LOYAL ORANGE INSTITUTION.

“Thou shalt teach men ordinances and laws, and shalt show them the way wherein they must walk and the work they must do; moreover thou shalt provide, out of all the people, able men, such as fear God, men of truth, hating covetousness, and place them to be rulers of thousands and rulers of hundreds and rulers of tens.”—*Exodus*, c. xviii., v. 20, 21.”

GENERAL DECLARATION.

At all times nothing can be more natural, and at this time nothing can be more reasonable, than that those who have common rights to protect and common interests to defend, should act together and know each other. It is by division that the benevolent objects of true patriots are frustrated, and their best and noblest efforts for the public good defeated. In these distant but important appendages of our Great Empire, it must be obvious to every loyal and reflecting mind, that an union of intelligence, an increase of means, and a knowledge of each other, are essential.

The LOYAL ORANGE INSTITUTION is formed by persons desirous of supporting, to the utmost of their power, the principles and practice of the Christian Religion, to maintain the Laws and Constitution of the Country, afford assistance to the distressed members of

the Order, and otherwise to promote such laudable and benevolent purposes as may tend to the due ordering of *Religion and Christian Charity*, and the supremacy of Law, Order, and Constitutional Freedom.

Its members associate in honor of *King William the III., Prince of Orange*, whose name they bear, and whose immortal memory they hold in reverence, tending as he did, under Divine Providence, to the overthrow of the most oppressive bigotry, and the restoration of pure Religion and Liberty. They revere the memory of that immortal Prince, not only as a Patriot, a Constitutional Monarch and a Hero, but as a true Christian; and hope, in the adoption of his name, to emulate his virtues, by maintaining RELIGION without persecution, or trenching upon the rights of any.

The Orange Society lays no claim to exclusive loyalty or exclusive protestantism, but admits no man within its pale whose principles are not loyal, and whose creed is not Protestant.

Disclaiming an intolerant spirit, the Society demands, as an indispensable qualification, without which the greatest and the wealthiest may seek admission in vain, that the candidate shall be believed to be incapable of persecuting or injuring any one, on account of his religious opinions; the duty of every Orangeman being to aid and defend all *loyal subjects*, of every religious persuasion, in the enjoyment of their Constitutional rights.

of the Institution, but to the whole community; there is no reserve, except the signs and symbols, whereby Orangemen know each other; and these mysteries are essential to the proper qualification of the Brotherhood, the recognition of the members, and the prevention of intrusion and imposture from strangers and enemies. The association is general, not confined to any particular place, person or nation, but extends itself wherever a Loyal Protestant Briton is to be found, to the remotest corners of the globe, for the establishment of Protestant faith and British Liberty, to the latest ages of posterity. Its whole institution is one neighborhood, within which every Orangeman is at home, in the farthest parts of the world; and such is the mechanism of the association that, while its operations are thus extended, its every movement is alike felt and answered in every part.

In short the Orange Institution, like a *glorious moral luminary*, is intended to pour its refulgence, not on *one part only* of the ample circumference of the British dominions, but simultaneously *on every portion*, equally *enlightening* the whole periphery.

The Institution, in these Colonies, can never be suppressed, but by means which would subvert the Constitution, and annihilate the connection with the Mother Country.

In many quarters, where the *true* nature of the Orange Institution is not properly known, its designs and objects have, by some, been misunderstood, and, by others, misrepresented. From the name it bears, being

connected in every one's mind with the history of parties in Ireland, some are apt to suppose that its sphere is necessarily confined, not reflecting that an instrument which has been chiefly used in the country of its birth to suppress rebellion, repel invasion, and secure domestic tranquillity, may be found equally efficacious to loyal men of *all countries*, in protecting their lives, liberties, and properties, in *these Colonies*. The Society is constituted upon the broadest principles of national freedom. *It takes its stand upon the glorious principles of the Revolution of 1688*; it lays its foundation in the field of British liberty; it disdains the badge of faction, and knows no emblem save the "*Allar and the Throne*."

As the Prince of Orange was invited to England by a coalition of parties, who were united by a common sense of their sacred duty to preserve their religion and liberties, so the Orange Society, named after that immortal Prince, invites a similar combination, and calls upon the sons of Britain to lay aside political feuds, and, like their illustrious ancestors, who signed and sealed the Great Covenant of Freedom, to sacrifice every private consideration, and establish a centralization of freedom, upon such a comprehensive basis as will enable every limb and fibre to receive vitality and nourishment from the parent stem.

QUALIFICATIONS

ESSENTIAL FOR A MEMBER OF THIS INSTITUTION.

He should have a sincere love and veneration for his Almighty Maker, productive of those lively and happy fruits—righteousness and obedience to his commands, a firm and steadfast faith in the Savior of the world, convinced that He is the only Mediator between a sinful creature and an offended Creator; his disposition should be humane and compassionate, and his behavior kind and conciliatory; he should be an enemy to savage brutality and every species of unchristian conduct; a lover of rational and improving society, faithfully regarding the Protestant Religion, and sincerely desirous to propagate its precepts, (*i. e.*) charity and good will to all men; zealous in promoting the honor, happiness and prosperity of his Queen and Country; heartily desirous of success in those pursuits, yet convinced that God alone can grant them; he should have an hatred of cursing and swearing, and of taking the name of God in vain; he should use all opportunities of discouraging them among his brethren, and shun the society of all persons addicted to those shameful practices; prudence should guide all his actions; temperance, sobriety and honesty direct his conduct, and the laudable objects of the Association be the motives of his endeavors.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

GRAND LODGE.

