

THE
FORTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE MONTREAL
GENERAL HOSPITAL.

The annual meeting of the Corporation of the Montreal General Hospital was held on the 16th May. Mr. Redpath occupied the chair, and the Secretary read the following report :—

THE CORPORATION OF THE MONTREAL GENERAL HOSPITAL.

GENTLEMEN,—In accordance with custom the Board of Governors respectfully submit their Forty-ninth Annual Report, with a condensed statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Society during the year ending 26th April, 1871.

The income of the year is \$25,812.58, and consists of the following items :—

The expenditure of the year has exceeded that of the preceding year by \$5,762.39. This is not owing to an increase on what may be called the ordinary expenditure of the institution, but consists almost altogether of three items not likely to be repeated hereafter, viz., ground rent due to the Seminary of St. Sulpice, and cost of commutation on the Hospital property and garden \$5,011.02, corporation charge for making the drain: St. Dominique Street, \$475.92, and a new iron safe \$165. These three unusual items account for \$5,651.94 of the extra expenditure of the year, and leave only \$111.45 to represent the excess of this year's outlay over that of last year. This is a matter of congratulation, as you will presently learn that a very much greater number of sick persons were admitted to the wards of the Hospital this year than last.

The number of in-door patients treated during the year is one thousand five hundred and fifty-nine (1,559) which is an increase of one hundred and sixty-seven (167) over that of last year, and eleven thousand three hundred and forty-six (11,346) out-door patients have received medicine and medical aid.

This institution has sustained during the year a very great loss, by the untimely death of the late Mr. Thomas Morland, who for the last eleven years faithfully discharged the duties of a member of the Committee of Management, and upon all occasions used his influence with his friends and the public to enlist support and sympathy for the Hospital.

For many years he was in the habit of paying every Tuesday a visit to the patients, saying a few kind words to them, and looking after their comfort.

So identified with this charity had his name become that soon after his decease a number of his and its friends subscribed and collected a considerable sum of money to be applied to the erection of a children's hospital, in connection with this institution, and to be called by his name, in commemoration of the interest he had always taken in its welfare.

It is hoped that this building may be erected in the course of this summer, as such an institution is very much needed amongst us, and its want has long been felt by the poor.

With the view of adding to the revenue and meeting the necessary expenditure, and believing that there is a large number of the community who can hardly ever be reached by the most laborious collectors, and following the custom prevailing in most of the cities in Great Britain, the Governors last August addressed a letter to every Roman Catholic and Protestant congregation in the city, requesting that an Annual Public Collection, in aid of the Hospital, be taken up in every church, and suggesting that "Hospital Sunday" should be the first Sunday of October in every year.

It is very gratifying, as affording unmistakable evidence of the favor in which the institution is held by the citizens generally, that, in reply to the above request, collections have been made in almost all the Protestant churches in the city, and that thereby the handsome sum of \$2,000⁷⁵ has been contributed to the funds of the Society.

The employées of several of the manufacturing and mercantile establishments have generously subscribed something out of their limited means towards the maintenance of an asylum for the sick and disabled poor, and the following donations appear worthy of mention in this report, as indicating the general interest taken in the operations of this Society:

On the reading of the Report it was resolved on the motion of Mr. J. H. R. Molson, seconded by Mr. Mulholland :

"That the Annual Report of the Board of Governors to this Corporation be received and adopted as its Forty-ninth Annual Report, and that it be printed for circulation."

The Chairman, having requested Mr. Benjamin Dawson and Mr. J. H. R. Molson to act as Scrutineers, the meeting proceeded to the election of six Governors for two years. At the close of the ballot the Scrutineers declared the following gentlemen to have been elected Governors for two years :—Messrs. James Hutton, John McLennan, Brackley Shaw, John Stirling, N. S. Whitney, and the Hon. M. Laframboise.

Resolved,—On the motion of Mr. Justice Torrance, seconded by Mr. T. J. Claxton :—

"That the cordial thanks of the Corporation be and are hereby tendered to the gentlemen who have so efficiently acted as collectors for the institution during the past year.

The Annual Meeting of the Governors was held on Thursday, the 18th May, 1871, when the following gentlemen were elected officers for the year :

A letter having been read from Mr. Ferguson, containing his resignation as Treasurer and as a member of the Board of Management, on the ground of advanced age, it was moved by Mr. Alexander, seconded by Mr. John Crawford, and unanimously resolved :

"That this meeting cannot permit Mr. Archibald Ferguson to retire from the office of Treasurer of this institution without expressing its grateful sense of the valuable services rendered by that gentleman to the Hospital—first, as one of its founders, then as one of its collectors dating as far back as 1822; subsequently as one of its Committee of Management for various periods since 1834, including the last twelve consecutive years, and as Treasurer during the last six years."

A vote by ballot was now taken for Treasurer, and the Scrutineers announced that Mr. George Frothingham had been elected to that office.

Proceeding to the election of a Committee of Management, it was moved by Mr. Atwater, seconded by Major Mills, and carried :

"That the Committee of Management of last year be re-elected, substituting Mr. Peter Redpath's name for that of the late Mr. Morland."

Resolved.—On the motion of Mr. Lunn, seconded by Mr. R. Campbell, jun. :

"That the medical officers of last year be re-elected."

The following resolutions were then severally moved and passed :

Resolved.—On the motion of Mr. John Crawford, seconded by Mr. Frothingham :

That the cordial thanks of the Governors are hereby tendered to the attending physicians for their valuable services rendered to the institution during the past year.

Resolved.—On the motion of Mr. Lunn, seconded by Mr. Alexander :

That the thanks of the Governors be given to the House Surgeon and assistant House Surgeon, for their valuable and efficient services.

Instead of appointing collectors for the year, in accordance with

custom, it was moved by Mr. Lunn, seconded by Mr. Frothingham, and resolved :

That Messrs. Robert Muir, Edwin Atwater and John Crawford be a committee to confer with gentlemen and obtain their consent to act as collectors to the institution for the year; Mr. Muir to be convener of the committee.

In consequence of Mr. Frothingham declining to accept the office of Treasurer, a special meeting was held on the 3rd June, and Mr. Charles Alexander was elected Treasurer in his stead.
