INFLUENCE OF ST. ALBAN'S.

The poverty of the Diocesan Cathedral has, as is well known, been a serious hindrance, delaying the attainment of the full measure of usefulness to which we look forward. Nevertheless it has gone steadily

forward, never faltering and never hesitating to take a step in advance when the occasion has arisen. There are, consequently, some things which in a measure compensate for the difficulties which we have had, and still have, to encounter. Not the least of these is the fact that St. Alban's has exercised an influence far beyond what might be expected from a Church of limited dimensions, and a Church Corporation without endowment and wholly wanting in the power which the possession of means confers. The Bishop has made reference, in recent sermons and speeches, to the changed condition of affairs as regards party spirit and party strife in his Diocese. Without overlooking or minimising other influences, we do not hesitate to assert that this most happy change is largely due to the planning and prosecuting by his Lordship of the Diocesan Cathedral scheme, of which St. Alban's is the visible centre. There are many who have vivid recollection of party strife of a quarter of a century ago, and of the fact that St. James' was the headquarters of the extremists of one party. If the Bishop had made St. James' his pro-Cathedral, as he was expected to do, he would have found it difficult in the extreme to dissociate himself from the party influences which prevailed there at that time. His desire and purpose to be the Bishop of the whole Diocese and not of a party, would no doubt have been quite as sincere in St. James' as it has been out of it, but it would not have been recognised or aided towards accomplishment by the people of the Diocese as it has been; he would inevitably have been regarded by most people as the Bishop of a party To refer to a less important matter: to the work accomplished in St. Alban's is due the great change in the character of the services in St. James', from an extreme of dreariness to a rendering much more befitting a large and important Church. It is also worthy of note that it is by St. Alban's that the Church has been chiefly upheld in what has become o e of the most important residential centres of Toronto, because it is the only Church in this district which maintains services and work in which people of widely different "views" may unite, and take part.

Every Church family should make it a rule to take a Church paper, and in particular, to give their support in this way to the paper of their own locality, when there is one. A Church paper, if well supported, is a powerful agent of the Church, and its value depends upon the support of those whose organ it is. St. Alban's has a special congregational interest in the Canadian Churchman (the only important Church paper published in Canada), and therefore the general obligation is in our case a particular one. Therefore, whoever elsewhere does or does not recognize and comply with the general obligation, each family of our congregation, or represented in it by the regular attendance of some of its members, should take note of the particular obligation and become a subscriber, if not so already.
