

KINGSTON.

So much has been written about the City of Kingston and vicinity, by tourists and historians, that anything more than a brief notice would be irrelevant to the purposes of a book of this character.

It is perfectly apparent that any one seeking a full account of so important a place in the history of Canada, would avail himself of the researches of the historian whose province it is to place before the public his labors in works sufficiently elaborate for that end. Indeed, very few of those into whose hands the present work may fall, will do more than glance at its introduction, being far more interested in the portions of it devoted to the information necessary for the professional and business communities.

Kingston is situated at the head of the St. Lawrence River, and is the capital of the County of Frontenac.

Its history dates back to a very early period, and is intimately connected with the many interesting and important events involved in the early settlement of the country.

The Indian tribes considered this location as one of vast importance to them. One of their largest villages, Cataraquoui, stood on the site of the present stone-built city. The shores of the surrounding bays and the forest shades once resounded with the dreaded war-whoop of the red denizens of the forest, and scenes of sanguinary conflicts were once enacted on sites where now stand beautiful villas and peaceful villages.

The French became fully aware of the importance of this position as early as 1672—built Fort Frontenac (called after Governor Frontenac), on the site of the present "Tete-du-Pont" Barracks, and which name the fort, lake and settlement retained for many years.

The connection between Canada and Louisiana (then a French colony), by means of a chain of trading posts, depended upon the possession of this fort. At the time of the conquest of Canada, Fort Frontenac was the general rendezvous and centre of trade for the Northern and Western Indian Nations, as well with the French as with themselves.

It seems, at that period, to have been a spot selected by nearly all the tribes, as a sort of Seat of Government for the settlement of ancient feuds and the adjustment of future alliances, in which these children of the forest, perhaps, showed more discrimination than many of their more civilized successors.

The city is built on an extensive limestone rock, and next to Quebec and Halifax, is considered the strongest military position in British America. Limestone forms the principal building material. The streets are laid out rather irregularly.

Opposite the city stretches Wolfe or Long Island, a fertile strip of land well settled and cultivated, and the products of whose farmers find a ready market in Kingston, having excellent steam ferry accommodation four or five times, each way, daily.

Garden Island, Cedar Island, together with Simcoe and Amherst Islands, form a breakwater against the autumn gales, and vessels of the largest class can find safe shelter in the bay and harbour.

The retired streets and suburbs, the visitor will find, are well built up with many fine residences of considerable architectural pretensions, and the Banks, City Buildings, Colleges and other public structures, are well worthy the attention of the traveller.

Excellent Macadamized roads lead to all the villages in the adjacent country, in every direction, and in fact few cities, if any, on the continent have cleaner or better streets than Kingston.

An important addition to the city is its fine park, embracing an area of about seventy acres, neatly fenced, laid out in walks, drives and lawns, and planted with ornamental and shade trees. Here is situated the observatory of Queen's University, and overlooking the whole is the substantial edifice, the Court House. The front elevation of this handsome structure is in the Grecian Ionic style, with six pillars and surmounted

with a dome; the total length is two hundred and eight feet, with a width of fifty-four feet. It was erected by the county at a cost of one hundred thousand dollars,

The city building consists of a handsome cut stone edifice, the front elevation in chaste Palladian style. The centre is ornamented with a dome which overlooks the city and bay, and from which a fine view is obtained. This building contains the City Hall, Council Chamber, City Offices, &c. The Bank of British North America occupies a portion of it. It was erected in 1843, when Kingston was the Seat of Government, at a cost of one hundred and twenty thousand dollars, and is the finest building of its kind in Canada. In rear of the building is the Market Square and Shambles.

Space will only permit an allusion to Fort Henry and the many other important fortifications of the place. Its many beautiful churches, public schools, colleges, asylums and houses of charity, all of which deserve to be fully noticed in detail, and which would amply repay a visit from the stranger or traveler visiting Kingston, who, without doubt, would find and see enough to afford matter of interest for many a future day's retrospection.

For Hotel accommodation, Kingston is well supplied, having several large and well appointed hotels, the Burnett House, British American, City Hotel, American, and Anglo-American, beside many other smaller houses, furnishing ample accommodation for farmers and others, whose business demands their visit to Kingston from the townships throughout the County of Frontenac.

With trading and forwarding facilities, the city is well supplied, having several lines of steamers and other sailing craft calling daily at its wharves, beside the accommodation furnished by the Grand Trunk Railway.

MANUFACTURES.