TITLE.

1. The Title of the Society is "The Loyal Orange Institution of British North America."

ADMISSION.

2. It consists of an unlimited number of Members, whose admission must be regulated in strict accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Society, and whose principles must be duly vouched for, as in conformity with the General Declaration and Qualifications essential for a member.

3. No person of improper character shall be deemed admissible as a Member of the Society.

4. All candidates for admission must be certified to as being eighteen years of age, and must be proposed by one and seconded by another member at one meeting, and admitted or rejected at a subsequent one, except in cases of extreme necessity.

5. That all votes upon the admission of Members shall be given *virâ voce*; that if there shall be over three negatives, the vote shall be considered conclusive; but

if only three, or under, the vote shall be submitted to a Committee of the Lodge, whose decision, made known to the Lodge by report, shall be final; provided always, that, if previous to or on the day of voting, it shall have been ascertained that the same individual has applied to two or more Lodges, it shall not be competent to withdraw the name from either; but the Master of that Lodge which shall first meet after the nomination, shall direct the Secretary, when the period arrives for voting upon the nomination in question, to enter the application—*“rejected for double application,”* of which proceeding the Master of the other Lodge or Lodges to which application was made, or applications were made, shall be notified; and when the name of the candidate comes up, the notification from the Lodge in which the record was made shall be read and entered, and shall be the end of all action on the case or cases. A violation of this rule shall subject the Lodge violating it to a penalty of 25s—to be recovered before the County Lodge, and applied to County purposes.

LODGES.

6. The Members of the Institution are divided into Lodges, in the manner hereinafter described.

7. All Lodges shall make an annual return of members, according to the form adopted by the Grand Lodge, which will be found attached to this book of Regulations.

8. Each Lodge shall be furnished by the Secretary

with copies of all Forms of Returns, at the expense of the Grand Lodge; and failing to make such Return, after having received said Forms, shall pay a fine of 5s into the District Lodge fund, and shall not receive the annual until this regulation be complied with.

9. Each Lodge shall pay 10s annually to the Grand Lodge, and shall not receive the annual until this Regulation be complied with.

10. Isolated Lodges, that is such Lodges as, by reason of distance, or any other circumstance, cannot be conveniently attached to any particular District, are to communicate directly with the Grand Master, or, under his orders, to attach themselves to such County as he may direct.

EXPULSIONS.

11. Expulsion shall take place for the following offences:—

i. For violating the obligations of Secrecy, of Signs, Passwords and Lectures.

ii. For violating the Rules and Regulations of the Grand Lodge.

iii. For maliciously destroying or taking away the property of the Institution.

iv. For following any immoral or unlawful practices for a living, upon conviction before the Lodge.

12. Trials for expulsion shall take place as hereinafter specified—all due forms being observed, as laid down in the Regulations of the Grand Lodge to that effect.

13. The names of all persons expelled from the Institution by the Private, District or County Lodges, must be reported to the Grand Lodge, together with the cause of expulsion.

14. In issuing process for the trial of any delinquent, the summons shall be signed by the Master, and countersigned by the Secretary. Each Lodge having the right to fix its own rate of charges and costs for such matters.

15. Any member who shall utter, print, publish or circulate, or who shall cause to be printed, published or circulated, or be privy to the printing, publishing or circulating, of any matter or thing derogatory to the Institution, or the character of any of its officers, or any person divulging or communicating any matter, proceeding or thing, or the substance or meaning of any matter, proceeding or thing, had or transpired in open Lodge, to any person not being an actual member in attendance on some Lodge of the Institution, under

warrant, whether the facts transpired or the business transacted, were in his presence so transacted or transpired, or whether communicated to him by a Brother, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of his obligation, and shall be expelled or otherwise dealt with, as the majority of the Lodge shall determine.

WARRANTS.

16. All applications for Warrants must be made to the District Master, and through him to the County Master, thence to the Grand Officers.

17. That every application for a new Warrant shall be made by at least six Members, (who shall draw their certificates for that purpose,) five of whom shall be of the Purple Order, and who shall set forth in their application the name of the Brother who is to be made the Master, and also the place where the said Lodge is to be held; and which place of meeting cannot be changed without the sanction of the District Master; in all cases where persons are admitted to membership in the Institution, for the express purpose of forming a Lodge, the initiatory fees paid by them shall be paid over to the new Lodge, as soon as the warrant shall have been received. That any Master or Brother in charge of a Warrant, who shall lend or use the same for opening or holding any other private Lodge than the one for which said Warrant was issued, or who shall give a copy or duplicate of the same, and which copy or duplicate shall be used by any individual, whether a

And any Brother acting under a Warrant so lent, or a copy or duplicate so given, shall likewise be suspended for three years, or expelled; and the Brethren are prohibited from acknowledging any individual thus surreptitiously initiated; and any officer giving the annual to any of the offending parties, or to any of the surreptitiously introduced members, shall be considered equally guilty, and shall be suspended for three years; the County Officers to institute process, and the County Lodge to examine into the case or cases, and report the same fully to the first Meeting of the Grand Lodge.

FORMS, RITUALS, &c.

