THE AUSTRIA AND THE OCEAN STEAMERS.

Late American papers contain the statements of two or three survivors, who were rescued from the wreck of the Austrian steamship, which, after striking on a sunken rock near the Cape of Good Hope, sank in deep water.

THE TERRIBLE DISASTER TO THE AUSTRIA.

The terrible disaster to the Austria, brings sorrow to many a home, and sends a thrill of horror through the entire community. The death of nearly six hundred human beings by such a dispensation of Providence, will excite our warmest sympathies, and our deepest feelings.

THE AUSTRIA.

These were the Austria, the Sarawak, the Borussia, and the Hamann. This was her second voyage. The Austria was the largest of the fleet; she was 2324 tons register, 311 feet long, 40 wide, depth 25 feet, or 33 feet from spar deck; and her draft of water at the load line, was 19 1/2 feet.

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