Iron Foundries and Machine Shops.—In this branch of business there are three establishments, viz., that of the Canadian Engine and Machinery Company, established in 1851, but only carried on by the present Company since 1864. The Company has a capital of two hundred and

fifty thousand dollars, and manufactures steam engines, boilers, oil well machinery, and every description of locomotive engines, railway cars, and other machinery. At this establishment there has lately been turned out one of the fastest iron built steamers now on the lakes, the property of C. F. Gildersleeve, Esq. One hundred and sixty men here find constant employment, and steam to the extent of twenty-five horse power is used.

Eagle Foundry—established in 1846, carried on by Edwin Chown and Henry Cunningham. This firm manufactures stoves, ploughs and agricultural implements of every description; also, all kinds of hollow ware. In this department they employ about twenty-five men, with an engine of eight horse power. In the manufacturing of tin, copper and sheetiron ware, about twenty-five additional hands are kept in constant employment.

Kingston Foundry—established in 1836.—It is now carried on by Davidson & Doran, who employ 70 hands, and an engine of fifteen horse power in the manufacture of steam engines, boilers, grist, saw mill and other machinery. The works are situated on the corner of Ontario and Union Streets.

SHIP BUILDING.

Marine Railway Ship Yard—established in 1839.—This is the only Marine Railway at present in operation in Canada. Foster, Jenkins & Co., are now the proprietors. Fifty men are kept in constant employment in the building and repairing of vessels of every description. The schooner Mary Taylor, 200 tons, was built and furnished at this yard last Spring. Several first-class barks and schooners have been turned out by this firm during the last few years. The first sea-going ship built in Upper Canada, The Cherokee, was built at this ward.

Calvin & Breck, Ship Builders, Garden Island, manufacturers of square timber and staves, employ about four hundred men; have turned out during, 1866, one steamer, John A. Macdonald, 300 tons, a very powerful tug and freight boat; also, a large schooner of about 400 tons. The amount of square timber forwarded to Quebec, during 1866, was 1,500,000 feet of oak, with about 750 M. of standard Staves, and

about the same quantity of W. I. Staves. They have employed, in the Government Tug line, six steamers; for towing rafts and for wrecking purposes on Lake Ontario, four steamers. The square timber and staves are brought from the West at various points to Garden Island, giving employment to about forty vessels; at Garden Island the timber is formed into rafts for the Quebec market.

Edward Berry, Ship Builder—yard at the village of Portsmouth. At this yard about fifteen hands are kept employed.

HARDWARE MANUFACTURING.

This is entirely a new branch of manufacture opened up in Canada, particularly the making of door locks, malleable iron, &c. The Provincial Hardware Manufacturing Company, commenced business this season and is now employing convict labor to the extent of one hundred hands, and are making arrangements to work as many more convicts during the next season. The locks here manufactured are of the American pattern and of about one hundred different patterns. They are, in every respect, equal to the American made lock. Malleable iron is also here manufactured into such articles as wrought iron was formerly used for, especially in machinery, hardware saddlery, &c. Wm. C. Evans, formerly of Montreal, is the contractor with the Government, and conducts the above establishment.

FURNITURE.

The principal establishment in Kingston is that of S. T. Drennan, who is the contractor with the Government for the labor of one hundred convicts. At present only sixty-five of these are employed. A large quantity of the finest decription of cabinet-ware and furniture is here made. The warehouses are on the corner of Bagot and Princess streets. A large warehouse, connected with this manufactory, has been opened in Ottawa.

The other manufactories of any importance in this line are those of Henry Brame, Thomas McDermott, and James Reid. There are several smaller shops, employing from two to six hands each.

Carriage Making.—There are six or seven good factories in this branch of trade, that of Thomas W. McRae, employs from ten to fif-

teen hands. Wm. Draper, four hands; the others from two to four hands each.

Broom Making.—The only firm engaged in this line is B. Baily & Co., Princess Street, who employ five men.

Rope Manufacturing.—Mrs. James Couper employs four hands.

Pump Making.—The Atlantic Ship Pump Factory was established by the present proprietor, John Brokenshire, in 1862. He manufactures pumps of every description, steering wheels, blocks, dead-eyes, capstan bars, &c. Employs six hands.

Boat Building.—M. O'Gorman employs twelve hands, and builds boats, yachts, &c. Manufactures also a large number of oars. Was established in 1847.

Boiler Works.—L. W. Jeffers, St. Lawrence Wharf, foot of Johnson street, commenced this branch of industry in 1865. He is also proprietor of the Harbour Steam Tug. Employs in all about thirty hands.

Breweries.—Kingston has four or five Breweries, giving employment, in the aggregate, to nearly one hundred hands.