18. That a book of Forms and Rituals, with appropriate Charges, as published by the Grand Lodge, and that no other forms be used, but such as are contained in it.

19. That one copy of such Book of Forms and Rituals, shall be kept in the Lodge Room of each Lodge, and shall *never* be taken from the Chest, except for use, or for cases of Initiation or Installation.

20. The Dress, Insignia, and other Decorations of the various Orders, shall be such as, and none other, than shall be set forth in the book of Forms and Rituals, as contemplated by the 18th section of this Division of the Rules and Regulations.

21. No decoration shall be worn in any Lodge, as appertaining to the Order, except the bearer be strictly entitled thereto.

22. That the forms of Certificates and Summonses, as given in the Schedule hereunto affixed, and none other, to be the forms used by the Institution.

DEGREES.

23. That there be five Degrees in the Order of Orangeism; the first four of which shall be conferred only by the Master, Deputy Master, or, in case of their absence, the Senior Committeeman.

24. That the Degrees are:—

- i. Orange.
- ii. Purple.
- iii. Blue.
- iv. Royal Arch Mark.
- v. Scarlet.

25. The Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master and Treasurer, Grand Secretary, Grand Chaplain, and Grand Lecturer, shall have power to confer the Degrees of Purple, Blue, Royal Arch Mark and Scarlet, but always in due rotation, as provided by the Regulations hereinafter; but the Brethren upon whom the Degrees are thus conferred, shall be members attached to some Lodge, then meeting under Warrant. The power by this Regulation conferred on the Grand Officers, to curtail probationary time, to be used only in cases of

necessity, by the Regulation of the Ritual of the presence of the requirements

26. That any Brother giving any of the Degrees, or part thereof, unless fully and duly authorized to give them, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of his obligation, and shall be dealt with accordingly.

27. That at least three months shall elapse between the conferring of each Degree, except where otherwise provided, and in no instance shall it be lawful to give any Degree out of rotation; and any Lodge or Grand Officer infringing on this regulation, shall pay a fine of not less than one pound, nor more than five pounds, to be paid to the County fund; the process to issue on the Master or Senior Officer for the time being when such infringement took place.

APPOINTMENTS.

28. All appointments in the Institution, of whatever nature soever, are subject to the approval of the Grand Lodge.

DISPUTES.

29. Any dispute arising between two Private Lodges, or between two District Lodges, shall be referred to the County Lodge for adjustment; its award, in such disputes, being final.

ELECTION OF GRAND OFFICERS.

30. The Grand Lodge shall meet on the third Tuesday in June in every year, in such place as they shall appoint, and elect for the year :

- 1 A Grand Master.
- 2 Four Junior Deputy Grand Masters.
- 3 A Grand Treasurer.
- 4 A Grand Secretary.
- 5 A Deputy Grand Secretary.
- 6 A Grand Chaplain.
- 7 A Deputy Grand Chaplain.
- 8 A Grand Lecturer, and
- 9 The Members of the Grand Committee.

31. The Members entitled to sit and vote at the Grand Lodge are :

- out All present Grand Officers.
- All last Past Grand Officers, actual Members of a Private Lodge, which Private Lodge shall have complied with all the Regulations of the Order.
- County Masters. *officers*
- District Masters.
- Masters of Private Lodges, or the special Proxies of Lodges ; no Brother being competent to hold the office of Proxy, who is a Master or Member of a non-conforming Lodge.
- out Members of the Grand Committee, who shall be Members of some Private Lodge under Warrant. And no one shall be allowed to take part in the Business, who is not entitled to a vote.

32. No office appointed shall act in any capacity having first received the sanction of any Member of the Grand Lodge, and twelve Grand Officers shall receive the first

34. Members shall meet yearly, in addition to the Grand Lodge. Provided always that the Grand Committee which has no meetings, and any Master of the Grand Lodge, of this section

32. No Member of the Grand Lodge, to whatever office appointed, can be allowed to take his seat, or to act in any capacity, under such appointment, without having first paid all dues required by the Regulations, and received the Five Orders of the Institution. Nor shall any Member be eligible to be elected to any of the first twelve Grand Offices, who has not at the same time received the first Four Degrees.

33. The Grand Master shall appoint a Tyler for the Grand Lodge, who shall receive 15s a-day, for every day's service.

34. Members of the Grand Committee shall pay yearly, in advance, Five Shillings to the Grand Lodge. Provided always that no Brother shall be placed on the Grand Committee, who does not belong to a Lodge which has made its regular returns, holds its regular meetings, and pays its Grand Lodge Dues. Nor shall any Master of a Lodge be entitled to vote or act in the Grand Lodge, who has not complied with the requisitions of this section.

35. All Members of the Order, being Members of the Grand Lodge, shall, as soon as convenient, procure Scarlet Gowns, trimmed with Orange, Purple, and Blue Fringe.

DUTY OF GRAND MASTER.

36. The Grand Master may at any time direct the summoning of an emergent Meeting of the Grand Lodge

and he shall at all times do so, when required by a Requisition signed by any two of the Deputy Grand Masters, or by any six Masters of Private Lodges, with one County or District Master, in all cases stating the object for which such meeting is required, and for all meetings of the Grand Lodge at least twelve day's notice must be given.

