"The names of Non Residents having the right to vote on Freehold, shall be entored on the list for King's Ward: of Non-Residents having the right to vote as Freemen on the lists for the Wards in which they revised at the list for the Ward in which they revised at the list for the Ward in which they resided at the time of the General Assessment for the City and County Rates next preceding the preparation of such lists.

"No person shall be allowed to vote in any ward in "Ward unless his name is recorded on the List of Electors thereof.
