CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

PROVINCE OF QUEBEC RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

CONSTITUTION.

As Revised 5th May, 1881.

- 1. That this Association be called the "Province of Quebec Rifle Association," and shall have for its object the encouragement of rifle shooting in the Province.
- 2. Any person subscribing two dollars to the funds of the Association shall be a member thereof for the year in which such subscription shall be made.
- 3. A donation of twenty dollars in cash, at any one time, for that express purpose, or of a prize of not less value than forty dollars, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall make the donor eligible for election as a life member at next annual meeting of Council.
- 4. Any regularly constituted Rifle Association or Corps subscribing tendollars or upwards, per annum, to the funds of the Association shall be considered as being in connection with it and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, for competition only, in proportion of one for every dollar so subscribed. The Association thus affiliating is to select from its members the persons to hold such memberships.
- 5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, named by the Council. (The Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron.")

- 6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the annual business meeting of the Association.
- 7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents—one for each Brigade Major's Division—to be elected in the same manner as the President.
 - 8. There shall be a Council composed as follows, viz:
- 1st. Two members from each Brigade Major's Division, to be elected annually at the business meeting.
- 2nd. One representative member from each affiliated Association, or Corps in this Province.
- 9. The President, Vice-Presidents, the District Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia and Brigade Majors of the Province of Quebec, shall be members "ex-officio" of the Council. Five members of Council shall form a quorum, and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies. All members of Council, excepting representatives of affiliated Associations, must be individual members of the Association.
- 10. Representatives to the Council shall be chosen by the Associations they represent, and the names of delegates when changed shall be sent to the Secretary at least one month prior to the annual meeting.
- 11. The Council shall, at its first meeting, choose from its members a chairman.
- 12. There shall be a Secretary and a Treasurer, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.
- 13. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have

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such board the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

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- 14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any case altered or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.
- 15. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the Council, and the prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.
- 16. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.
- 17. An Annual Business Meeting of the members of the Association, for the election of Officers and Council, who shall assume office on first day of succeeding January, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the by-laws.
- 18. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made, except by a resolution duly passed at the annual business meeting or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed, unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof shall have been given to the Secretary one month at least previous to the annual business meeting, at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments, and also to post them on the bulletin board at the opening of the annual matches.

BY-LAWS.

As Revised 5th May, 1881.

- 1. The Annual Business Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second day of the annual matches.
- 2. There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council, the first of which shall be held immediately after the annual business meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.
- 3. Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required, by any six members of the Council; notification being sent to each member of Council at least ten days previous to such meeting, and the requisition for the meeting and the notices to the members must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meetings.
- 4. The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, open to the inspection of all members of the Council, and published with the annual report.
- 5. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council, to be chosen at their first meeting.
- 6. The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.
- 7. All expenditure for current expenses, which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of a member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.
- 8. A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

Especially have we to thank the Corporation of the City of Montreal for their generous gift of a five hundred dollar Jubilee Challenge Cup, won by and to be held for this year by the 6th Fusiliers Rifle Association.

The order for this cup has been given to Messrs. Watson & Pelton, who are having it manufactured in London, England, from a design drawn in Montreal. Four photographs of members of the Montreal force have been forwarded from which to mould the military figures which appear on the cup.

The thanks of the association are due to the Surgeons of the City Corps, who so kindly attended at the ranges during the matches.

MATCHES.

Our Annual Matches took place as usual in the second week of August, and, as the result of our previous year's experience, were extended to three days, closing at 5 p.m., on Thursday, the 11th of August.

Owing to a re-arrangement of the Matches and the placing of the Skirmishing Match on the afternoon of the first day, everything ran very smoothly, there being plenty of time to finish all the Regular Matches without any hurry, and the competitors had all the extra series shooting they wanted.

