STRIKING TOGETHER THE BRITISH AND FRENCH WREST MORE GROUND FROM ENEMY ON THE SOMME

BRITISH DRIVE HUNS BACK A HALF MILE

Following Up Fierce Bombardment Infantry Storm German Trenches, Gain Footing on Bois de Trones and Advance in the Neighborhood of Orvillers.

French Deliver Attack on Village of Hardecourt and on Memelon, While British Make Drive at Bois de Trones, and in Half Hour Rout the Enemy.

London, July 8.—According to the Reuter correspondent at the press camp, British army in France, the British today on a considerable front, advanced half a mile in conjunction with the French. They also made considerable progress at Contalmaison, where the position is satisfactory. Berlin Admits Reverses.

Berlin, July 9, via London.—The war office report of today says the French and British are continuing their attacks on the Somme front. The Germans lost ground in Hardecourt village, but repelled other assaults, inflicting heavy losses on the Allies.

London, July 10.—The British troops have made "steady progress in the face of stubborn opposition" in the neighborhood of Ovillers, on the Somme front, according to

Gain Footing in The Bois De Trones

London, July 9 (12.50 p. m.)—British infantry after a fierce bombardment, stormed a line of trenches and gained a footing in the Bois de Trones, according to the British official statement issued late last night. An appreciable advance also was made in the neighborhood of Ovillers.

The text reads:

"The fighting today has been principally on our extreme right fiant, where further important successes were gained by our troops.

"To the east of Bernafay Wood, after a fierce preliminary bombardment, we stormed a line of trenches and gained lodgment in a strongly defended wood known as the Boies De Trones. There we captured 150 prisoners and several machine guns.

"The French on our right fiank greatly assisted our advance by the fire of their artillery.

"The enemy losses fom the combined Anglo-French bombardment were severe.

"A strong German counter-attack in mass, subsequently launched across the open against these captured positions, completely brobe down under the fire of 18-pounders and 75-millimetre guns. The enemy retired in disorder.





COPPERS STILL ON THE DECLINE

An Easier Tendency on Limited Dealings Evidenced by the Bond Market.

New York, July 8—Professional traders were in complete control of today's narrow and perfunctory market, virtually all offerings coming from that source. There was relatively heavy selling of such speculative issues as U. S. Industrial Alcohol and the more distinctive war stocks like the Equipments, New York Air Brake, Crucible Steel and Motors. Alcohol records an extreme decline of 3½ points, duplicating its low price of the year at 126½.

Coppers and affiliated shares continued their declining tendency of receivt days, but Mexicans were fairly steady, when not under severe pressure. Sugars and the shipping grouplost some ground, probably on further realizing for profits, but the more stable industrials, including United States Steel, and Lackawana Steel, were firm.

Ralls played no part worthy of comment, aside from considerable activity in Denver and Rio Grande preferred, which rose almost three points, with some reaction towards the close. New York, Chicago and St. Louis, the Nickel Plate, control of which was recently surrendered by New York Central interests, made a recession of four points to 39.

Total sales of stocks amounted to 153,000 shares.

The day's general news included further export inquiries for steel and iron, trade reports showing a moderate halt in prices in various lines of business, the decision of the federal court favoring the American Can Company and additional May statements of rallway earnings, including that of the Great Northern road, showing a net gain of about \$50,000.