37. When the Grand Lodge is not in Session, the affairs of the Institution are directed by the Grand Master, who is head, and all members are under his immediate guidance and control. His designation and that of the Senior Deputy Grand Master shall be, "THE RIGHT WORSHIPFUL;" and his Council shall consist of the Grand Officers of the Institution. Whenever his opinion is required upon matters of the Institution, his judgment shall be given in writing, which shall be acted upon, unless reversed by the Grand Lodge.

38. Any vacancy created in the office of Grand Master, either by the death of the person filling it, by his permanent absence from the Province, or any other cause, shall be filled by the Senior Deputy Grand Master.

39. All Chapters and Committees of the Grand Lodge to be appointed by the Grand Master, by and with the consent of the Grand Lodge.

resident in New Brunswick, one in Nova Scotia, and one in Canada East, each having power to call an assemblage of County and District Masters, and Masters of Private Lodges, for the purpose of electing a Local Grand Secretary, a Local Grand Treasurer, and a Local Grand Chaplain, and to pass such other Local Regulations as may be deemed requisite, not contrary or repugnant to the Rules and Regulations of the Grand Lodge.

GRAND LECTURER.

41. That it shall be the Grand Lecturer's duty to visit every County once in every year, and shall at a County Lodge, give Lectures of the different Degrees, and whose duty it shall further be, to see that the Grand Lodge dues in arrears are paid; and for that duty the sum of _____ shall be allowed him for his expences and loss of time.

GRAND TREASURER.

42. The funds of the Institution are lodged in the hands of the Grand Treasurer, and that Officer shall produce his Books and Accounts at every Annual Meeting of the Grand Lodge, when the same shall be examined and Audited by three Masters.

INSTALLATION OF GRAND OFFICERS.

43. There shall be a Public Installation of all the Grand Officers, after the Grand Lodge business has closed, at such convenient place, as may be determined on, and according to the Form in such cases prepared.

PRECEDENCE OF MEMBERS.

44. The precedence of all Officers in the Institution, is decided in the following order:—

- i. The Grand Master.
- ii. The last Past Grand Master.
- iii. The Deputy Grand Master.
- iv. The last Past Deputy Grand Master.
- v. The Junior Grand Masters, by seniority.
- vi. The President of the Grand Committee, and Members of the Chapter.
- vii. The Grand Chaplain.
- viii. The Grand Treasurer.
- ix. The Grand Secretary.
- x. The Grand Lecturer.
- xi. The Deputy Grand Chaplain.
- xii. The Deputy Grand Treasurer.
- xiii. The Deputy Grand Secretary.

GRAND OFFICERS.

44. The Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master, Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Chaplain, and President of the Grand Committee, and Grand Lecturer, are *ex officio* members of all Lodges they may visit, and are entitled to exercise all the rights and powers of their respective offices therein, except in the distribution of their funds, the election of officers, and the By-Laws of the Lodge.

GRAND LODGE, WHEN AND WHERE HELD.

45. No Meeting of the Grand Lodge can be held except the Grand Master, or a Deputy Grand Master, or the President of the Grand Committee, presides at such meeting, and except also, that at least twelve Members of the Royal Scarlet Order be present.

46. Visitors, being of the Royal Scarlet Order, may

be admitted to the Meetings of the Grand Lodge, with the approbation of the Officer presiding.

47. That at all Meetings of the Grand Lodge, County Lodges, and District Lodges, before an adjournment, it shall be determined by a vote in said Lodges, where the next Meeting shall be held.

48. That the Grand Lodge shall not change or alter its Rules and Regulations except at the Annual Meeting, or at a Special Meeting called for the purpose.

APPEALS.

49. That in all cases where pains and penalties are inflicted, by the Regulations of the Grand Lodge, the parties shall have the right to appeal in every instance to the District Lodge, then to the County, then to the Riding, and lastly to the Grand Lodge.

5. The Junior Deputy Grand Master of each Riding, shall be the presiding officer at all the Riding Meetings; but, in case of his absence, the Lodge shall have power to choose a temporary Chairman.

6. Members entitled to vote in the respective Riding Lodges, are—

i. The Officers of such Lodges.

- ii. County Masters and Deputy County Masters.
- iii. District Masters and Deputy District Masters.
- iv. Masters of Private Lodges, or, in case of unavoidable absence, a Delegate.
- v. Members of the Grand Committee, residing within the limits of their respective Ridings.
- vi. All Officers of the Grand Lodge.

7. The Riding Lodges shall have power to hear and determine appeals from County Lodges; to alter, confirm or amend the same; to try delinquent County Officers; to pass such necessary Rules and Regulations for a due enforcement of the powers entrusted to them; to levy dues for their own purposes, and to do all things requisite and necessary for the proper government of their Lodge, and the carrying out of such Regulations as they may deem necessary, not inconsistent with, or contrary to, the regulations of the Grand Lodge.

8. It shall be the duty of the Deputy Grand Master of each Riding, to transmit annually, on the 1st of May, to the Grand Secretary, a Report of the state of each Lodge within his Riding, showing the number of Members of each Lodge, the date of each Warrant and the place of meeting; which information he is required to seek from County and District Masters, who are hereby directed to furnish such necessary information, and all other information that may be required of them.

9. No such Riding shall be held without the necessary officers for the year past.

10. All such Appeals shall be heard by the Deputy Grand Master, or such other Officer as may be necessary, and the same shall be reported to the Grand Lodge.