Last year we had the pleasure of reporting an increase of fully fifty per cent. over the entries of the previous year, and have now to report a and 4
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port a further increase, the number of entries being 2,029 Individual and 43 Teams, against 1,534 Individual and 36 Teams for last year. The largest number of entries in any regular match being in the Association 144, and in the extra series at 500 yards 452.

The entry fees, which included ammunition, amounting to \$270 more than the previous year.

The number of affiliated Associations was the same, but we have 12 more Individual members. This ought to be still further increased, as every officer in the force should consider it his duty to be a member of the Association, and should use his influence to induce the men under his command to join also.

We have no Individual members from the following corps, and their representatives should make a point next year of having as many of the officers as possible join: Cavalry, Field Battery, Engineers, Montreal Garrison Artillery and 65th Battalion.

We were much pleased to note amongst the competitors a number of our Ontario friends, and trust they will come in increased numbers next year.

The presence in our port of the French Frigate "La Minerve." having on board Admiral Vignes, gave us an opportunity of arranging for a friendly competition between members of the Crew and our own members.

A special series of prizes was arranged, which included a handsome silver cup, presented by M. Schwob, Esq., Vice-Consul of France, to be competed for by members of the crew; and two teams of 6 men each, under the command of Lieutenant Bourdeau were present and took part in the competition.

The pleasure and interest of the competition were greatly enhanced by the presence at the match, as interested spectators, of Admiral Vignes, Capt. Menard and other officers of the frigate, as well as Consul-General Dubail, Vice-Consul Schwob, H. Beaugrand, Esq., Lt-Col. Hughes, Major Prevost and a number of our prominent citizens, whom it would please us very much to be able to welcome regularly to our annual matches.

The duties of executive officer were diligently attended to by our esteemed Brigade Major, Lt. Col. Gregor Mattice, assisted by Captains Miller, Watt and Walker as range officers.

MEDALS, CUPS, &C.

The Governor-General's Silver Medal was won by Pvt. Stanton, 60th Battalion, with 76 points.

The Governor-General's Bronze Medal was won by Sergt. Marks, 6th Fusiliers, with 71 points.

The Association Cup was won by the 60th Battalion and Missisquoi County Rifle Association, with 222 points.

The Aggregate Cup was won by the 6th Fusiliers, with 817 points. The Corporation Jubilee Cup was won by the 6th Fusiliers, with 431 points.

The Dolan Cup was won by Sergt. Wilson, M.G.A., with 180 points.

The marking this year was undertaken by Mr. Marks, and was satisfactorily done. Blackboards for register keepers, used for the first time, were found to be a great improvement. Too great care cannot be exercised in regard to keeping the marking and register keeping exact and without reproach.

COMPETITORS' MEETING.

The usual meeting of competitors was called at the ranges, but was not particularly well attended, there being no one present but the Chairman and the Secretary.

The Council would be much better pleased to see this metting well attended by the competitors, as it is from this meeting they expect to receive suggestions for the improvement of the running of the matches and the affairs of the association generally.

AMMUNITION.

A new departure was made this year by including the charge for ammunition in the entrance fee, and the serving of it out in 5 and 7 round packages to each competitor at the firing point. This proved most successful, and has since been adopted at the Ontario and the D.R.A. meetings.

RANGES.

A crisis has at last arrived on this question, and this year's matches are the last that will ever be fired on the old ranges at Point St. Charles.

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Early in the season the City Council decided that an effort should be made to prevent the annual destruction of property by the flooding of the river. A scheme, which includes the building of a dyke along the river front from above the Nuns' Island to Hochelaga, was accepted, and the contract given out. The line of the dyke would cut right across the ranges and through one of the butts, which, as they were short already, barely 600 yards, made them absolutely useless.

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Through the kindness of Lieut. Col. Kennedy, arrangements were made with the City Surveyor that work should not be commenced on the ranges until after the 11th of August, so we were enabled to proceed with our matches as usual. Owing to the dilapidated state of the Butts, it was necessary to place danger boats on the river in rear.

