Useful Recipes. GRAHAM CRACKS.—1 pint of sweet milk, cold, 1 pint of water, 1 teaspoonful of sugar, 1 teaspoonful of salt, 3 pints of Graham flour. Drop into hot gem-pans and bake quickly.

PARISHES POTATOES.—Peel the potatoes, and with a potato scoop or with many little balls in a potato ricer, grate the potatoes, drain well, fry in smoking-hot fat until brown and drain on paper; sprinkle with salt and serve. They are usually served as a garnish to the meat or fish which they accompany.

Waffles.—Sift one pint of flour three times and add one teaspoonful of salt. Beat the yolks of two eggs until very light, add to them one cup of rich milk; add this to the flour and beat until light and smooth.