11. All such Appeals shall be heard unless appealed from.

12. The Grand Lodge shall have power to alter, amend, confirm or amend the same; to try delinquent County Officers; to pass such necessary Rules and Regulations for a due enforcement of the powers entrusted to them; to levy dues for their own purposes, and to do all things requisite and necessary for the proper government of their Lodge, and the carrying out of such Regulations as they may deem necessary, not inconsistent with, or contrary to, the regulations of the Grand Lodge.

1. The Grand Lodge shall be held on the first day of the year.

9. No Lodge shall be allowed to be represented in each Riding Lodge, that has not paid its *dues*, and made the necessary returns required by the Regulations for the year preceding.

10. All Lodges within their respective Ridings, shall seek whatever information they may require, from the Deputy Grand Master of the Riding, who, if necessary, shall communicate with the Grand Master.

11. All decisions made by the Riding shall be final, unless appealed from.

12. That each Riding shall have power to appoint a Grand Lecturer, who, after appointment, shall be subject to the orders of the Grand Master. The Ridings shall also have power to pass any Rules or Regulations, not contrary to the Regulations of the Grand Lodge, that may be required to carry out these regulations in an efficient manner.

COUNTY LODGES.

1. The County Lodge for the election of Officers, shall be held on the first Monday of February, in each year.

2. County Officers, District Officers, Masters, Deputy Masters of Private Lodges, or such other persons as the Lodge may depute, last Past and present Masters and Deputy Masters, the Senior Committee-man of each Lodge, and all members of the Grand Committee, are entitled to sit and vote in the County Lodge, and shall attend all County Meetings, when duly summoned.

3. Any Member of the County Lodge, failing to attend, and not assigning any good reason for non-attendance, shall be admonished or fined, at the discretion of the Lodge; the fine not to exceed five shillings.

4. At the Annual Meeting, at which all those who are entitled to a seat and vote, shall attend without notice, the Lodge shall elect—

6. That upon any complaint being made, by not less than five Members of a Lodge against a District Officer, or against the Master or Deputy Master of any Private Lodge, it shall be the duty of the County Master to call a County Meeting within a reasonable time, not to exceed one month after such complaint shall have been made, and summon the party complained of to appear, and shall, at the same time, notify the parties complaining to attend, in order to substantiate his or their complaint.

7. Should the complaining Brother or Brethren fail to appear, without assigning any reason, then shall the Lodge acquit the Brother or Brethren complained of, and shall, at their discretion, fine the complaining Brother or Brethren 10s; or should the charge turn out to be frivolous or vexatious, the Lodge may, in addition to the said fine, suspend the delinquent Brother or Brethren.

8. Should the defending Brother or Brethren fail to appear, without assigning any reason, then shall the Lodge proceed to examine witnesses, and to adjudge the case; and may, according to their opinions, in any matter, not distinctly coming under the special provisions of the Grand Lodge, inflict a fine in a sum not exceeding 10s; but, in all other matters, shall proceed upon the penalties set forth by the Grand-Lodge Regulations.

9. That any member of any Lodge shall be required to attend as a witness, upon being summoned by the Master of his own Lodge.

10. That in all such cases, the County Master shall summon the meeting of the County Lodge, at some proper place, most convenient to all parties, except when decided otherwise at a previous County Meeting.

11. Members of County Lodges must have, at least, the Orange, Purple, Blue, and Royal Arch Purple Degrees.

12. At a County Meeting, a fee may be established, for County purposes; and when so established, the Lodges and Officers within its limits, shall be held liable for the same, under such regulations as may be adopted.

13. That whenever any Lodge becomes dormant by the non-attendance of members, or from any other cause, the Warrant, Lodge Chest and other property of said Lodge, may at once be taken into possession by the County Master, with the advice of the County Lodge, in the name and on behalf of the County Lodge to which such Lodge has been attached; and any claims for rent which may be standing against such property or Warrant, shall be liquidated by such County Lodge so taking possession, and any person or persons applying for such Warrant or property thereafter, shall

14. Any Lodge not meeting for six consecutive months, shall be considered dormant.

DISTRICT LODGES.

1. The Annual Meeting for the election of District Officers, shall be held on the second Tuesday in January in each year.

2. Each District Lodge shall elect, for the year, a District Master, Deputy District Master, District Treasurer and District Secretary.

3. That the Master, Deputy Master, Treasurer, Secretary and Senior Committee-man, and all last Past Officers of Private Lodges, and all members of the Grand Committee, shall be entitled to sit and vote within the limits of their respective Districts.

4. District Masters shall visit the several Lodges

within their Districts, as often as convenient, and at least once in every year, and shall have the power to correct all irregularities, taking for their guide the Regulations of the Grand Lodge.

5. Any person being an Orangeman, and having withdrawn from constant and regular attendance, by Certificate or otherwise, and thereafter being deemed guilty of any crime unworthy the character of an Orangeman, his case shall be considered by the District Lodge; and if, after such consideration, it shall be decided that the charge involves expulsion, then he shall be notified, by the District Secretary, that the charge or charges preferred against him, will be heard and examined into at the next ensuing County Lodge, and that he is required to appear with his Certificate, to answer such charges; in case of his non-appearance and proof of the service of the notice having been made, then the decision of the District Lodge, as to the penalty of expulsion, shall be affirmed, and notice thereof shall be given to all parties concerned.