We are now absolutely without a range. During the summer the D.A.G., who is also chairman of our council, requested a number of officers from the city corps to act as a committee of search, with the view of ascertaining what properties there were in the vicinity of Montreal which would be suitable for the purpose. This committee have made a report, which we believe has been forwarded to the Minister of Militia, and an answer is expected every day, which will decide the situation of Montreal's future Rifle Range, which we earnestly hope will be a permanent one.

PUBLIC PRESENTATION OF PRIZES.

A committee consisting of Major Bond, Captains Campbell, Sims and Strathy, Lieut. D. Stevenson and Lieut. Col. Massey were appointed to carry out the public distribution of prizes.

The Honorable Sir Adolphe P. Caron, K.C.M.G., President of the Association, kindly consented to preside, and presented the prizes, assisted by the Hon. Sir Donald A. Smith, K.C.M.G., Admiral Vignes, Consul-General Dubail, Lt.-Col. Van Straubenzie, D.A.G., Vice-Consul Schwob, Lt.-Col Caverhill, H. Beaugrand, Esq., J. J. Curran, Esq., M.P., and other prominent citizens.

The presentation took place in the hall of the Victoria Rifles new armory, and went off very satisfactorily, reflecting great credit on the committee having the arrangements in charge.

The Council would strongly urge all competitors attending the matches, but more especially prize winners, to endeavor to remain for the presentation, as it undoubtedly assists the carrying on of the work of the Association.

PROPERTY.

A list of the property is attached. There is certain immovable property on the ranges which should be disposed of, as also a number of stands, &c., which will be of no further use to the association.

FINANCES.

The Treasurer's statement certainly shows a very flourishing condition of things, the balance being \$821.74, as against \$320.76, last year, that too with an increased prize list, \$300.00 having been added this year. However we will need all available funds, and more too. The change of ranges will necessitate a larger expenditure on property, which will be entirely Provincial, and which will not be provided for in the Government's estimates, so that every effort should be made to increase the funds for the coming year.

The subscriptions show an increase in amount of \$290.00 over last year, with the still more pleasing increase of a number of new names. An organized effort should be made this year to obtain subscriptions from places outside of Montreal.

D.R.A.

The province was well represented at Ottawa, ten men winning places in the grand Aggregate, and two in the first twenty. The interests of the Association have been well attended to by our representatives on the Council Board. We were also represented at the Ontario Rifle Association matches, several of our members taking places in the grand Aggregate.

We are also glad to record that one of our members Private A. Thomson, 3rd V.R.C., took 29th place in the last stage of the "Queen's" at Wimbledon.

REGULATIONS.

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MEMBERSHIP.

Individual membership, \$2.00.

Affiliating Associations are entitled to ten (10) members' tickets and one badge on payment of \$10.

The above subscriptions must be paid on or before the 5th of August. 20 per cent. additional will be charged after that date.

Firi g shall commence each day at 9 o'clock precisely.

All firing shall be conducted under officers or persons appointed for the duty by the Executive Committee, and all competitors shall be under their authority.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS.

1. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations, as also with the conditions of the Match for which they have entered, as in neither case will the plea of ignorance be entertained.

2. The Range officers will decide disputes on the ground. Appeal from their decision may be made in writing to the Executive Committee, whose decision will be final and without recourse. Their decision to be given in writing to the Secretary.

3. When at the Firing point they must comply with all orders given by the Range officer, or Officer in charge.

1.—GENERAL REGULATIONS.

I.—No Active Militiaman shall shoot as a member of more than one corps.

11.— No non-commissioned officer or private employed by the P.Q.R.A. for duty at the firing points or in the Butts, shall shoot either for a prize or for practice during the meeting.

III.—In all competitions restricted to Active Militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the uniform of their corps shall be worn, and in accordance with the R. and O. of M., viz:

1. Tunic, patrol or regulation fatigue jacket.

2. Trousers.

3. Regimental head dress, or a cap cover, with or without a cap under it.

All officers of the same corps must appear in the same order, as must also all non-commissioned officers and privates, but where a duly authorized undress for officers exists they may appear in it, although the non-commissioned officers and privates may be in full dress. Cross-belts need not be worn.

