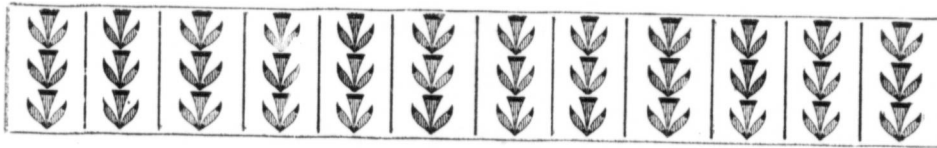

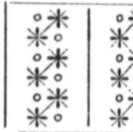

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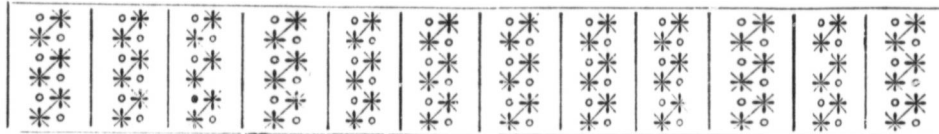
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ANNUAL REPORT

*To the President and Members of the Provincial Rifle Association of
Prince Edward Island:*

GENTLEMEN:--

Your Council beg to submit to the Members of the Association, their Thirty-eighth Annual Report, and are pleased to be able to state that the work of the Association for 1898 has been successful.

FINANCES

The accounts for the past year, duly audited, are herewith submitted by the Secretary and Treasurer. All accounts for the past year have been paid.

The Prize List for 1897 was increased by \$101.00 in cash over the previous year: the list for 1898 was further increased by \$4.00 being added to the Nursery Aggregate, making a total Prize List of \$855.00 in cash, the largest in the history of the Association, and there still remains a balance to the credit of the Association of \$48.22, which is deposited in the Merchants Bank of Prince Edward Island.

INTER-MARITIME MATCH

At the Annual Meeting held on the 1st day of March last, a resolution was passed authorizing the expenditure of \$80.00 to defray the expenses of a team of riflemen to compete for the Inter-Maritime Trophy at Sussex, N. B. Owing to the conditions of the match, it having to be shot with Martini-Henri Rifles, it was found impossible to organize a team, all the Martini-Henri Rifles here having been previously

returned into store. A short time previous to the date of holding the match the generous offer was made by the Nova Scotia and New Brunswick teams of permitting us to use the Lee-Enfield Rifles instead of the Martini-Henri, but it was felt by our riflemen that in accepting this offer, which was one of decided advantage to us, we would not be competing with the other teams upon an equal footing. Owing to these circumstances it was decided not to compete.

OTTAWA TEAM

The Ottawa Team was commanded by Lieut.-Colonel Longworth, 4th P. E. Island Regiment C. A., whose report we herewith submit. The usual grant of \$120.00 was placed at the disposal of the team previous to its departure.

PRIZE LIST

As usual the programme containing the Prize List and revised Regulations was printed in book form and distributed.

THE ANNUAL PRIZE MEETING

The Annual Prize Meeting opened on Wednesday, August 10th. It is a matter for congratulation that the Association was again favored with the best of weather, upon which depends so greatly the success of our annual competition. The utmost harmony prevailed during the two days' competition, which makes the event a pleasant outing for our riflemen.

This year a noticeable feature in the accommodation afforded was the Bungalow or Shooting Hut, which had been erected on the range during the early part of the summer, containing offices for the Secretary and committees, with a general room for marksmen, having private lock-boxes for rifles, &c. This Bungalow was erected by a special Committee appointed by your Council, at a cost of \$78.07 to the Association, the balance of the total cost having been met by private subscription. A further grant of \$10.00 was made to the Executive Committee for the purpose of painting the roof and walls of the building and placing shutters upon the windows, your Council considering this a necessary expenditure. The erection of the Bungalow fills a long felt want by our marksmen, and the Council feel satisfied that the Association will justify the expenditure. We have much pleasure in

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herewith submitting the Special Committee's report to the Council at the time of its erection, which gives details in full.

The Ladies' Challenge Cup Match was again a pleasant feature of the meeting. A number of ladies, including Mrs. Howlan, wife of our much respected Lieut.-Governor, was present to witness the contest. The trophy was won by Mrs. Geo. Crockett, of York, by her representative, Sergt.-Major Otto N. Baird, with the magnificent score of 49 points out of a possible 50.

