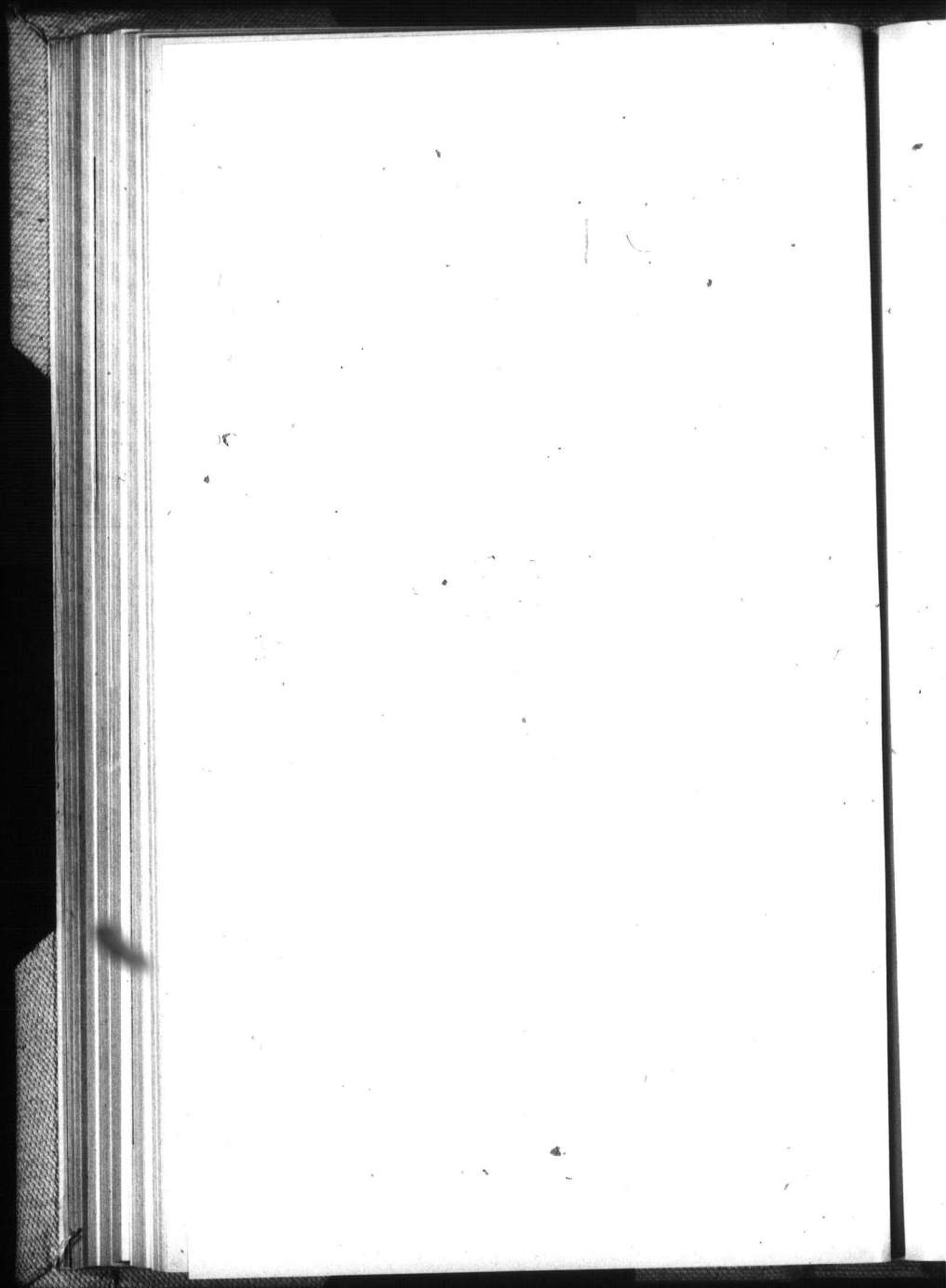

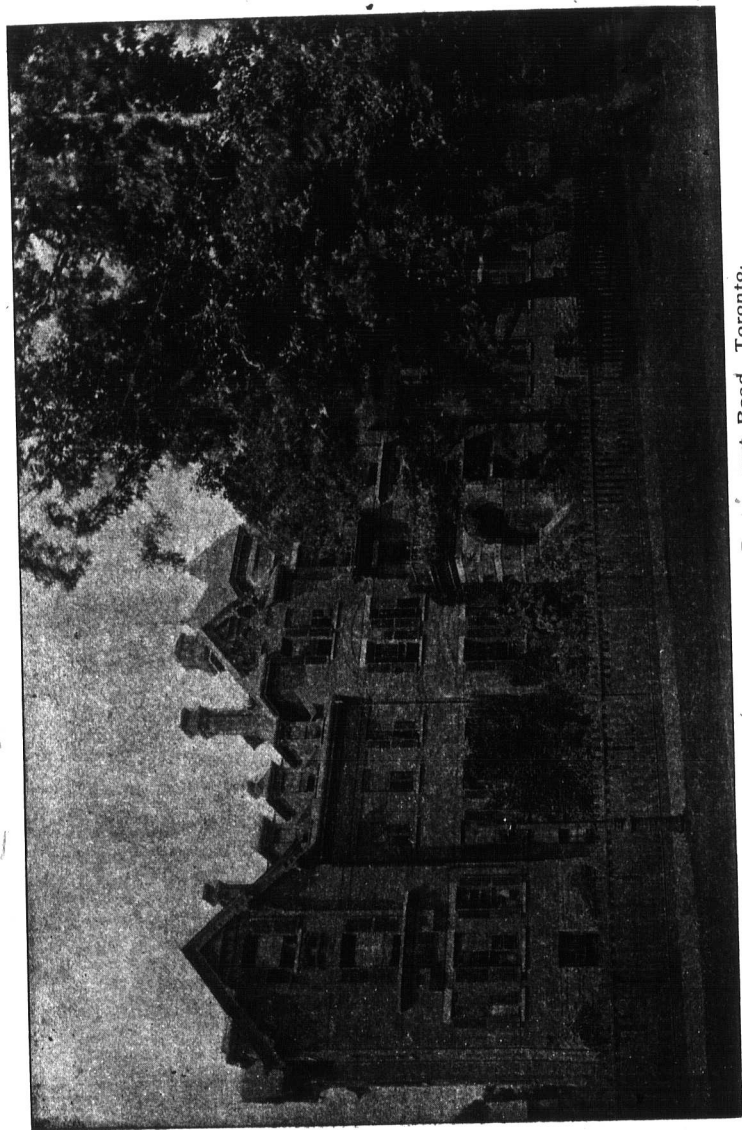

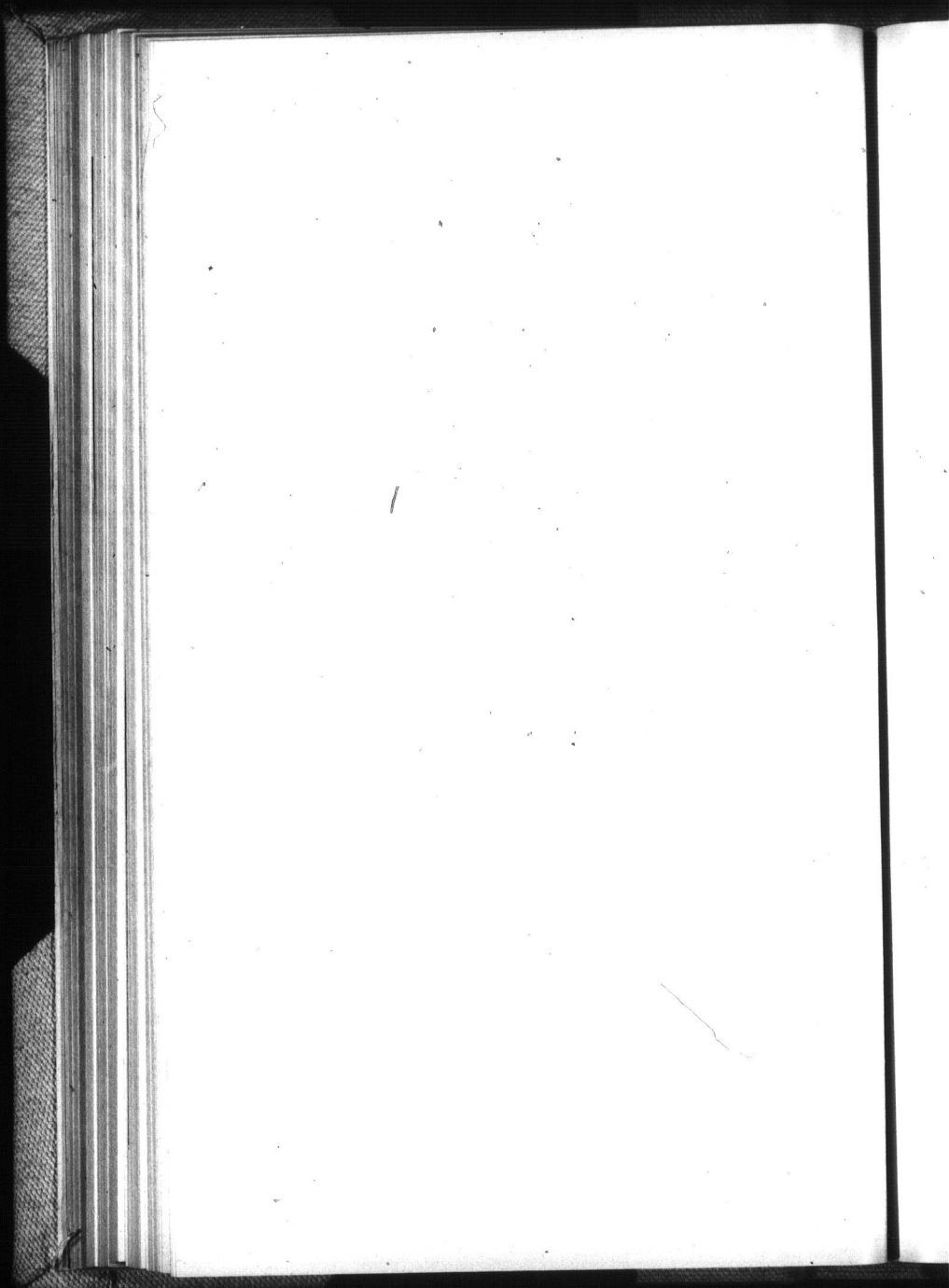

PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME.

There was a good attendance at the forty-fourth annual meeting of the Protestant Orphans' Home, held on Tuesday, June 4th, 1895. In the absence of His Worship the Mayor, Rev. Dr. Burns occupied the chair. There were also on the platform Drs. Burt and McConnell, Messrs. J. J. Kelso, Huson W. M. Murray and J. K. Macdonald, and Rev. Mr. Low. The various reports presented showed that the institution had had a successful year, and commenced the current year with a small financial balance on hand. The children, to the number of 202, sang several patriotic songs between the presentation of the reports, and gained for themselves hearty applause.

Mr. J. K. Macdonald read the annual report of the Managers, showing that during the year 78 children were admitted—28 girls and 50 boys. The average number of inmates was 205. 