in furnishing bedding and many other of the useful helps required. An enlargement of the building is urgently required and next year will probably see an additional building started that will cost \$25,000.