6. The District Master shall have the power to cause any subordinate officer to be summoned before the District Lodge, for any refusal to obey his orders, given in conformity with the Rules and Regulations of the Grand Lodge, and such summons shall be proceeded with, in manner and form, as pointed out in the Regulations for County Lodges.

8. It shall also be the duty of the District Master to see that the annual returns are made, and the Grand Lodge dues paid, by Private Lodges, within three months after the annual election of Officers of Private Lodges.

9. It shall further be the duty of the District Master to report to the County Master such Lodges as have not made their returns, or have not paid their Grand Lodge dues.

10. That the powers conferred and the duties imposed upon the District Master, may be exercised and performed by the Deputy District Master, and, in the absence of both, the said powers and duties may be exercised and performed by the senior member of the Lodge present.

11. Members of the District Lodges must have, at least, the Degrees of Orange, Purple and Blue.

12. At a District Meeting, a fee may be established, for District purposes, and, when so established, the Lodges and Officers within its limits shall be held liable for the same, under such regulations as may be adopted.

PRIVATE LODGES.

WARRANTS.

1. No Lodge can be opened without a Warrant from the Grand Lodge of British North America, for which the sum of One Pound shall be paid.

2. All Lodges under Warrant, must have a Master and Deputy Master, a Treasurer, a Secretary, and, as soon as possible, five Committee-men.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

3. The Election of Officers shall take place at the December Monthly Meeting in each year, and the Officers then chosen shall enter on the duties of their respective offices on the first Monthly Meeting in January next ensuing, when they shall be Installed.

4. That if in case of accident, necessity or any other justifiable cause, an Election should not take place, on the night specified in the 3rd Rule of this section of the Regulations, then it shall be lawful for the Master, or Senior Officer, for the time being, to call a Special Meeting for the purpose, as early as possible, or to leave such Election to the first Monthly Meeting that may take place after the meeting fixed for December.

6. That in case of a change of Officers, it shall be the duty of the Past Master, on the night of the Installation; to install the Master elect, who shall then install the other Officers of the Lodge, agreeable to the forms laid down in the Rules and Regulations.

7. A majority of the members present shall be sufficient to elect a Master and the other Officers.

8. In case of death or resignation of the Master elected by the Lodge, then the Deputy Master shall take his place, and the Senior Committee-man shall take the place of the Deputy Master, and the Lodge shall elect another Committee-man, who shall be the junior, the Committee-men rising by the vacancy; and in the same manner shall all other vacancies be filled, by calling the senior Committee-man to the vacant office—except the office of Secretary and Treasurer; in which case the Lodge shall make an election.

ADMISSION.

6. Upon the Admission of a member, the Recording Officer shall take down his name, age, residence and profession; and all persons applying for admission, must make application, in writing, to the Lodge held nearest to his place of residence, or by Certificate from the Master of such nearest Lodge, to such other Lodge as he may particularly desire to join, and this prohibition shall be extended to conferring Degrees; so that a Member shall only be entitled to receive the various

Degrees in his own Lodge; and any Master acting contrary to this Regulation, shall be subject to a fine of not less than 5s, nor more than 15s; and if the infraction of this Rule be for initiation, then the party initiated shall be considered suspended for 12 months; during which time he shall not enjoy any of the privileges of an Orangeman; and if the infraction shall be in the case of conferring a Degree, then the Brother who shall have so received the Degree, shall be deprived of further advancement for 12 months. In both cases the members must return to the orders of the Lodge within which they reside; Provided always, that if, from circumstances, a Lodge may not be in Session, it may be lawful for the nearest Lodge to initiate a Member or to confer Degrees, upon receiving the Certificate from the Master of the Lodge held within the division where the candidate lives; and Provided further, that if it shall transpire, after a candidate shall have been elected, that he has been guilty of a double application, the party shall be examined before the Committee of the Lodge, and the facts of the case shall be reported. Should the charge be maintained, upon the report of the Committee being read, in open Lodge, the Worshipful Master or the Brother presiding, shall direct the Brother to be suspended; which order shall be in full force, until reported upon by a Committee of the Grand Lodge. LODGES.

11. That each Lodge shall have power to make its own By-Laws, to carry out more fully and minutely the Rules and Regulations of the Grand Lodge. They shall also have power to establish such By-Laws, under pains and penalties, to enforce a due observation of their own Regulations, to protect Committee-men and other Officers in the discharge of their duties, to punish by fine, suspension or expulsion, any disobedience to the orders or summons of the Lodge, or of the Committee, and for all things necessary for the orderly conduct and good government of the Lodge; Provided that no Master shall receive the nomination of any one for membership, unless such nomination be accompanied by a written application from the person nominated, which application shall be dated in writing, so far as relates to the day of the month; and Provided, that a sum of no less than 2s 6d be deposited with the application.

12. No business connected with the affairs of the Society, shall be transacted except in open Lodge, and guarded by a Tyler; and not less than six members shall be considered a quorum.

13. That it shall not be lawful for any Lodge to

adjourn for more than five weeks at a time, and to the end that this question of longer adjournment may not be discussed, the Master or Officer presiding at any Meeting of a Lodge shall not be permitted to put such a Resolution to the Meeting, under a penalty of 5s, to be inflicted upon him by summons, before the District Lodge; the fine to be paid to the District fund.