80 children were removed, 64 being taken by relatives, one boy died, one went to the hospital, 14 were placed out in families, one girl and eight boys were apprenticed, and three girls and two boys were adopted. The services of Miss Wheelwright, the matron, who has occupied the position for twenty-seven years, were spoken of in terms of warm praise. The Treasurer's report showed that the receipts for the year amounted to \$23,912.62, that sum including a balance of \$1,692.59 from the preceding year. The receipts also included bequests aggregating \$14,252.24; the city grant of \$2,000; the Government grant of \$1,432.32; Orange Order contributions, \$341.90; collections totalling \$1,752.30; relatives' contributions, \$1,169.50. The \$14,252.24 received as bequests was added to the capital fund, and of the balance of the revenue—\$9,660.38—\$9,264.29 was expended, leaving a revenue balance of \$393.09. Dr. McConnell read the medical report. It showed that only two cases of sickness had occurred, and that only one dollar and a half had been expended on medicines. The death referred to in the Managers' report was due to a complication of diseases.

W. M. Murray, Q.C.; Committee of Council, Bishop of Toronto, Rev. J. D. Cayley, Rev. Dr. Potts, Mr. Kivas Tulley, Mr. S. C. Duncan Clark, Major Bennett, Mr. W. B. McMurrich, Mr. Henry Cawthra, Mr. A. R. Creelman, Mr. Hart A. Massey; Matron, Miss Wheelwright. All the reports were adopted unanimously, and hearty votes of thanks were passed to officers and Managers for the way in which the work was conducted last year, and to the chairman.

At the close of the meeting light refreshments were served, after which those present made a tour around the building. All expressed themselves as highly satisfied with the appearance of the rooms and the general home-like air of the place. Some of the little girls will give a cooking demonstration in the Pavilion on Saturday afternoon next.

THE FORTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME, TORONTO, 1895.

The Lady Managers have again the pleasure of presenting their Annual Report to your Worship and to the public, with truly thankful hearts for all the blessings which a kind Providence has showered upon the Home during the past year. The greatest of these blessings has been health; for with the exception of the death of one little boy of six years, whose case was complicated, the health of the large household has been very satisfactory.

