The Duke of Buckingham trasted the House and the people would be disabused of the impression that had gone abroad, relative to the imputation that had been cast upon the present government, of desiring to conciliate Mr. O'Connell. The noble Viscount had distinctly stated that the same principles would be acted upon as he pursued before, when the Church question was under consideration, that he was still determined to promote the interests and extend the usefulness of piety and true religion. Every one knew the cause which compelled this Majesty's late Government to resign—namely, the principle of appropriating church property to secular purposes. He (the Duke of Buckingham) begged, therefore, to ask the noble Viscount, (Melbourne) distinctly and emphatically, whether he was preputed to bring forward a measure for relief from the grievances of the Irish Tithe system, and appropriating the surplus revenue to other than religious purposes.

Lord Melbourne—It is premature to go into this discussion at present, for if we enter once upon it, we must take it up as a whole measure, and so consider it. This would be a most inconvenient course now to pursue, but I have no hesitation in declaring to the noble Lord made this statement with peculiar emphasis, which created a great sensation in the House, and was received with loud cheers.
