pusiness of this character must neces make large profits, but it is clear that in times of depression their losses must be proportionately large. It would be well if all banks would strive to comply in every particular, not only with the letter, but with the spirit of the banking act.

Twenty-two samples emitted combustible vapors at the ordinary temperature. Mr. J. N. Partridge, fire commissioner of Brooklyn, was reported as having adopted the instrument fixed by the state board of health for testing oils, and as being willing to prosecute offenders in future."