14. The Master of a Lodge may, at any time call a Meeting of emergency.

15. Every Lodge shall keep a book in which shall be inscribed, from time to time, all the Rules, Orders and Regulations and Reports of the Grand Lodge.

16. Previous to opening the Lodge, the Master shall cause every one in the room to be examined, and no one shall be allowed to remain, while the Lodge is open, who is not fully qualified to pass himself as a member.

17. It shall not be lawful for any Lodge to admit a Brother who is not a regular member, nor to allow one to deposite his Certificate, when such Certificate has been obtained surreptitiously, under the penalty of 20s, to be paid to such funds as shall be directed by a County Lodge, whose Officers shall try and adjudge the case; and in no case shall a Lodge be required to return a certificate when the Master, in his opinion, or the Lodge, in its opinion, deem that the good of the Society requires that it be withheld.

18. Any Brother who shall, at any time, make use of the Institution for a political or other purpose, without the sanction of the authorities of the Institution, shall be subject to expulsion, or such other punishment as the Grand Lodge may direct.

19. Every Member, on entering, shall make a full stop in front of the Master, and give the sign of the Order then at work.

20. The following shall be the order for business in a Private Lodge :

- i. The Lodge to be opened with Prayer.
- ii. The Lecture to be repeated.
- iii. Minutes of former Meeting read.
- iv. Members to be proposed.
- v. Members to be initiated.
- vi. Public business, connected with the principles, honor or prosperity of the Institution, discussed.
- vii. Lecture repeated.
- viii. The Lodge closed with Prayer.

21. Whenever a member has been initiated, he shall be put in charge of some Brother, who shall be accountable for his conduct, and for his due progress in the Order.

22. When the Worshipful the Master is absent, then shall the Deputy Master preside ; when both these are absent, then the senior Committee-man present ; and

in case of the absence of all five Committee-men, then the Lodge may elect one from amongst the Brethren in attendance, to preside.

ANNUAL.

23. The Annual shall be communicated by the Master of every Private Lodge to the members of his Lodge, but he is strictly forbidden to communicate the same to any member in default for his dues.

24. No member shall receive the Annual at any Lodge, but that of which he is a member; nor shall any Master give the Annual to any member of the Order, except to the members of his own Lodge. Any Master or other officer violating this order, shall be fined 20s before the District Lodge.

DEGREES.

25. It is the particular duty of the Master to see that no Brother be advanced to a degree, who has been guilty of cursing, swearing, and drinking to excess, or who has not worthily, in all matters, conducted himself as he should have done, in those already conferred.

CERTIFICATE.

26. Any member wishing to withdraw his Certificate, shall, in the first place, pay the fee for the same, which, having been paid for, may be granted forthwith, in case of necessity, by the officers of the Lodge; provided there be no known objections to the Brother receiving

the Certificate ; but, in no case, to be retained longer than one month from the date of the application to the Lodge in session, if there be no charge of impropriety against the applicant, or no just grounds for withholding the same ; Provided always, that no demands for dues shall be made after a legal demand upon the Lodge for a Certificate ; the member demanding the same having previously paid all his just dues.

SECRETARY.

27. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep the records of his Lodge, to enter all the proceedings in the form they take place, in open Lodge, and shall obtain the Master's signature, at the end of each session, he, the Secretary, countersigning the same. He shall make out all returns, in manner provided by the Grand Lodge, and shall conform, in all things, to the regulations, in keeping his books and entries, and to perform any other duties which his own Private Lodge may impose upon him.

TREASURER.

28. The Treasurer shall receive all moneys, and shall balance his accounts as often as the By-Laws of his own private Lodge shall direct, and shall, in no case, pay out money without the order or under the regulations of the Lodge. He shall also be the guardian of all the other property of the Lodge of which he is a member, unless the Lodge may assign such duties to other officers.

COMMITTEE.

29. The Committee are appointed to try any case of defalcation, under the By-Laws of Private Lodges, to enquire into the reputation of candidates, whether submitted to them by a negative vote or not. They are to be guided as well by the By-Laws of their own Lodge as by the regulations of the Grand Lodge—the latter governing in all cases where provisions are made; and the report of such Committee may either be confirmed, amended or rejected. The Committee shall, in all cases, report by resolution, which resolution shall set forth the conclusion they have arrived at, from the testimony before them, with their recommendation in the premises.

TYLER.

30. The Tyler's post shall be outside the Lodge Room door, and is appointed under the By-Laws of the Private Lodge; but he shall, before taking his post, undergo examination by the Master, to see if he is qualified to receive, as well as to reject, applicants for admission. The Grand Lodge will not object to any regulation by which Tylers may be paid.

31. After the Lodge is opened, no person shall be admitted without giving the Annual to the outward Tyler; and should the Tyler admit any one without the Annual, he shall be subject to a fine of one shilling and three pence.

32. Any Tyler, whether within or without, who shall leave his post without permission, shall be subject to a fine of one shilling and three pence.

33. Any Tyler allowing a brother to leave the room, without the sanction of the Master, shall be subject to a fine of one shilling and three pence.

EXPULSIONS.

34. Any member who shall be in default for six months, and who shall remain in default for one month after demand for payment has been made to him, shall be suspended or expelled, at the discretion of the Lodge.