Flouring Mills.—The Kingston Mills contain three run of stones. Adjoining the Mills there is an Elevator, with a capacity of six thousand bushels an hour. A seventy-five horse power engine is used to propel the machinery of both the Flouring Mill and Elevator.

Boots and Shoes.—The largest Boot and Shoe manufactory in Kingston is carried on by George Offord & Co., who employ the labor of two hundred and fifty convicts at the Provincial Penitentiary.

Joseph Dillon employs about forty hands, doing a large amount of custom and other work.

Wm. Allen employs fourteen men. There are about twenty other smaller shops, where from two to ten hands are kept employed in each.

Blank or Account Book Manufacturing.—John Creighton and Thos. McAuley are the only parties engaged in this branch of trade.

Coffee and Spice Mills.—George Robertson & Son have an extensive Mill of the above description, on Ontario street, opposite the Burnett House.

There are numerous other branches of manufactures carried on, which

space will not permit us to particularize here; but by reference to the Business Directory, in another part/of this work, will be found classified under appropriate business headings.

Piano-Forte Manufacturing.—The largest establishment of this kind in British America is in Kingston; about four hundred first-class instruments are turned out annually, giving employment to a large number of mechanics. The warehouse and factory are situated on the corner of Princess and Ontario streets, and is owned and carried on by John C. Fox.

Granite Monuments.—John Kilpatrick, manufacturer of Canadian Granite Monuments; employs several hands; was established in 1861.

EDUCATIONAL.

Queen's University and College. - This institution is situated in College street, in the west part of the city, upon a site which commands a fine view of Lake Ontario and the neighboring islands, along with the surrounding country. The College Buildings are handsome and substantial structures, and are surrounded with tastefully laid out grounds which comprise a Botanic Garden containing an accurately named and labelled collection of the most important economical, medicinal, and poisonous plants of Europe and America. The Astronomical Observatory of the Institution is situated in the park, was founded in 1855, and was deeded to the University in 1861, when new buildings were erected. It contains an Equatorial by Mr. Alvan Clarke, with an object glass 61 inches aperture, a small Transit by Troughton & Simms, and an Astronomical Clock constructed by the Assistant Observer; also the Beaufoy Transit lent by the Royal Astronomical Society, England, a Reflecting Telescope, by the celebrated Mr. Short, with a speculum of 71 inches in diameter, and a Refracting Telescope. A standard Barometer and Regstering Thermometer, by Casella, have been recently added.

The Museum of the College consists chiefly of Mineralogical and Palcontological specimens, embracing collections of Canadian Minerals and Fossils contributed by Sir William Logan, and other gentlemen. The library contains 1,082 volumes and is steadily increasing

annually, principally by donations.

Queen's College was incorporated with the style and privileges of a University by a Royal Charter, dated 16th October, 1841. A complete curriculum of study leads to the Degrees in Arts of B.A., and M.A., in Theology, of B.D., in Medicine, of M.D., and these degrees are conferred only on those who have gone through the required curriculum and passed the prescribed examinations. The Senate, however, is empowered to confer, besides the above, the Honorary Degrees of D.D., and L.L.D., for Literary, Scientific or Professional distinction.

The Session in Arts begins on the first Wednesday of October and closes on the last Thursday of April. The Session in Theology begins on the first Wednesday of November, and closes at the same time as the Arts Session. There are eighteen scholarships in Arts and nine in Theology, averaging in value from \$30 to \$80.

The Matriculation and Curriculum of this College are identical with those of all Colleges in Canada, as prescribed by the Medical Council. Students, however, commencing the study of Medicine before the month of May, 1867, are not affected by the regulations of the Medical Council.

One year's instruction under a duly qualified Medical Practitioner, certified to the satisfaction of the Medical Faculty prior to attendance on Lectures, is regarded as equivalent to a year's College attendance, and, in such cases, constitutes an Annus Medicus. A similar privilege is accorded to Graduates in Arts.

College and Grammar School.—The College Preparatory School and the Kingston County Grammar School are now united and affiliated to the University. The school is pleasantly situated on the south side of Clergy street, near Barrie, in the vicinity of the Park, and one of the healthiest in the city; the grounds have been recently planted with shade trees, which adds much to the beauty of its appearance.

Winter Term begins on the 7th of January, the Spring Term on the Wednesday after Easter, the Summer Term on the second Monday in August, and the Autumn Term on the Monday after the 15th of October. Teachers—Samuel Woods, M.A., Classical and French Master; Thomas Gordon, Mathematical Master; F. Rowland, English Maşter; Mr. Light, Drawing Master.