4. In Competitions not restricted to Active Militia, competitors must appear in complete uniform or wholly in plain clothes. Any objections on the score of a competitor's dress must be made before he takes up his position to shoot, or while

N.B .- Cap covers or puggarees may be worn over the regimental full or undress cap, and great coats or waterproofs over uniform.

IV.—Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

V.—Fixed artificial rests will not be allowed, except in the skirmishing match.

VI.—Competitors may use a waterproof sheet, mat, or great coat, not folded up, but laid flat on the ground; but no cork beds or elbow rests will be allowed, except those furnished by the Association.

VII .- No wiping out between shots will be permitted.

VIII. - No competitor shall load until he has taken his position at the firing point, and the register keeper has given the word "all clear."

IX.—Competitors are allowed to fire "fouling" shots only in the pits provided, and on presentation of a "fouling" ticket.

X.-Slings of Government pattern, white or black, may be used as an assistance in shooting.

IN INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS.

XI.—(a) A competitor may use a binocular or telescope, not mounted on any kind of stand, provided his doing so causes no delay to the shooting.

(b) After a competitor has taken his place at the firing point, no person except the register keeper or an officer on duty will be permitted to speak to him.

(c) No coaching of any kind will be permitted in any match.

Any violation of this rule, or any part of it, must be at once reported by the register keeper to the officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on any repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Range Officer, to be dealt with by the Executive Committee as laid down under the head of "penalties," and the person or persons offending may be removed from the firing points.

2.—PENALTIES—DISQUALIFICATION.

XII.—Any competitor—

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- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so; or
 - (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target; or
- (d) Who shall offer money, or a bribe of any kind to any employee of the Association under any pretence whatever; or

(e) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Executive Committee may consider discreditable; or

(f) Who shall be reported to the Council or Executive Committee as having been elsewhere guilty of such conduct or the aforesaid offences; or

(g) Who shall directly or indirectly make any arrangements with any other competitor for pooling or dividing any prize.

Shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council or Committee, or on the receipt of such report from any affiliated or duly recognized Association, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be forever disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association.

EXCLUSION FROM FURTHER COMPETITION DURING THE MEETING.

XIII.—Any competitor—

(a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up; or

(b) Who shall discharge his rifle on the range except in accordance with the regulations for shooting; or

(c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle except when at his proper firing point and engaged in competing; or

(d) Who from a proper want of care discharges his rifle accidentally. (If such discharge is due to a defect in his rifle, an ample and satisfactory explanation must be given); or

(e) Who shall fire a pool shot before delivering his ticket to the register keeper; or

(f) Who shall alter or make any erasure on his firing ticket; or

(g) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous,

Shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

DISALLOWANCE OF SCORE.

XIV.—Any competitor—

(a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize; or

(b) Who shall infringe on any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the meeting while shooting for any particular prize; or

(c) Who, when competing for an aggregate prize, shall omit to enter, or shall enter incorrectly, his previous score or scores on the register or ticket provided for that purpose; or

(d) Who shall shoot dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes—(See Reg. III, Sec. 4.)

Shall on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed.

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FINES.

XV.—Any competitor—

Who shall fire a fouling shot, except at the place provided, or who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target, shall be fined one dollar, to be paid forthwith to the range officer.

In cases where a competitor is excluded from "further competition," or where his score is disallowed, for any particular prize, the circumstances only under which the penalty was incurred shall be posted on the notice board, as a warning to others, without the name of the individual implicated.

In cases of "disqualification," the names of the offenders, as well as the particulars of the case, shall be posted on the notice board.

MITIGATION OF PENALTIES.

XVI.—The Executive Committee shall have power to mitigate or remit any of the above penalties.

3.—PRIZE WINNERS.

