The human body demands from the food daily about 109 grams of protten, 50 grams of fat, and 450 grams carbohydrate. In 100 sgrams of bread there are 7.8 grams of assimilable protein, 1.3 grams fat, and 53.1 grams carbohydrate, so that to get the necessary amount of protein from bread a man would have to eat about 1,300 grams of breadabout 3 pounds—a day.
