

"A Barrel of Money."

Who would'nt like to possess "a barrel of money?" Ah, yes, who would'nt? But to only a comparatively few of us, like Rothschilds, Vanderbilt, Gould, and newspaper men, is such great good luck vouchsafed; and the rest of humanity would be little more than able to get money enough, at one time to even buy the barrel. But if the majority of per-ple will never own a barrel of money, a good meny persons, at least, will have the opportunity to enjoy whatever satisfaction there is in seeing "A Barrel of Money," and of conjuring up the comfort that might be theirs if they actually possessed that quantity of filthy luore; and on the other hand of beholding the trouble, disadvantages and danger encountered by liberal possessions.