An informal presentation of the prizes took place late Thursday evening, after the completion of the matches. This otherwise pleasing function was marred by the lateness of the hour at which the matches closed. In this connection your Council would strongly urge upon the the Association the very great necessity of having a least two additional targets added to the present number. With a continually increasing number of competitors it is impossible to complete the shooting within reasonable hours on the second day.

Your Council find that the early hour at which our matches begin, viz, 7.30 a. m., prevents good shooting, as our range faces the east the morning rays of the sun strike most uncomfortably the eyes of the marksmen. They also find that the hour of 7.00 p. m. is too late for accurate shooting at the 600 yard range, but are sorry to say that no alteration in these respects can be made with the few targets at their disposal.

We have to again to thank, on behalf of the Association, the Dominion and Provincial Governments and the City of Charlottetown for their generous grants towards the funds of the Association.

We herewith submit the usual list of contributors, &c., to all of whom we tender our warmest thanks.

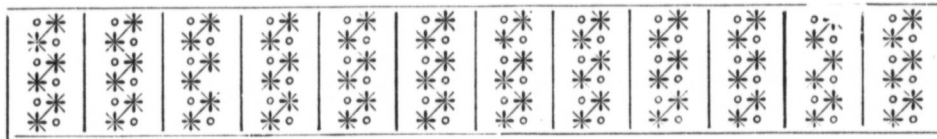

REPORT OF LIEUT.-COL. LONGWORTH

COMMANDING OTTAWA TEAM FOR 1898

CHARLOTTETOWN, JAN. 25th, 1899.

TO LIEUT.-COL. DOGHERTY,
Chairman of Council P. R. A.

SIR:—

Having been appointed Captain of the Ottawa Team for 1898, I have the honour to report that a team 16 strong representing this Association were present at the opening of the new Range at Rockcliffe, on the 29th of August last, when the first shot was fired by Major-General Hutton, resulting in the inevitable "Bulls-eye."

The shooting of the Island team was as a rule quite up to the average, while that of Private Weatherbie, 82nd Batt., was exceedingly good he having captured first in the Nursery and first in the Nursery Aggregate.

In the match for the London Merchants Cup, the Island eight made exceptionally strong shooting at the long ranges, making an average per man of 33 points at 500 and 31 points at 600 yards, beating all the other Provinces at these two ranges, but unfortunately their 200 yards score was only sufficient to bring them within two points of the second prize.

The grant of \$120.00 made by the Association was wholly expended in Individual and team entrance fees.

Annexed is a statement showing the prizes won by the team.

REPORT OF THE BUNGALOW COMMITTEE



To the Council of the Provincial Rifle Association of Prince Edward Island.

GENTLEMEN :

Your Committee having in charge the erection of a Bungalow or Rifleman's Hut on Kensington Range, beg most humbly to report as follows:—

With due regard to a resolution passed at a meeting of Council fixing the maximum expenditure at \$80, and the minimum size of the building at 24 feet by 16, we proceeded with our work and as a result have much pleasure in handing over to you a building, which we trust will meet with your approval. We also return an unexpended balance of \$1.93 in cash.

We herewith submit vouchers for material and labor, together with a list of those who paid cash to enable your Committee to hire labor, and also a list of those who kindly assisted in the erection of the building by work, etc.

The building we ask your Council to accept is 24 feet long by 16 feet wide with a verandah on one side. It is well lighted with five windows and besides the main room intended for the use of riflemen, there are two smaller rooms suitable for offices, the windows of which are well protected by wooden shutters.

The building throughout (with the exception of the windows and main door which are of Pine) is of Spruce fastened together with steel

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nails and spikes, and set on stone piers and we have much pleasure in saying that the P. R. A. of P. E. Island has now one of the most suitable and convenient buildings of its kind in Canada.

We therefore ask that the Council accept the building as here presented ; and that your Committee be discharged.