35. It shall be the duty of the Master, or the Officer presiding at a Lodge, after the dues of the night have been collected to call for a return of all those who have been six months in arrear, and direct the Treasurer to make a demand for payment; and it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to make such demand of payment and report, on every case, at the next monthly meeting, when process shall be ordered to issue against all the defaulters, to appear before the next monthly meeting.

34. It shall not be lawful for any member to absent himself, without excuse, from more than three regular monthly meetings, and upon the attention of the Master being called to the fact of a longer absence, he, the Master, shall cause the member so offending to be summoned to appear before the Committee, who shall

report his case to the Lodge, and who shall take such action upon it as they may deem advisable, not repugnant to, nor in violation of the rules and regulations of the Grand Lodge.

37. Any brother who shall have incurred the penalty of expulsion, shall receive notice of his trial at least eight days before the day fixed, such notice to be in writing. He shall have the right, under the signature of the Master, to compel the attendance of any Brother as a witness; and any Brother so summoned as a witness shall attend, under penalty of 5s.

38. That should the Brother who is to take his trial fail to appear, and no sufficient reason shall be assigned, then the trial of the case shall be proceeded with, in the same manner as if he were actually present.

39. The names of all persons expelled from the Society, by any order of a Private Lodge, shall be transmitted to the Grand Lodge, together with the cause of expulsion.

FINES

40. No member of a Lodge shall absent himself from the first meeting in January, unless by special permission from the Master, under penalty of one shilling and three pence.

second offence, and for the third offence shall be brought up before the Lodge, and either suspended or expelled, as a majority shall determine.

42. Any Brother misbehaving himself during Lodge hours, shall be liable to a fine, to be imposed by the Master, not to exceed 5s.

43. Any Brother who shall, on any occasion, or at any time, so conduct himself as to bring discredit and dishonor upon the Institution shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to either fine, suspension or expulsion, as the Lodge, upon the report of the Committee, shall determine.

44. Any Brother transacting any private business, or making or promising to make any bets, or laying wagers, during Lodge hours, shall be subject to a fine of not less than 6d nor more than 5s.

45. No Brother shall leave the Lodge Room after the Lodge is opened, without permission from the Master or Brother presiding; and any brother violating this rule, shall be summoned to appear at the next meeting, and shall be fined not less than 1s 3d nor more than 5s.

46. Any member not attending a Lodge when a general summons has issued, shall pay a fine of 1s 3d, unless he assign a sufficient reason, to be so declared by the Master, for his absence.

47. Any member failing to attend, when specially summoned, shall thereafter be cited to appear before the Committee, who, after having investigated the charge, may adjudge the Brother to pay a fine not exceeding 10s, or to be suspended or expelled; judgement to be reserved for the decision of the Lodge.

48. All fines shall be ordered to be collected under the written authority of the Master.

DISPUTES.

49. Any dispute arising, which is not provided for by the rules and regulations of the Society, shall be decided by the Master or Officer presiding at the time, and the parties shall submit to his orders, saving the right of appeal, in the first instance to the District, and secondly to the County Lodge, then to the Riding, and, lastly, to the Grand Lodge.

APPEALS.

50. That all appeals from the inferior authority, shall be made to the next highest, as is designated in the foregoing clause.

51. When a Brother appeals against a verdict, the proceedings and testimony shall be made out in full, to enable the appeal to be fully gone into.

52. Any member suspended for the non-payment of dues or fines, shall pay the same, before he can be reinstated.

NOTICE OF EXPULSION.

53. At the first meeting after the receipt of the Report of the Grand Lodge proceedings, it shall be the duty of the Master to have an extract made from the same, of the names of all parties expelled from the Institution, and shall affix the same on a board, at the entrance of the Lodge Room, so that it may be observed by the members, for their guidance; which notification shall be in the following form:

PROXIES.

54. Each Lodge may appoint a Proxy, at any period, to attend the meetings of the Grand Lodge, who may exercise all the functions, as the Representative of such Lodge.

55. No proxy shall be entitled to vote when the Master of such Lodge shall be present at the meeting of the Grand Lodge, or in case the Grand Lodge dues shall not have been paid up.

DUES.

56. That in all cases where the word "dues" is used, it shall be held to include all County, District, and Private Lodge, as well as Grand Lodge dues.

ORANGE OBLIGATION.

I, A.— B.— do solemnly and voluntarily swear, that I will, to the utmost of my power, support and defend Her present Majesty, Queen Victoria, and her lawful heirs and successors, in the Sovereignty of Great Britain and Ireland, and of these Provinces belonging to the said Kingdom, and that I will steadily maintain the connexion between the Colonies of British North America and the Mother Country, and be ever ready to resist all attempts to weaken British influence, or dismember the British Empire ; so long as she, he, or they, shall support and maintain the Protestant Religion. That I will be true and faithful to every Brother Orangeman, in all just actions ; that I will not wrong him, or know him to be wronged or injured, without giving him due notice thereof, and preventing it if in my power ; that I will ever hold sacred the name of our glorious deliverer, King William the Third, in grateful remembrance of whom, I promise if in my power to meet with my Brethren in our Lodge Room, on the first day of July (old style) in each year ; that I am not, nor ever will be, a Roman Catholic or Papist. I swear that I never was to my knowledge or belief, reported and rejected in, or expelled from any Orange Lodge ; and lastly, I promise and declare, that I will do my utmost to support and maintain the Loyal Orange Institution, obey all regular summonses, and pay all just dues,