XVII.—Unless otherwise specified, no one will be allowed to take more than one prize in any competition.

XVIII.—Winners of prizes must apply for their certificates at the statistical office, and on signing the receipt attached thereto will receive the amount or amounts due to them from the Treasurer of the P.Q.R.A. If a formal presentation takes place, winners, being Active Militiamen, must parade in the full dress uniform of their corps, and the three highest prize winners in each Match must be prepared to receive their prizes in public, otherwise their prizes will be held over till next year.

4.—DISTANCE AND TARGETS.

5.—MARKING.

- I. The marking will be as follows:-
- b. Inner.....Red Disc.
- d. Outer..... Black Disc.
- e. Misses will not be signalled; but if a target has been lowered under the impression that it has been hit, and if no hit is found on it, after raising it the marker will wave a red flag, which will signify a miss.
- 2. When two shots strike a target simultaneously, that which has the highest value will alone be marked with the marking disc, and the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire at the target will be credited with that shot, provided he has fired.
- 3. On a target being lowered, the position of a hit, if any, and its value will be shown by the spotting disc, when the target is again raised.
- 4. The marking when signalled shall not be questioned, but if a shot is not signalled, and the officer in charge of the firing points be satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may not have struck the target, he may ask the officer at the butt to examine the target, the result of this examination as signalled shall be final. Any competitor challenging a shot shall deposit the sum of twenty-five cents with the officer in charge at the firing points, which shall be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.
- 5. All alterations of the registers must be initialed by the register keeper making them, but no alteration, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without having first signalled to the butt.
- 6. No person will be permitted to go and examine a target during the meeting except the Range Officer or such person or persons as he may duly authorize to do so in his behalf.

Military Match Targets.

(4 feet by 2 feet 6 in. high; 3 Divisions.)

- 1. Lower belt 15 in. high, score-value 5 points.
- 2. Middle belt Io in. high, score-value 3 "
- 3. Upper belt 5 in. high, score-value 2 "

In Skirmishing.

When the number of hits counted on the targets exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, three marks shall be deducted for every such hit in excess of the number of shots, unless it be proved that such hit on the target in excess of the number of shots allowed could only have been made by competitors in the squad firing more than their usual number of rounds, in which case the squad shall be disqualified.

6.—RIFLES.

The rifles shall be Snider and Martini-Henry rifles, either of Government issue or of bona fide Government pattern, and bearing the Government viewer's mark.

- I. Weight of Snider not to exceed, without bayonet, 9 lbs. 12 oz. Weight of Martini-Henry, without bayonet, not to exceed 9 lbs.
 - 2. No pad or shoe for the heel plate of the butt will be allowed.
 - 3. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 !bs.
- 4. Sights to be strictly in accordance with those of the Government issue. Filed sights will not be allowed.
- (a) All sights may be temporarily blackened or whitened, but no application of a permanent nature will be allowed. No shading of sights will be permitted.
- (b) The back sight may be tilted forward or backward, or supported at an angle by any extemporized means.
- (c) The sliding bar may be reversed, and used on either side of the uprights. One permanent centre line for the Snider and three for the Martini-Henry will be allowed, and temporary marks or lines of any kind removeable at pleasure may be used.

7.—AMMUNITION.

Competitors must use the ammunition provided by the Association, the cost of which is included in the entrance fee.

8.—POSITION.

Unless otherwise specified, the shooting at all ranges shall be from the firing points, and may be in any position with the head to the target.

9.—ORDER OF SHOOTING.

I. When a competitor has joined a squad he shall not leave it until he has retired or completed his firing, without leave from the register keeper; any competitor losing his turn, or being absent without leave, or who does not hand his scoring ticket to the register keeper at the firing point to which he is squaded at the time detailed on his ticket, will be disqualified for the match and lose his entrance fee. Time will be regulated by the Association clock in the Secretary's Office.

