



FIFTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

St. George's Society

OF THE

CITY OF TORONTO,

FOR THE YEAR 1887.

The year having passed away, for which the Committee were elected, it becomes their duty to present to the Members this the fifty-third Annual Report which they do with increased gratification, as it has been one of the greatest utility and prosperity ever known to the Society.

RELIEF.

The relief given during the year has largely exceeded in amount any previous year (viz : nearly three hundred dollars) but the services rendered in the way of obtaining employment, directing their movements, and in a variety of ways have been of far greater value to the numbers of needy Emigrants that have arrived, than the relief of the usual character given. From the Dominion and Provincial Emigration Offices, and

from the Mayor's Office needy English people have continually been sent to this Society for assistance, and their various wants have been, as far as they have been practicable and consistent, dealt with. Visitations to the homes of the applicants have also been continuously made. The immigration of the past year has been of a very destitute, and in many instances, of a very unsuitable character, consequently drawing upon the resources of the Society in a larger degree than heretofore. The number of applications relieved during the year has been 1,695.

Orders have been given for the burial in the Society's plot in St. James's Cemetery of 9 adults and 6 children. The instalment of \$100 was duly paid on the plot.

FINANCIAL.

The Treasurer's Annual Statement, duly audited, will be found herewith.

The financial position of the Society, although there has been increased expenditure in the way of relief and the amount presented to the Secretary for his services during the year, and which is recommended to be continued, is still excellent.

MEMBERSHIP.

The number of Members has been largely increased during the year, there having been 31 Life Members and 77 Ordinary Members elected, who have paid their subscriptions; but, as usual, the losses from various causes have been numerous.

The numbers at the present time stand as follows, viz.:— Honorary Life Members, 11—one having been added during the year; Life Members, 277—two having died during the year; Ordinary Members, 419—four of these have died during the year, several have become Life Members, others have removed from the city, and others have declined to continue; leaving at the present time 707 Members on the roll altogether.

The Life Members that have died during the year are as follows, viz.:—

Mr. G. D'ARCY BOULTON, a Barrister, and a member of one of the oldest families of Toronto.

Mr. S. R. BRIGGS, well known for his connection with religious institutions and publications.

The Ordinary Members who have died are:—

Mr. L. SAMUEL, of the wholesale firm of Samuel, Benjamin & Co., a gentleman of the most unassuming manners and kindly disposition.

Mr. WM. SEAGUR, the Musician, and conductor of Seagur's Band.

Mr. JAS. BROWNE, the well known and much respected Banker and Broker of King Street, and a Member of very long standing in the Society.

Mr. JOSEPH WRIGHT, Chemist and Druggist, of Queen Street West, a very popular and benevolent man, who will be much missed from the neighborhood.

And it is here worthy of note that one of the original founders of the Society, viz., Mr. J. W. BRENT, who was a most kind and amiable gentleman, has passed away during the year at a very advanced age, leaving only two, viz., Mr. H. ROWSELL and Mr. J. G. HOWARD remaining.

ANNIVERSARIES AND ENTERTAINMENTS.

On Sunday, April 24th, the regular Anniversary Service was held in St. James's Church. The Rev. H. P. Hobson

preached a very appropriate and carefully prepared sermon. There was a very good attendance—the English element, of course, predominating; our brethren the Sons of England forming a very conspicuous portion. The collection taken up was very liberal.

The second Service was held in the Metropolitan Methodist Church, on Sunday, the 2nd of October. The Rev. J. A. Williams, D.D., Superintendent of the Methodist Church, preached a very excellent sermon; but the attendance was small, and the collection was correspondingly so also.

The Musical portion of the services was very suitable and good. The Choirs of the two Churches, under the direction of Mr. E. Haslam and Mr. F. H. Torrington, the respective Organists, being very efficient.

The Churches, as on all previous occasions, being very kindly and freely lent; which has been duly acknowledged by the Society.

DINNER.

The Annual Dinner was again held in the Walker House; there were one hundred and thirty gentlemen thereat. It was a very enthusiastic affair, the greatest hilarity and good feeling prevailing. The dinner, as heretofore, was well served.

EXCURSION.

The excursion was again this year to the Falls of Niagara, on July 19th, on the *Chicora* and the M. C. R. R. It was a beautiful day, and the trip across the lake to and fro was very pleasant, but the net results only amounted to \$25.15.

CONCERT.

The Pavilion in the Horticultural Gardens was again engaged for a Concert on Thanksgiving evening. Several disappointments occurred in making the arrangements, but

through the fortunate opportunity of a member of the Committee having occasion to visit New York on his private business, arrangements were made with a lady and gentleman there, and other arrangements made by Mr. E. Haslam (who conducted the Concert in Toronto) completed a very presentable programme.

In a pecuniary point it was not a success.

CHRISTMAS DISTRIBUTION.

The Christmas distribution this year was, probably, of a larger extent than ever before known in the history of the Society.

The contributions were very liberal, and exceeded those of previous years, and the applications were also more numerous than heretofore. It was made on the 24th December, in the large store, 31 Church Street, very kindly lent for the purpose by Mr. J. G. Beard. The collections made by the Committee and Stewards amounted to \$1,013.50, and a variety of other donations were received; 846 families, comprising 4,450 individuals, received the bounty given.

Fortunately, the beef was purchased at a lower rate than formerly, although the quality was equally as good. As will be seen, a good surplus was left.

THE TENT.

Early in the Spring the tent was offered for sale, and the most that could be obtained for it was \$30.

THE QUEEN'S JUBILEE.

The Society joined in the Procession in celebrating the Queen's Jubilee, and attended the Service in the Metropolitan Methodist Church, which was of a very imposing and interesting character.

CONCLUSION.

On terminating their year of office, the Committee would offer to the Members their sincere congratulations upon the continued increasing usefulness of the Society. And although the amount given in relief has been so largely in excess of former years, and other additional expenditure made, no special efforts have been necessary to keep the requirements of the Society supplied and leave a good balance to their successors to carry the work on with.