Regiopolis College.—Situated between Brock and Johnson streets, entrance from either street. A fine gymnastic ground and a magnificent garden are connected with the establishment, the latter under the management of Mr. B. O'Donnell. HOSPITALS AND ASYLUMS.

Rockwood Lunatic Asylum.—This institution is located on the

margin of Lake Ontario, 12 miles from the City of Kingston. There are 35 acres of land in a beautiful situation, commanding extensive views of the lake, the river and the adjacent islands. The buildings are being constructed entirely by convict labor, from material quarried on the public lands, and they will in consequence be extremely cheap to the Province. The centre building and the wings extending east and west are completed, and the east wing is occupied by about 150 patients, the west wing, when the internal fittings are completed, by the end of 1866, will accommodate 300 patients; and the entire building, if constructed according to the original plans approved by the Board of Works, will accommodate about 500 inmates. The Architect was Mr. William Coverdale, senior, who died during the year, leaving his plans unfinished. He is succeeded in the conduct of the works by Mr. Wm. Coverdale, junior, and Mr. Powers, as associate architects. The architects are required, by the terms of their engagement, to confer with the Medical Superintendent on all matters relating to the construction of the Asylum, so that the responsibility of having a suitable structure for the treatment of the insane, will rest where it should properly be placed. The building is in the Italian style of architecture, with corridors running the whole length of the wings, and beautiful views from nearly all parts of the building. The arrangements for warming, ventilating and draining the building are very elaborate, and so far as human prudence can make the building healthy, all these have

In addition to the new Asylum there is a building in use on the same grounds for female lunatics. It is a large building in the cottage ornee style of architecture, and accommodates about thirty-five female lunatics. When, on the completion of the new Asylum, these patients are all removed to this structure, the present Female Asylum could be well adapted as an institution for Idiotic children, for whom there is no

provision in the Province.

THE PROVINCIAL PENITENTIARY

Is situated to the west of the City of Kingston, just outside the city limits, and about a mile and a half distant from the City Hall.

To the south, the institution abuts on Lake Ontario at the embouchure of the River St. Lawrence; to the west, on Portsmouth Bay, an inlet of the lake, which affords excellent wharfage accommodation for this great penal institution.

The buildings are principally of cut stone, and the walls of high and solid masonry, enclosing an area of nine acres in extent. The workshops are separated from the dormitories, dining halls, chapels, female prisons, and warden's residence, and form three sides of a large square. They are admirably constructed with large windows, which give ample light and excellent ventilation to the large shops in which the convict workmen are collected. Here the convicts work as blacksmiths, carpenters, stone-cutters, cabinet-makers, tailors and shoemakers. In this latter occupation, alone, there are about three hundred convicts employed, and it is pleasant to see the order, industry and decorum which pervades the whole establishment, and gratifying to know that those who have offended the laws are making restitution to society, and acquiring trades by which they may hereafter obtain honest livelihoods.



GARDEN ISLAND

Is situated in the Bay, opposite Kingston, about two miles distant. The Island contains sixty-five acres, and is owned by Messrs. Calvin & Breck, who established a ship yard here about the year 1834. This eminent firm employ four hundred men. The total population of the island is about 750. It has a large school with an average attendance of 60 pupils. Church services are held every Sabbath evening, in the school house, by ministers of the several denominations. There are also three stores, a music hall, two brass bands, a temperance lodge, and a telegraph office, established by the Provincial Telegraph Company. Mails are received daily from Kingston.

PORTSMOUTH.

An incorporated village in the township of Kingston, and county of Frontenac, two miles from Kingston. The village was incorporated in 1858, and now contains a population of 1500. Portsmouth is situated on a deep bay or arm of Lake Ontario. The Harbour is protected by a breakwater 400 feet in length. The breakwater was erected, in 1840, by Messrs. Dickinson & Gilmour, and was rebuilt in 1860, by the council of the village, at a cost of \$4000. This village is noted for its shipbuilding yards-and many of the finest vessels on the lakes have been turned out here.

The Provincial Penitentiary, and the Rockwood Lunatic Asylum are located here. The village contains three churches, viz.: Church of England, Rev. F. W. Dobbs, Incumbent. The Presbyterians are about erecting a stone church; at present they occupy the Temperance Hall,

which has been fitted up for their accommodation. The Wesleyan Methodist Church built of stone, in 1854. The B. A. O. G. T. have a lodge, organized in 1860, which numbers seventy members; the lodge meets in its own hall every Monday evening. There are three schools, two common, and one Roman Catholic separate school. Mails are re ceived from and dispatched to Kingston twice a day.