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2. In all competitions, except those open to "Any Rifles," competitors shall, when possible, be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot alternately.

3. Where but one competitor is present, he shall fire his shots without undue delay, but the officer in charge of the firing point, or some person named by him, must witness the shooting, and countersign the register. Failing such verification, the score will be invalidated.

4. No two competitors shall shoot in any competition with the same rifle, excepting with Martini-Henry; nor shall a competitor change his rifle at any range, during a competition, unless his first rifle should become unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified through the officer in charge.

5. In the case of unreasonable delay in firing on the part of any competitor, or of such delay as the Range Officer may consider likely to prolong the firing beyond the time allowed, the Range Officer shall have the right to caution and time the competitor by a sand glass, purporting to run one minute, more or less, and if after such caution the competitor does not fire before the sand glass has run out, the Range Officer shall declare the score forfeited, and call on the next competitor to proceed with his firing.

6. The competitor must, after delivering each shot, pay attention to the score called out by the Register Keeper, and himself see that such score is correctly entered on the register, so that any objection to the score recorded may be investigated before the next shot is fired.

N.B.—The right of objection in above case only extends to the registration of scores by the Register Keeper, and not to marker's signals.

10. - TIES.

Ties shall be decided as follows:

A .- In Individual Competitions for a Series of Prizes.

- I. If at more than one distance, by the range totals in inverse order.
- 2. By the fewest outers.
- 3. By the fewest magpies.
- 4. By the fewest inners.
- 5. By the value of each shot in inverse order.
- 6. FOR MONEY PRIZES, by Division.
- 7. FOR PRIZES IN KIND, by shooting off; as in Clause B.
- 8. In the case of a PRIZE PART IN KIND AND PART IN MONEY, by shooting off for the Prize in Kind and dividing the Money.

E .- In Military Skirmishing and Volley Firing, by the largest number of hits.

F .- In cases not met by the foregoing :-

- I. By any special rules attached to the conditions.
- 2. By the fiat of the Executive.

11.-ENTRIES.

- 1. Entries, accompanied by the fees for the first seven matches, must be made on or before Friday, 5th August, addressed to the Secretary, P.O. Box 1367, Montreal. After that date, 20 per cent. extra will be charged.
- 2. Every competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and not oftener than once for any prize, unless specially allowed by the terms of
- 3. To meet the case where the difficulty may be experienced in selecting the actual competitors in sufficient time to make the required entries by the 5th August, Officers commanding corps, and Secretaries of Local Associations will be permitted to send in their Applications for number of competitors), accompanying such application with the amount of the entrance fees, and to postpone the rendering of the actual names of those for whom they make the entries until the selection of the competitors is definitely made. In such case the Register tickets shall not be issued before the final return is handed to the Secretary. Any payment made for entries in excess of the number of competitors nominated will be returned in full, as provided for under paragraph 12 (a), Return Entrance Fees.
 - 5. Entrance fees must be paid at the time when entries are made.

12.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

13.—SQUADDING.

I. In the case of competitors classified as ordinary entries, arrangements will be made and details published on the range of the day and target at which each competitor will be required to attend to fulfil his engagements.

In case of post entries, competitors must await the squadding of ordinary competitors before being assigned to any target.

14.—ALTERATION OF SQUADDING.

Any alteration which the Executive Officer may find it necessary to make will be duly notified on the notice board, and such notice shall be a sufficient authority for the change. In the absence of such notice, tickets will be available only for the target for which they were originally issued, and any erasure or alteration will cancel the ticket, unless verified by the initials of the Executive Officer.

15.—REGISTER TICKETS.

- I. Should a competitor lose his ticket, or omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, or give a wrong ticket, and so by his own neglect miss the opportunity of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall forfeit his claim on the Association, and no duplicate ticket shall be issued to him except under special circumstances.
- 2. Any erasure or substitution of one name for another shall invalidate the ticket.

16.—SIGHTING AND FOULING.

No sighting shots allowed during the matches.
