



### CANADIANS ARE SAVING MONEY.

Forty-four years ago, in 1867, the loans of Canadian banks amounted to only \$55.469,521, and as recently as December, 1900, they aggregated only \$362,004.795. This growth becomes more noteworthy when it is remembered that the Canadian banks are forbidden to lepd on real estate. Canadians are, however, heavy investors in their own securities, and the banks show remarkable growth in deposite, which have grown from \$37,484,172 in 1868 to \$1,041,569,269 in 1910. Of course that is a long time, but the increase in deposite since 1900 shows a remarkable increase and indicates that while the country is developing by leaps and bounds the people are actually saving money. The total savings in 1900 were \$375,720,752, whereas in 1910 they had grown to \$1,041,568,269.
