A device has been patented by John McAdam, of Brooklyn, N. Y., designed to stop vessels while under full way. They are called MacAdam's "stopper" and are made of heavy iron plates attached to the stern of the vessel by hinges.

When the engine was stopped at the moment of tripping, the vessel stopped in 22 seconds, and inside of half a minute the water was stopped and the vessel was under full way.

The shock of the sudden stoppage was almost imperceptible to people on board the steamer, as it is first borne by the water.

The invention is one of the most useful that has been patented for many years, as notwithstanding the many devices that have been applied to ocean sailing vessels, in the way of water light compartments, lights and signals, life boats, of the best model, etc., for the purpose of preventing loss of human life, the loss remained that a great risk, that of collision was always present, and that the dangers from this source were yearly growing greater, owing to the constantly increasing amount of traffic.

When collision is imminent, whether between vessels on the open sea, or in clear weather or in fog, against icebergs, sand rocks, or in narrow channels, the danger is increased.