Seventy-eight children have been admitted, 28 girls and 50 boys, coming chiefly from the city, except 10; 3 born in Unionville, 2 in Clinton, 2 in Campbellford, 1 in Brockville, 1 each in U.S. and Ireland.

By religious denomination:—46 Church of England, 21 Methodist, and 11 Presbyterian.

Average for 11 months, 205, total of inmates, 211.

Of the children removed, 80 in number (made up of 28 girls and 62 boys), 64 have been taken by relatives, 1 died, 1 went to the hospital and 14 have been placed out in families; 1 girl and 8 boys apprenticed; 3 girls and 2 boys adopted.

[Synopsis of the month of May, 1895, not included in the report read, owing to the Secretary's absence in England:—Admitted 6 children—3 boys, 3 girls—2 Baptists, 1 Methodist, 3 Protestant, not otherwise specified. Discharged 3 children—2 boys, 1 girl. The 2 boys were taken by relatives, and 1 girl apprenticed. Number of children 200. Total number of inmates 211.]

A brother and a sister included in those taken by friends were sent for, after an absence of nearly four years, to the Sault Ste. Marie, where the members of Keystone Lodge had proved themselves most valuable friends, meeting all the expenses in a liberal manner, and securing a position for the girl in a private family, and for the boy in a lawyer's office. They expressed themselves much pleased with the progress the children had made in the Home.

The advantages of manual training in school having been exemplified in other places, a hope was expressed of having it in the Orphans' Home School. However, Mr. Hughes advised waiting until further information was obtained from the Government.

The Council of Women having asked for representatives from the Board, five members were elected to attend the meetings, which continue to be of much interest. Not to be behind the times, 150 words were put into the *Woman's Globe*, telling of the working of the Institution.

During the year some interest was felt in the proposed new Western Hospital; however, nothing having been done in the matter, and feeling desirous of showing an appreciation of the kind services of the Medical Staff, some slight improvements were added for their convenience at the Home, and a cheque of fifty dollars each sent to Dr. McConnell, Dr. Burt and Dr. Hunter.

The only case of stammering is now under the care of Mr. Church, at his Auto-Voce School, with a marked improvement already. The Managers will not regret the outlay of \$35.00, which was the lowest charge Mr. Church would make, if the boy is cured.

The Lady Managers regret very much that the City Council found it necessary to reduce the amount of the annual grant to the Home.

Very good accounts have been received about the children who are out in the country, while the following extract from a letter will speak for itself, from a young man, now in Manitoba: "I have not yet forgotten the glorious Old Home where I put in my younger days, and think I never shall as long as I live. I must say they were better days than what I spent after I left it."

It will be quite in keeping with this friendly expression of feeling from a former inmate, to make mention of the long and faithful services of Miss Wheelwright, who has been the Matron for twenty-seven years, and to whose excellent supervision, so much success has been due. The staff under her also deserve words of praise for their untiring efforts.

To the Medical staff, the Lady Managers offer their most sincere thanks, also to Miss Johnstone of the kitchen garden classes, and the lady teachers in the school, as well as the S.S. teachers; and also to Huson Murray, Q.C., their solicitor, for his invaluable advice and counsel on all points of law, and in times of difficulty.

The children have had many pleasant outings during the year, for which they were indebted to the Steamboat Companies and Toronto Street Railway. They desire to thank all the trades people and others who have generously contributed to the funds, and also Mrs. Carlyle for her treat of ice cream.

A great improvement has been effected by building a stair case and fitting up the top storey, which allows of four good sized

rooms. This was decided upon, not with a view of taking in greater numbers, but to add to the convenience of the large family already beneath the roof. A good hardwood floor was also put down in one of the boys' dormitories. This extra outlay was considered feasible owing to the receipt of a legacy from the late Mr. Moses Henry. There is something very touching in the thought that this benefactor, who lived so simply and suffered so much, should wish to leave *all* that he possessed for the benefit of the orphan children. He was alone in the world. Eight of the boys, with subdued demeanor, were chief mourners, following to St. James' Cemetery, where he was laid to rest, close to the plot of ground reserved for the orphans. A suitable memorial of red granite bears the following inscription:—"In memory of Moses Henry, aged 64, native of Ireland, who bequeathed all his property to the Protestant Orphans' Home, Toronto. This stone is erected by the Lady Managers in grateful remembrance of his kindness. 'Blessed is he that considereth the poor and needy, the Lord will deliver him in the time of trouble.—Psalm xli.'"