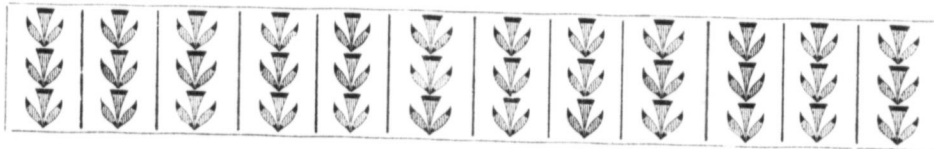

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CONSTITUTION
OF THE
Provincial Rifle Association of Prince Edward Island

1. That this Association be called the Provincial Rifle Association of Prince Edward Island.
2. Any person subscribing two dollars to the funds of the Association shall be a full member thereof, for the year in which such subscription shall be made. Such year to expire immediately after the annual business meeting, or any adjourned meeting thereof.
3. A donation of twenty dollars, in cash, at any one time, or of a prize of not less value, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall make the donor eligible for election as a life member at next or any subsequent meeting of the Council.
4. Any member of the active militia, or officer on the retired list, paying the sum of one dollar annually towards the funds of the Association, shall be an Associate member thereof and entitled to compete for all prizes of the Association.
5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council. The Lieutenant-Governor of the Province for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become Patron.
6. There shall be a President to be elected at the annual business meeting of the Association.
7. There shall be three Vice Presidents, one for each County, to be elected in the same manner as the President.
8. There shall be a Council composed as follows:—
Five members from Queen's County and two from each of the other counties in the Province, to be elected annually at the business meeting, and must be either full or life members of the Association.

9. The District Officer Commanding, the President and Vice-Presidents shall be the members *ex officio* of the Council, five members of which shall form a quorum, and in the event of vacancies occurring among those who have been elected, the remaining members of Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

10. The Council shall, at its first meeting, choose from its own members, the Chairman of the Council.

11. There shall be a Secretary-Treasurer to be appointed annually by the Council and holding office during pleasure.

12. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affairs of the Association, and may do all such acts as shall appear to them necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

13. The annual prize meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the Council, and the prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.

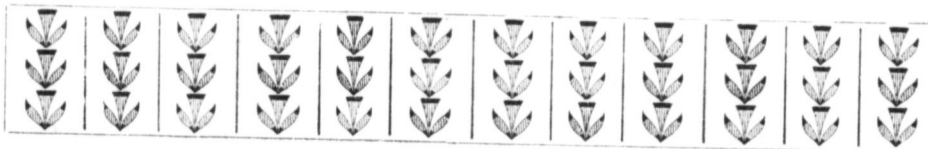
14. An annual report embracing an account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Council, and shall, together with all vouchers, be submitted to the annual business meeting.

15. The annual business meeting of the Association for the election of officers and council and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Charlottetown in each year, at such time and place as the Council may see fit to appoint; two weeks' notice of such annual meeting to be given by publication in two of the city newspapers.

16. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made, except by a resolution duly passed at the annual business meeting, or some adjourned meeting thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary two weeks at least previous to the annual business meeting, or some adjourned meeting thereof, at which the same is to be proposed; and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members, in writing, of such proposed amendments.



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BY-LAWS

For the Government of the Council

1. There shall be two regular meetings of the Council, one as soon after the business meeting as possible—notice of which shall be given by the President or the presiding officer—and the other in November following, at such time and place as the Chairman of Council shall name.
2. Special meetings may also be called by the Chairman of Council at any time, and it shall be his duty to do so on the written requisition of any three members of Council, and the nature of the business for which such meeting is called must be set forth in the notice to be given each member.
3. Notice of time and place of all special meetings and of the regular meeting in November, shall be issued by the Secretary to each member of the Council at least three days before the day appointed for the meeting.
4. Every member of Council shall be deemed to be duly notified by having a written notice of the meeting left at his residence or place of business, or by having a copy thereof mailed to him within the prescribed time.
5. Meetings of Council may adjourn from day to day.
6. The Council shall appoint three of its members an Executive Committee, whose duty it shall be to carry into effect the views of the Council as expressed at any of its meetings; to assist the Secretary in arranging the Prize Lists and the Annual Report, and they shall settle all disputes during the annual prize meetings.

7. The Council shall also appoint two of its members a Committee of Audit, to whom the Secretary-Treasurer shall submit his books and accounts at least one week before the annual business meeting, and the Committee shall Audit the same and report thereon at said annual meeting.

8. The Council shall fix the time and place for holding the annual prize meetings, notice of which shall be given by advertisement in one or more of the daily and weekly newspapers published in Charlottetown, at least fourteen days previous thereto.

9. No alteration in these By-Laws shall be made except at a meeting of the Council by a two-third vote of the members present.
